DETAILS OF COMPETITIONS

Entries, and the competition program, may be limited and revised at the discretion of the OC. For this event, riders must choose to ride in either Open competitions **or** AAOR competitions. Riders may not ride in a combination of Open/AAOR competitions. Para riders may enter Para competitions **or** Open **or** AAOR competitions.

COMPETITIONS 1 to 10 (AAOR and Open Preliminary to Advanced)

Limit on entry numbers: 35 Horses per competition; a reserve list will be created if entries exceed 35. Champions to be decided on point system of both competitions at each level. (Rule 8.9)

COMPETITIONS 11 to 19 (AAOR and Open Prix St Georges, AAOR and Open Intermediate I,

Intermediate A, Intermediate B, Intermediate II, Grand Prix and Grand Prix Special)

Limit on entry numbers: 35 Horses per class – a reserve list will be created if entries exceed 35.

Champions to be decided on point system of both competitions at each level. (Rule 8.9)

COMPETITION 19: Grand Prix Special

The Grand Prix Special is limited to the best 12 combinations that gain at least 58% in the Grand Prix. **COMPETITION 20: Advanced Freestyle competition**

Open to horse/riders who have qualified/been accepted for the Advanced championship.

COMPETITION 21: Intermediate Freestyle to Music

Open to horse/riders who have qualified/been accepted for the AAOR or Open Intermediate I.

COMPETITION 22: Medium Tour Freestyle to Music

Open to horse/riders who have qualified/been accepted for the Intermediate A and B Championship. **COMPETITION 23: Grand Prix Freestyle to Music**

Open to Grand Prix combinations who earn a minimum score of 58% in the Grand Prix.

• Scores (percentages) of team members will be added together to determine team scores. The winning team will be the team with the highest total score; the second one, the next highest, etc.

- One combination at each level is required to make up a team of three riders.
- A horse and/or rider may only be represented once in each team. A rider may only compete in one team per competition.

• Refer to **EA Dressage Rule 8.6.1** for details on the requirements for team competitions.

Teams Competition entry fee: Nil

Special Awards:

 Dressage Queensland Regional Rider Award: This award is donated by Dressage Queensland and is designed to encourage riders travelling from regional areas of Queensland. Riders are classed as regional when they reside more than 400kms from the Brisbane CBD.

The Regional Rider prize will be awarded to the highest placed regional rider based on their best two placings in any competition from Preliminary to Grand Prix, including the GP Special. Freestyles are not eligible. Riders are to nominate on the entry form if they wish to enter for this award. No entry fee is required. For a rider on multiple horses, each horse will be a separate entry. In the case of equality, the horse with the highest aggregate percentage is the winner.

• Young Rider Awards: Rosettes will be awarded to the highest placed Young Rider in each class.





CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The Saddlefitter Qld State Dressage Championships 2018 will be conducted in strict accordance with the current edition (including amendments) of:

- EA Dressage Rules and Official Procedures for Dressage Competition as at 1/1/18 (and subsequent amendments), EA General Regulations;
- Current FEI Statutes, General Regulations; FEI Veterinary Regulations; FEI Dressage Rules.
- The EA Dressage Rules and Dressage tests may be downloaded here.

Competitors are advised to be aware of the rules that apply specifically to **State Championships (Rule 8.11)**. The onus is on riders to know the rules under which they compete.

MEMBERSHIP and REGISTRATION

- Horses must have a current performance card; horses, owners and riders must be **registered** and financial with EA.
- Horses must compete under their full registered name. The OC has the right to abbreviate the names of horses for printing purposes. EA Membership numbers must be shown on the Entry Form.
- All horses are required to be microchipped as per national rules.

