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


WHS duties

- The Work Health and Safety Act 2011 places WHS duties on persons conducting a business or undertaking (PCBU).
- A volunteer association is not a PCBU
 - a group of volunteers working together for a community purposes/s where none of the volunteers, either alone or jointly, employs any person to conduct work for the volunteer association.
 - Safe work Australia Volunteer Resource Kit.

Primary duty of care

- Primary duty of care (WHS Act section 19)
 - PCBU has a duty to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the heath and safety of workers, other persons and themselves.



Primary duty of care (cont'd)

- PCBU must, so far as is reasonably practicable:
 - provide and maintain a work environment without risks to health and safety
 - provide and maintain safe plant and structures
 - provide and maintain safe systems of work
 - safe use, handling and storage of plant, structures and substances
 - provide adequate facilities for the welfare at work of workers


Primary duty of care (cont'd)

- provide any information, training, instruction or supervision that is necessary to protect all persons
- the health of workers and conditions at the workplace are monitored for the purposes of preventing injury or illness in workers.



Multiple duty holders

- More than one person can have a duty for the same matter (WHS Act s16)
 - each retains responsibility for the matter
 - each must discharge the duty to the extent that the person has the capacity to influence and control the matter.



Consultation

 PCBU must consult with workers and other duty holders about health and safety matters (WHS Act s46-49).



Managing risks to health and safety

- Duty to manage health and safety (WHS Reg r32-38)
 - identify reasonably foreseeable risks
 - eliminate risks so far as is reasonably practicable
 - if not reasonably practicable, minimize those risks so far as is reasonably practicable.

Managing risks to health and safety

- Hierarchy of control (WHS Reg r36)
 - eliminate the hazard
 - if this is not reasonably practicable, minimise the risk by doing one or more of the following
 - substituting the hazard with something that gives rise to a lower risk
 - isolating the hazard from any person exposed to it
 - implementing engineering (design) controls
 - if a risk remains, minimise the risk by implementing administrative controls
 - if risk remains, minimise the risk by ensuring the provision and use of PPE.
- Maintain and review control measures.

PPE and emergency plans

- Duty to provide PPE to workers (WHS Reg r44)
 - suitable
 - suitable size and fit
 - maintained, repaired or replaced
 - used or worn by the person
 - information, training and instruction.
- Duty to prepare, maintain and implement emergency plans (WHS Reg r43).

Incident notification

- Incident notification (WHS Act s35-39)
 - notify WHSQ of death, serious injury or illness of a person (including zoonoses) and dangerous incident.
