Yellow Warning Card – Refer to rule 1.5.1 to be aware of what situations and yellow warning card can be issued and who can issue a yellow warning card – all FEI Stewards and EA Stewards are eligible.

Head Gear - Can't stress enough about ensuring that riders know what head gear they can use and can't.

ALL riders are required wear an <u>approved safety helmet</u> (with the retaining harness secured and fastened) as per rule 2.2. However, riders competing in PSG and above and who are 22 years of age and over may opt to wear a top hat in the warm-up and coopetition area.
