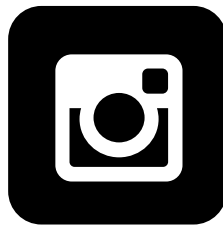

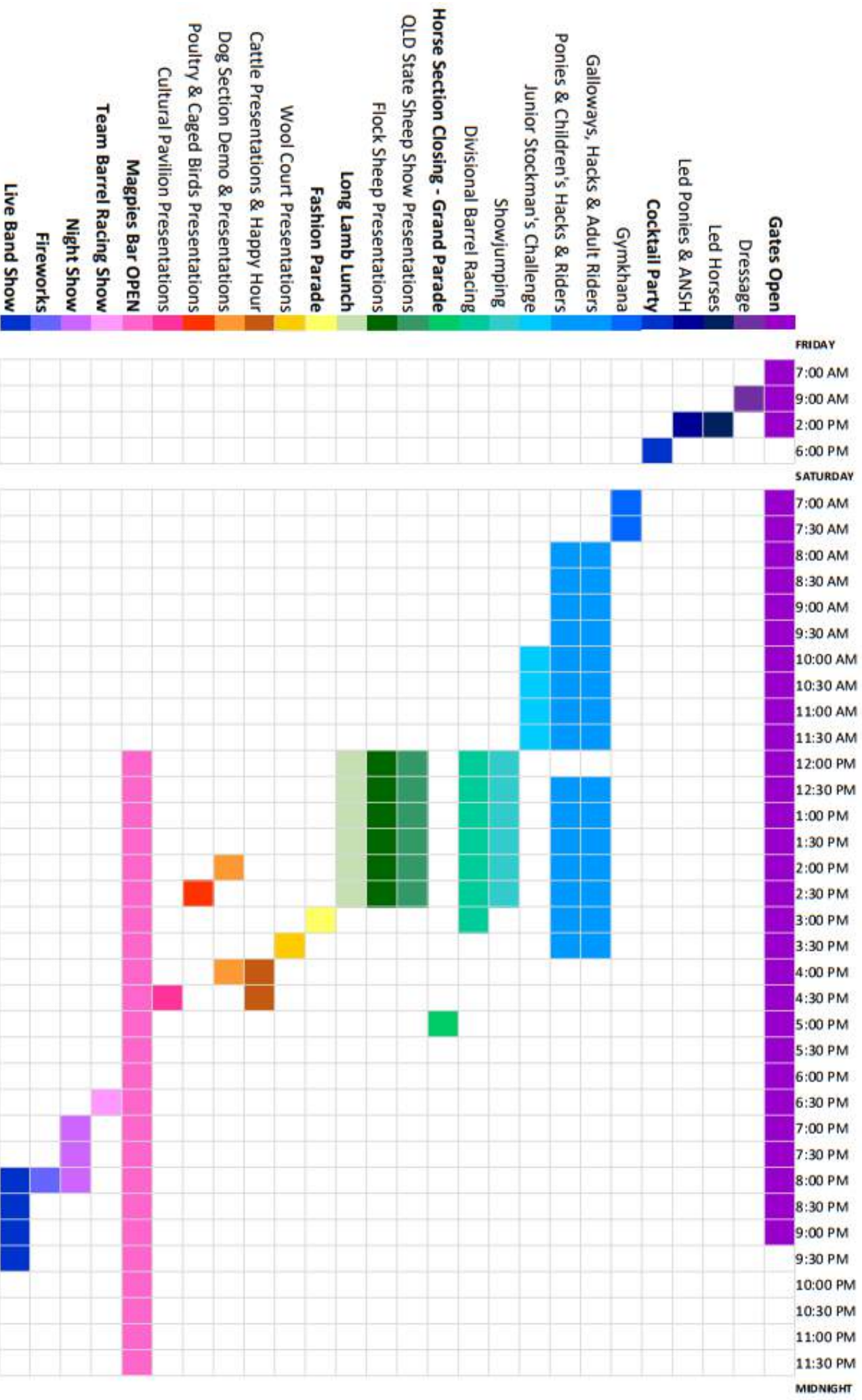

HOW TO ENTER

Guide for Competitors

STEP 1

DECIDE WHAT EVENTS TO ENTER

Competitions are open to a wide range of age groups and interests, with an event to suit almost anyone. In most cases, you can enter in multiple classes and across different sections, no matter what your interests.

STEP 2

CHECK THE RULES AND ENTRY TIMES

There are closing times and dates for all events, so please check these details before the show, so you don't miss out. Running late? Contact the Head Steward for that section to discuss your options. Also, please check the rules for each event to find the competition that suits you best. Need clarification? Contact the Head Steward as early as possible.