ENTRIES and ELIGIBILITY

- Only two horses per rider may be entered per Championship.
- Ponies are eligible to enter, however there will not be separate awards for rider on. Where 'horses' are referred to in this schedule that also includes reference to ponies.
- <u>All horses must</u> be EA registered.
- No horses may be substituted after the close of entries.
- Horses must exceed 149 cm with shoes or 148cm without shoes.
- Ponies must not exceed 149cm with shoes or 148cm without shoes.
- No horse may take part with more than one rider at the event.
- Horses Riders are eligible from the start of the calendar year in which they turn 12 years of age.
- Ponies Riders are eligible from the start of the calendar year in which they turn 10 years of age.
- Horses may compete in two (2) consecutive levels only. For example, Nov/Elem; Adv/PSG etc. Each horse entered must have the same rider as nominated on the entry form for all competitions.
- Para Equestrian riders may compete in the Para Equestrian tests OR Open Tests OR AAOR tests, as long as the horse competes in no more than three tests per day. Any Para Equestrian rider electing to compete in the EA Open or AAOR tests will be subject to the same qualification criteria as all other competitors. There will be no separate placings/prizes for Para Equestrian combinations that may place in Open or AAOR tests. All Para Equestrian riders' FEI PE Master List (copy) must be provided at time of entry as well as a copy brought to the event at the time of competition. Para Equestrian riders wishing to enter the PE/FEI tests must have qualified by achieving 58% or higher in a PE/FEI test on the horse entered.
- Championship riders must enter the Championship e.g. both competitions at one level, not individual competitions (except for FEI competitions).
- Competitions 1 to 10 are open to horses that, at close of entries, have gained fewer than the following grading points:
 Preliminary/Novice: fewer than 30 points at Elementary level or above; Elementary: fewer than 30 points at Medium level or above; Medium: fewer than 30 points at Advanced level or above; Advanced: fewer than 30 points in FEI competitions. Horses entered in all FEI competitions must

have performance at the level entered as outlined in the Dressage Rules (Rule 1.15.5).

- **Two performances** at the entered level should ideally be submitted (for balloting purposes, if needed); however, only one score is actually required for entry. The second score may be an Hors Concours (HC) result. (**Rule 8.2**).
- Official Grading: This will be taken as at the closing date of entries. (Rule 1.15.5).
- Draw: Competitions will be limited to 35. A reserve list will be issued.
- The organising committee reserves the right to rank/ballot horses.





• A revised draw may be necessary the day before each competition to allow for withdrawals/scratchings. The starting times for each rider will remain constant as far as possible with any reserve riders being placed in the times of the withdrawn horse. In the event of significant change, the OC reserves the right to alter starting times. The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the day before the competition.

PERFORMANCE

- <u>At least one qualifying score MUST have been obtained by the nominated horse/rider</u> <u>combination</u> (Rule 8.2).
- Performance Eligibility: All entries for EA and EA FEI and PE FEI Level tests must be qualified by having gained at least the following performance in Official Competitive competitions and will only be accepted for REGISTERED horses that have been allocated a current EA number and bridle number at the time qualifying scores were obtained and at the level they are entering during the period 15th July 2017 to 14th July 2018, preceding the closing date:
 - Preliminary and Novice: at least one performance of 64% or higher;
 - Elementary, Medium and Advanced: at least one performance of 62% or higher;
 - PSG and Inter I: at least one performance of 60% or higher;
 - Inter A and B: at least one performance of 60% or higher;
 - Inter II and GP: at least one performance of 58% or higher; and
 - Para FEI tests: at least one performance of 58% or higher
- All combinations must submit their best two performances in an Official Competitive competition at the appropriate level, in the 12-month period preceding the closing date for entries, from 11th July 2017 to 14^h July 2018. See above re: minimum performance requirement. *Participation, Eventing, PCAQ, Interschool, Restricted/Club, Freestyle, Young Horse results are not eligible.*
- Ranking (balloting) will be conducted for classes where there are more than 35 entries, and will be based on the average of the highest percentages of two tests at the particular level, in the 12 months preceding the close of entries. Riders who submit two performances will be considered ahead of those who submit one performance.
- The OC reserves the right to accept and/or reject entries.
- The OC reserves the right to allow wildcard entries.

WITHDRAWALS and REFUNDS

- Entry refunds 50% of entry fees (minus the administration fee) will be refunded on receipt of a doctor's or vet's official certificate submitted to: Event Director, <u>cbz1967@gmail.com</u>, within 7 days of the completion of the event.
- A separate refund must be submitted to QSEC for stable fees see Nominate for QSEC's Terms and Conditions.
- **Cancellation** If the event and/or competition/s are cancelled, 50% of entry fees will be refunded (minus the administration fee).
- **Change of Nomination** Riders wishing to change their nomination (after the close of entries) incur an administration fee of \$50.
- Withdrawals (Rule 8.4): No competitor shall withdraw from a competition within 8 hours of the start of the competition without the permission of the Organising Committee. A written statement giving reasons for the withdrawal must be handed to the Event Director prior to the commencement of the competition. Penalty for non-compliance forfeiture of the entry fees.
- Scratchings -. Because of the reserve lists and possible distances to be travelled by reserve list riders, all riders are asked to consider their fellow competitors and notify the Event Director as soon as possible of their intention to withdraw. If a rider does not wish to remain on the reserve list, they must scratch from the event or entry fees will not be refunded if a place in the competition is offered but not taken up.





