GENERAL INFORMATION



The Brisbane CDN Organising Committee would like to thank you for your entry and wish you the very best of luck at the event. Please read through the following important information regarding the Brisbane CDN. Regular updates will be posted on the CDI web page and on our Facebook page.

COVID-19

In order for this event to go ahead, the event has a strict COVID Safety Plan we must adhere to. The most important aspect is data capture for contact tracing. It is essential that all attendees check in to the venue using the CheckIn QLD App. This includes all grooms, family members and other persons coming into the venue.

QSEC IS A GLASS FREE VENUE

As users of this great venue we need to comply with the venue rules which are the same as other large sporting venues in Qld. If you bring glass onto the venue in your vehicles, then that's where it needs to remain – **DO NOT** place empty bottles in the QSEC rubbish bins – take them home with you. There are large fines for people who do not abide by these rules..

FACILITIES

We request that competitors take the utmost care in looking after the wonderful facilities at QSEC. . Please make yourself familiar with the QSEC Camping & Stable Rules and Regulations:

The indoor arena precinct is a non-BYO alcohol area. Alcoholic beverages cannot be taken into or from this precinct.

DOGS

Dogs are permitted in the camping complex **ONLY**. Dogs **ARE NOT PERMITTED** in or around the indoor arena precinct including grassed areas and car parks, at the outdoor arena complex, inside the stable complex or inside amenities. All dogs at all times must be secured or on a leash that is no longer than 1 metre in length. **Do not bring dangerous dogs to this event.**

BIOSECURITY

Under Queensland biosecurity legislation, a movement record must be created every time a horse moves off a property. The method of recording is flexible (diary, email, mobile device, copy/photo of Horse Health Dec etc) however the following information must be recorded and kept for 2 years: date of movement, description of the animal, the property of origin (including PIC), event address (including PIC if possible), estimated arrival and departure times and dates and name and contact details of person responsible. QSEC's PIC is QGCB1219.

SPRAYING FOR COMPETITORS FROM NSW, VIC OR TICK-FREE AREAS

We have arranged for an accredited stock inspector, to come to the venue on Saturday September 18th to spray horses returning to Tick Free areas. The stock inspector will help you with the paperwork. Provided you cross the border/tick line within 24 hours of being sprayed, you will not have to stop at a Treatment Facility on your way home. We hope that this will make your journey home more stress free. The cost of spraying is being subsidised by the event, but you will be asked to pay **\$40 per horse** directly to the stock inspector (the event will pay \$30). Please have this money in cash at the time of spraying to hand to the stock inspector. **ALL RIDERS WHO WISH TO HAVE THEIR HORSES SPRAYED AT THE VENUE NEED TO CONTACT ANITA BARTON BY SEPTEMBER 3rd.**

PONY MEASURING

For those who indicated they would like their ponies measured at this event, an official EA Accredited Pony Measurer will be onsite Tuesday afternoon 14th September (to be confirmed) at the stables. The cost is **\$40 per pony** which is payable directly to the measurer. **ALL RIDERS WHO WISH TO HAVE THEIR PONIES MEASURED NEED TO CONTACT ANITA BARTON BY SEPTEMBER 3rd.**

Draws will be continually updated as scratchings are received.

A **final revised** draw may be necessary the day before each competition to allow for withdrawals. The starting order will not alter and a move up system will apply. **The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the evening before the competition.** All changes will be posted on the notice board in the Saddlefitter Marquee and will be updated on the Brisbane CDI website. We will endeavour to keep changes to a minimum.

- Refunds will be processed as per the Event Schedule.
- Refunds will be made post-event to the credit card that you used to pay for your entries, in accordance with the event schedule.
- You will need to contact Nominate and the Queensland State Equestrian Centre to organise a refund of your stabling and camping as a result of scratching from the event.

FREESTYLES & GRAND PRIX SPECIAL

Grand Prix CDN Special & Freestyle – all combinations that have entered the Grand Prix CDN Freestyle have been accepted to compete.

FEI-P Freestyle – all combinations that have entered the FEI-Pony Freestyle have been accepted to compete.

FEI-J Freestyle – all combinations that have entered the FEI-Junior Freestyle have been accepted to compete.

FEI-Y Freestyle – all combinations that have entered the FEI-Young Rider Freestyle have been accepted to compete.

FEI Intermediate A/B Level Freestyle – all combinations that have entered the Intermediate A/B Freestyle have been accepted to compete.