STEP 3

NOMINATE/SUBMIT YOUR ENTRY

Now that you have decided what events to enter, it's time to nominate or submit your entry. Please try to be on time for all sections, and to be polite to all stewards. They are volunteers after all! Late nominations or entries may not be accepted. Always remember to put your name, contact details and section on all submissions.

STEP 4

IT'S SHOWTIME!

This is the moment you have been waiting for! Enjoy the spirit of the show and do your best. Don't forget to check presentation times (even if you haven't won your event) so that you can be there to support all the entrants and stewards who have worked hard to bring each event to life. And remember, it's all about having a go!

REGULATIONS

ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of the Barcoo Pastoral Society in addition to any Special Regulations which appear within this schedule.

AUTHORITY OF COMMITTEE. The Committee reserves the final and absolute right to interpret the rules and following regulations and to arbitrarily settle questions and differences thereto, or otherwise arising out of, or connected with, or incidental to the exhibits and/or sales.

LIABILITY OF SOCIETY. All entries are accepted only on condition that neither the Barcoo Pastoral Society nor its officers shall be held responsible for accident or injury to contestants or any loss or damage that shall arise to livestock or other exhibits. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss or damage done to another, occasioned by, or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him and will indemnify the Barcoo Pastoral Society against all legal or other proceedings thereto. All exhibits, grounds and buildings shall be under the control of the Committee.

AUTHORITY OF STEWARDS. Grooms or others in charge of exhibits must obey the orders of the Stewards or their exhibits will be excluded from competition. Chief Stewards reserve the right to change the program.

RIGHT OF APPEAL. The decisions of the Stewards are subject to appeal if the aggrieved exhibitor shall, within one hour after the giving of the decision by the said Stewards, lodge a complaint to the Secretary to be adjudged by the Disputes Committee whose decision shall be final. The Disputes Committee will comprise the President, Secretary, Vice-President and Head Steward.

QUALITY OF EXHIBITS. Exhibitors shall in their own interests and in the interest of the Show, see that their attendants are neatly and appropriately dressed when they lead their animals into the judging ring.

THE COMMITTEE reserves the right to disqualify as ineligible for competition and order the removal of any entry which is not in the best interest of the Show or endangers the public or which has been entered in violation of the RULES and REGULATIONS.

LIVESTOCK HEALTH. No animal shall be admitted or remain on the grounds that shows any evidence of any communicable disease, or any unsightly disease condition. The Committee reserves the right to require health inspections and diagnostic tests to be made before or after animals are on the grounds or to inaugurate any disease control measures that may in their opinion become necessary. The further right is reserved by the Committee to order and cause preemptory removal from the grounds of any animal which does not in every respect meet the health requirements of the Animal Health Act or of any other relevant Act.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS. All entries must be made in writing and received by the Secretary not later than the closing date in the respective sections. Entry fees must in all cases accompany the entry forms.

ENTRY FORMS for registered livestock except Sheep as submitted shall contain the date of birth, name and registration number of entry, name and registration number of sire and dam (except in breeds where registration papers do not include this information), sex, breed, colour and a description of the permanent marking such as ear tag, notching, tattoo, and/or firebrand. Entries must specify the Section and Class of the exhibit and give full description of same and exhibitors, if called upon must be prepared to sign a Statutory Declaration that such particulars are correct.

SINGLE CLASSES. A separate entry must be made for each animal in each individual class in which that animal is expected to be shown excepting Championships.

GROUP OR PEN CLASSES. Only one entry shall be made for all the animals comprising a group or pen entry.

SIRES PROGENY GROUP. Entries must name the sire of the entry.

REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES of all registered livestock, excepting Sheep entered for exhibition must be available for inspection by the Stewards. For animals under 12 months of age on the opening day of the Show, a statement by the secretary of the National Breed Association that the animal is eligible to be registered will be accepted in lieu of a registration certificate provided the statement identifies the animal by sire, dam, birth date and ear tag, notching, tattoo and/or firebrand.

UNREGISTERED STOCK. In cases where unregistered stock are exhibited, the teeth standard is to be taken as a means of ascertaining age.

No animal entered in the breeding classes and shown as such shall be entered in, or allowed to show in FAT or MARKET Classes. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor. Exhibits jointly owned must be exhibited in the name of the joint owners.

ERRONEOUS ENTRY. Exhibits erroneously entered may at the discretion of the Stewards be transferred to proper classes previous to judging. If such classes have been judged, erroneously entered exhibits will not be judged.

ARRIVAL OF EXHIBITS. All exhibits unless otherwise specified must be in place by 9 am on the first day of the exhibition.