OBJECTIONS and APPEALS

Objections and Appeals: Objections must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$150.00 (Rule 1.5).

SADDLERY and EQUIPMENT

- Bridle numbers (two) must be worn at all times when the horse is outside its stable.
- Whips are not permitted at FEI level in a State Championships. EA levels (Preliminary to Advanced) whips are permitted but must not exceed 1.2m in its entirety for horses, and 1.0m for ponies (Rule 2.6).
- Hats and head wear: As per current EA rules (Rule 2.2).
- **Sponsorship logos** Riders with privately organised sponsorship may display a logo or logos of their sponsor/s on their saddlecloth. The total area covered by logo/s may not exceed 200 sq. cm. Logo/s may also be shown on the jacket as long as the total area does not exceed 80 sq. cm and must be above the line of the pocket. (Rule 2.19).

FREESTYLES

- AAOR riders may compete in the Freestyle competitions but will not be eligible for Tournament Championships.
- Only the movements up to and included in the current tests at the level being ridden may be shown (Rule 6.7).
- Music must be supplied on a good quality **not-scratched CD or USB** with any relevant instructions attached in writing. Please clearly mark horse and rider name on CD/USB. We recommend that you have a backup master CD/USB with you.
- **Freestyle music** must be handed in to the Event Office as soon as possible after your arrival and well before music testing. There will be a timetable for Freestyle music testing
- **Equality of scores**: if two competitors receive the same final score, the one with the highest marks for artistic presentation is the winner.
- **Bond** A bond of \$100 for competitors who nominate to ride in the freestyles is payable at time of nomination. This bond is fully refundable upon completion of your freestyle ride and after the conclusion of the event; or on the receipt of the veterinarian/doctor's certificate, if scratching.
- Declaration of Starters All riders entering any freestyle competition must declare their intention to ride, or not to ride, by 10am Saturday 26th August 2018 at the Event Office. Failure to declare will result in a non-start in the competition and forfeiture of your freestyle bond.
- The timed draw for the Freestyles will be published following the declarations at 10am Saturday. All times for Freestyles will be published ahead of time, and all freestyle entries will be drawn in other tests to ensure they will not have conflicting ride times for freestyle tests.

CAMPING and CATERING

- **Camping facilities**: Powered and Unpowered sites are available and must be booked at time of entry through the QSEC booking system. There are good shower and toilet facilities with hot and cold water for males and females.

- **Catering:** details to be advised. QSEC's catering is under new management.





STABLING

- **Cheryl Stephen** is the Stable Manager during the event and will be staying on site from Thursday in the caravan on Site 28 (next to amenities block).
- For any stable or camping enquiries please phone or email stable manager Cheryl Stephen on 3882 0044 up to Wed night 23rd August or 0400 767 858 anytime. Email: cherylandtony1@bigpond.com
- Owners/riders who have booked stables for more than one day but are taking their horses home at night must advise the Stable Manager.
- Stable bookings must be made via the QSEC booking system which is a separate entry in **Nominate**. When choosing your stable, it is essential to ensure that a mare is not placed within two stables next to, or behind, a stallion in all directions.
- **Yards** there will be limited yards available at Barr Oval. These must be booked through the Event Director at the time of nomination and cost \$15 per day. **No temporary yards** of any kind are allowed.
- All horses MUST be stabled, except for those combinations competing and parking for the day at Barr Oval.
- **Some bedding** (shavings) is provided and extra may be purchased from the feed supplier, if required.
- All stables **must be completely cleaned out** on departure. A stable cleaning service will be available for a fee of \$25 and must be organised and paid for prior to departure. Contact the Stable Manager to organise stable cleaning.
- There are only a limited number of QSEC wheelbarrows and stable rakes provided, so it is advisable to bring your own stable cleaning equipment
- All competitors must complete a "Horse Health Declaration Form" before unloading horses at QSEC a copy of this form can be found here <u>http://www.qsec.com.au/Biosecurity/</u>
- A stable bond will be charged at the time of entry which will be fully refunded provided the stable is left clean, tidy, and undamaged. All stables/yards must be inspected prior to departure by the Stable Manager for a "clean pass" and bond refund.
- Please note: Charges for stable hire at QSEC apply to the use of stables per day, not per night, e.g. from midnight to midnight. If you arrive before midnight and leave at 6am the following day, this is classed as 2 days. Please take this into account when booking stables.
- Fodder: Competitors must supply their own horse feed
- Arrival of Horses: The Stable Manager will be on site from 6am Thursday 23rd August 2018 until Sunday 26th August 2018. Please try and plan your arrival between 8am and 6pm. Exception for day parkers competing at Barr Oval and those who have an early draw.
- SMOKING is not permitted in the stable area!
- QSEC is a glass-free environment!
- **Dogs**, **prams**, **bicycles**, **scooters** and **golf buggies**, **etc.**, are **not** permitted in the immediate stable area/aisles! (Exceptions vehicles used by the Stable Manager, Stewards and venue staff, and mobility devices for PE riders).
- Children must be supervised at all times!
- As defined in the QSEC Terms and Conditions of Hire, damage will be charged to the Event Organiser, which will in turn be charged to the competitor responsible for the stable/yard during the event. Any damage to stables/yards will be charged to the competitor's credit card. The OC suggests you take photos or record details of your stable prior to use.





