

O.M. Nunn Medium Level Young Rider of the Year

Olive Nunn was born in NSW in May 1908 and passed away in 1991.

She is the mother of Mary Seefried, Australia's first Olympic Dressage judge.

Olive spent many years coaching riders in jumping, eventing and dressage from the 1960s to the late 1980s.

She had a long association with Vince Corvi and used to conduct clinics at Bundamba where Vince once lived. Riders such as Peter Weston and Paul LeBherz started their careers with Olive.

Olive, together with her daughter, Daphne, started the Brisbane Showjumping Club and was instrumental in conducting the first EFA One day Event in Queensland at Oxley.

After over 30 years of committee and board work with the EFA Qld Branch she became an honorary life member of the EFA. In particular, along with her daughter Mary, she supported one of the first EFA clubs in Queensland, the Brisbane Active Riders Group (BARG as it was known).

She was particularly interested in assisting young riders and this trophy was designed to reward and encourage Young Riders on their achievements. Medium level is where a young rider shows a definitive commitment to dressage when riding at this level; this is why the trophy has been named in her honour.