RELEASE OF EXHIBITS. Exhibits once staged for exhibition (excluding Horse Section) will not be allowed to be removed from pen or place until 4 pm on the last day of the Show. They will then be delivered by the Stewards.

PREPARATION FOR JUDGING. Each exhibit or competitor in a single class whilst parading before the judge shall carry conspicuously as directed by the Chief Steward, a number corresponding to the number assigned to it in the Catalogue and each exhibit in a group class whilst parading before the judge shall carry a number assigned to it as an exhibit in a single class in addition to any other number assigned to it as a member of a group.

CHAMPIONSHIPS. In awarding Championships, the Judges shall select the next animal in order of merit to be called the "RESERVE CHAMPION" which may, if the Judge consents, take the place of the Champion in the event of the latter being disqualified. In awarding the Championships the first prize winner in each class of the relative sub-section shall be eligible to compete. In awarding the Reserve Champion, the first prize winner in each class of the relative sub-section other than the exhibit to which the Championship has been awarded shall be eligible to compete together with the second prize winner from which the Champion is drawn. Excluding Sheep.

NO CHAMPIONSHIP IF NO COMPETITION. Where there is no competition there shall be no Championship awards. Competition is defined to mean the showing of first place animals from different classes regardless of ownership. This regulation does not apply to Sheep, Horses or Cattle.

AUTHORITY OF JUDGES. Judges will have power to withhold prizes and Championship honours at their discretion. The decision of the Judges is final.

INTERFERENCE WITH JUDGES. No person shall be allowed under any circumstances, to interfere with the judge or judges during his or their adjudications, or to offer any criticism of an exhibit or another exhibitor, and any person who shall attempt to interfere with the judge or judges in any such manner, whether verbally or otherwise shall be excluded from the judging ring and from competition. An exhibitor may however explain the merits of his own display, exhibit or animals during the examination of same by the judge or judges if so requested by them but not otherwise.

TIME OF JUDGING. All exhibits must be ready for competition at the time specified in the judging schedule. Times stated are approximate. Each exhibitor shall show his exhibit or animal in accordance with the time schedule for judging printed in the schedule and catalogue, and may be disqualified for failure to make proper arrangements in this respect.

SELECTION OF JUDGES. No person shall act as Judge except for sections in which he himself is not an exhibitor.

PARADES. All prize winners must parade and wear prize ribbons at such time as requested by the Committee unless exempted by the Stewards.

PRIZE RIBBONS. Placings shall be designated by prize ribbons in the following order, irrespective of the number of exhibits:

FIRST.....BLUE SECOND.....RED THIRD.....WHITE

PRIZE MONEY shall be paid subject to the following criteria: 3 horses or less - 1 place, 4 horses - 2 places, 5 or more - 3 places

HOW TO NOMINATE IN YOUR EVENTS

Most nominations can be submitted on the day of competition, at the nominations tent on the showgrounds. However some on-the-day entries, particularly in the Dressage Classes and Stockman's Challenges, will only be accepted at the discretion of the Head Stewards.

Be safe, and nominate early in these sections!

How? Submit your entry to the Head Steward for the event you are wanting to enter in the weeks leading up to to show, via phone or txt. See Contacts Page.

FORMS TO ENTER : CAMPING/STALLS

A health declaration form is to be filled for all horses entering the showgrounds. Any animals deemed unfit by the Head Steward must be removed immediately.

An indemnity form must be submitted by all riders, as well as those assisting in any events, prior to the start of events.

The Blackall Show is a family friendly event, that caters for travelling competitors wanting hot showers, powered sites and stables. While there is (almost) unlimited space for camping, there are limited stalls available. Stalls can be booked by contacting the Head Steward or Secretary - get in early!

Measurers must be contacted if you are arriving late. Ponies, Galloways & Hacks must be measured, or current E.F.A. Height Certificates viewed.

Main Arena. Five class event, for all ages. Horse and rider are perform from memory a series of predetermined movements.

SECTION 2 - LED HORSES

FRIDAY 2:00PM START - RING 1

Twelve class event, for led horses (therefore excluding ponies) judged in breed classes.

SECTION 3 - LED PONIES & ANSA

FRIDAY 2:00PM START - RING 2

Fourteen class event, for led ponies and child handlers, judges in height and/or sex classes.

SECTION 4 - GALLOWAYS, HACKS & ADULT RIDERS

SATURDAY 8:00AM START - RING 1

Fourteen class event (with more classes added if time permits) for hack riders, judged in riding class. A rider in a higher-ability class cannot compete in more novice classes.