OTHER/GENERAL INFORMATION

- Callers/commanders Tests may NOT be commanded. PE riders may have callers/commanders (Rule 9.9).
- **Random Swabbing** will take place at the event. Attention is drawn to FEI Veterinary Rules and the EA Medication Control Policy. Supervision of horses is the sole responsibility of the owner/rider at all times.
- Tests not collected can be posted at a cost of \$2. Envelopes will be available at the location of test collection.
- Veterinary Services Veterinary services will be available from Chris Wain Equine Veterinary Services. 0415 057 145
- Farrier Emergency Farrier services will be available by contacting Tom Affleck 0427 934 420
- Lunging is only permitted in the designated areas this will be monitored
- **Dogs:** Dogs are permitted in QSEC camping grounds provided they are kept on a lead (maximum length of 1 metre) and under control at all times. Dogs <u>must</u> be kept away from horse activities including the Main Arena/Indoor warm-up, Barr Oval arenas/warmup and shower/toilet/laundry facilities. Any person not adhering to this guideline will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and no refund given. Please ensure that dog droppings are disposed of. Do not bring dangerous dogs to this event. Moreton Bay Regional Council Animal Control conducts random patrols. Dogs found wandering and/or not under effective control may be seized and impounded.
- Exercise and Warm-up Area: Outdoor warm-up areas will be available for use prior to the competition. More information will be contained in the entry confirmation sent to riders. Only horses saddled and being ridden are allowed in the warm up area. Horses may only be lunged in the round yards at the outdoor arenas or stable complex. Horses in halters and/or wearing rugs or being grazed are not permitted in the warm up areas during the period of competition each day.
- Arena Familiarisation: Will be available for all arenas and details will be notified at the time of the draw.
- Vaccinations: We strongly encourage owners to vaccinate against the Hendra Virus. We recommend that horse vaccinations for Strangles and Tetanus are up to date.
- Queensland Tick Requirements: Please contact QLD DPI Call Centre: Ph. (07) 3404 6999 for information (allow 24 hrs notice). A mobile tick inspector may be available for booking to inspect and spray your horse at the QSEC venue. <u>This is at the owner's cost and must be booked in advance</u>. Contact the Stable Manager for details.
- **Property Identification Code:** It is compulsory to provide a PIC with your entry.
- **QSEC Policy**: Please note QSEC has a no glass policy. Only alcohol purchased at the venue can be consumed at the Indoor complex.
- **Riders' Welcome Dinner and Forum:** A Riders' Forum will be held on Friday 25th August 2018 in the evening before the Welcome Dinner. Details will be confirmed. All riders are encouraged to attend.
- Indemnity: Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted, undertake to indemnify the Committee against all claims, losses, suits, and damages made against or suffered by the Committee by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any riders, trainers or attendants whilst they are attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse, and agree that any act or omission on the part of such riders or attendants found in any action against the Committee to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity. Riders are required to sign the Declaration form included in the entry section. Neither Dressage Qld, Equestrian Qld, Equestrian Australia, Qld State Equestrian Centre, Moreton Bay Regional Council nor the Organising Committee or their appointed officials accept any liability for any accident, theft or illness to horses, riders, grooms or any person or property whatsoever.

PRIZE SCHEDULE, PRESENTATIONS, CHAMPIONSHIP and TROPHY DETAILS

Championship Awards

- To be eligible for a Champion or Reserve Champion award at any level the horse must compete in both competitions at that level and attain at least 60% up to and including Advanced, or 58% in FEI level competitions in <u>both</u> qualifying tests.

- Prize money for 3rd to 6th place in each class and/or championship will only be awarded if there are at least 5 competing entrants on the day of competition at the relevant level. Goods in kind may be presented in lieu of prize money in any class and/or championship.