SECTION 5 - PONY, CHILDREN'S HACKS & CHILD RIDERS

SATURDAY 8:00AM START - RING 2

Sixteen class event, incorporating all pony hacks and child riders.

SECTION 6 - JUNIOR STOCKMAN'S CHALLENGE

SATURDAY 10:00AM START - RING 3

An under 18yrs event, the challenge involves both "wet" (with livestock) and "dry" work.

SECTION 7 - GYMKHANA

SATURDAY 6:45AM START - CAMPDRAFT ARENA

A classic horse event, the gymkhana involves four fast skill races for each age group.

SECTION 8 - SHOWJUMPING

SATURDAY 12:00 NOON START - RING 3

SECTION 9 - DIVISIONAL BARREL RACING

SATURDAY 12:00 NOON START - CAMPDRAFT ARENA

A fast-paced event where riders complete a "clover" shape around 3 barrels to win.

HOW TO

NOMINATE IN YOUR EVENTS

All nominations must be submitted to the Head Stewards no later than the Thursday prior to the Show Day. Please remember to note your contact details, the date of most recent shearing, and age/sex of livestock for entries. By providing our committee with these details we can ensure an efficient and fair competition on the day of the Show.

WOOL COURT

All wool entries must be brought to the wool court building by 8:00 AM on Friday. The Head Steward can assist with earlier drop-offs, however this should be arranged prior. Wool entries must be skirted to Industry Standard; as well as clearly labelled, and stored so as to prevent contamination.

LIVESTOCK PENS

All livestock must enter the showgrounds for penning prior to 8:00 AM on Show Day. A loading ramp and pens will be provided for competition stock only, located at the Sheep Section pavilions. Water access is available, however entrants are advised to bring water and feed buckets, if required.

JUDGING & PRESENTATIONS

Wool Judging - Friday 8:00AM // Presentations - Saturday 3:30PM

Livestock Judging - Saturday 10:00AM // Presentations - Saturday 1:00PM

Entrants and spectators are welcome to observe judging at the Sheep Section pavilions throughout Show Day, with all encouraged to attend presentations.

MORE INFORMATION FOR ENTRANTS...

Livestock and wool entries must not be removed from the showgrounds before all judging and presentations have been completed, as a show of respect for the competition. No sheep or wool are to be sold/auctioned on the day of the Show, unless on behalf of the Show Society. The Society has the right to reject any entries in any class. 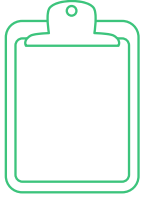

ENTRY FEES

Entry in all wool classes is free of charge, however where fleeces are withdrawn from the Wool Court after competition and entry fee of \$10/fleece will apply.

REGULATIONS & JUDGING

Fleeces are to be individually bagged and labelled on arrival to the Wool Court. All fleeces must be skirted in accordance with the Industry Code of Practice standards. The Judge may transfer fleeces wrongly classes to their correct classes, in which they will then be judged.

All judging will commence from 8:30 AM Friday (day before the Show) within the Wool Court. Judging will be from a breeding standpoint entirely. The judge will allot points as per the criteria - available to view on request to the Head Steward.

STUD WOOL DIVISION

Competition limited to registered studs only. Entries to be shorn from a stud ewe or ram or any age, with no more than 12 months of growth. Fleeces are to be skirted in accordance with Industry Code of Practice. A stud breeder may make as many entries in a class as they wish, when approved by the Head Steward.

AGGREGATE AWARDS GUIDE

Aggregate champion awards will be determined as follows:

For first, second and third in each class/groups, points shall be allocated as 5, 3 and 1 respectively. The exhibitot gaining the highest number of points shall be awarded. 3. Shearing Inspection Certificates from all interstate exhibitors must identify the exhibitors and be presented to the Chief Steward prior to classification.
4. All sheep must be in their pens 30 minutes prior to judging, and remain there unless removed by stewards.
5. No ribbons other than those awarded at the current show and no signs other than the official ones provided may be displayed.
6. Lambs born after July 1st are eligible for Junior classes. To be eligible sheep must have their lambs teeth at inspection time and date of birth must be included on the Inspection Sheet. All 2 tooth sheep at the show are eligible.

8. Feed and water tins are to be supplied by the Exhibitor. If you are unable to supply your own, please advise the Head Steward on how many you will need.

5. ALL Sheep must have current side sample test done by A.W.T.A. no earlier than January 10th 2018. Sydney Tests acceptable.
6. Interstate Studs need to present a National Health Certificate on arrival.

2. Have a concavity in the bone of the skull on the horn site.
3. Have no sign of any bone or horn growth set in the concavity.

On arrival to the showgrounds, entrants must notify the Head Steward prior to unloading into pens.