Intermediate Freestyle – all combinations that have entered the Intermediate I Freestyle have been accepted to compete.

Advanced Freestyle – all combinations that have entered the Advanced Freestyle have been accepted to compete.

Freestyle Music – **CAN ONLY BE ACCEPTED VIA A DROPBOX LINK THAT WILL BE EMAILED OUT TO ALL COMPETITORS.**

Instructions to upload music will be sent via email. Please have a back-up copy available.

Freestyle practice will take place in the indoor arena. A draw is included with this competitor information pack. It is not compulsory to attend the practice, but this is the only opportunity to have your music tested.

VETERINARY MATTERS

It is compulsory for all Competitors to fill out and sign a QSEC Horse Health Declaration on arrival at the event. The form can be downloaded here:

If you are stabling at the venue, you must hand your completed form to the Stable Manager upon arrival at the venue. If you are competing at the Outdoor Arenas (Barr Oval), or are parking at the Outdoor Arena Complex, you must hand your completed form to Gear Check before you ride.

Riders at all levels must have their horse's **EA papers** available for inspection if requested. **Swabbing** will take place. **Penalty fines** will be imposed for those who do not have their horse papers available at the event.

Competitors are to pay for any veterinary treatment and supplies provided by Treating Vets during the event.

If you need to call a vet to attend to your horse while at the event, the Organising Committee **MUST** be notified.

STALLIONS

All stallion riders, grooms and owners must be aware of and abide by, the EA Stallion Safe Practice Rules and Regulations Policy, effective 1 July, 2018.

ARENA FAMILIARISATION

An arena familiarisation timetable will be posted on the CDI website and riders are permitted to ride in the specified arenas at these set times. Competitors are advised to check the notice board in the Saddlefitter Marquee for updated times at the event.

INDOOR ARENA 2

Due to space constraints, if you are competing in Indoor Arena 2, you will need to enter the arena and start your test from inside the arena once the judge has rung the bell. Due to COVID

Management and the need to reduce many people handling the same item this arena will NOT have a gate opener to let you in and out.

OUTDOOR ARENAS

Riders will be permitted to start their tests from within the arenas for all events held in the outdoor arenas. Riders may enter the arena once the rider before them has exited the arena and are permitted to complete a lap each way in trot or canter prior to the judge ringing the bell. Once the judge has rung the bell the rider will have 45 seconds to commence their test.

CALLERS

Riders are reminded that as this is a State Championship event NO CALLERS will be permitted.

GEAR CHECK

Under the current EA Dressage rules, it is compulsory for every horse and rider combination to have a gear check for every test they ride. The stewards will advise whether gear checks will take place before or after your test.

WHIPS & GEAR

EA rules regarding approved gear apply everywhere on the event grounds. Please take particular note of whip, head gear and Horse Identification Number rules.

Whips FEI Competitions: As this event is a State Championship, it is not permitted to carry a whip of any kind while competing in the arena for FEI classes, including the FEI-Ch, FEI-P and FEI-J.

Allocated Horse Identification as per the draws must be worn whenever the horse is out of the stable including leading, grazing or under saddle at any time.

Competitors grazing horses must take extreme care and have horses under full control at all times. If grazing horses appear to be upsetting competing horses or horses under saddle, they will be asked to return to the stables. **Please do not graze or lead horses close to the competition arenas when horses are competing.**

STABLES & CAMPING

The Stable Complex is accessible through Gate 14, via Old Gympie Road.

ABSOLUTELY NO DAY PARKING – CAR OR CAR AND FLOAT – IS TO HAPPEN AT THE STABLE COMPLEX.

Competitor Day Parking: Day parking is not available at the stable complex. Day parking is available at the Outdoor Arena Complex, accessible through Gate 15 via Old Gympie Road. This applies to all competitors regardless of which arenas your competitions are held in.

Car Parking: Car parking is available on Area 14 off Tuckaroo Drive. Vehicles are not allowed in the competition and training areas.

Stabling & Camping Allocation: The stabling and camping allocation will be posted on the CDI website. Stabling and camping is controlled through the venue.

Horse Arrival times are restricted to day light hours only between 6.30am and 6.00pm daily.

Cheryl Stephen is the Stable Manager during the event. Cheryl will be onsite from Tuesday September 14 from 9AM through to Sunday September 19, however Anita will be onsite Monday 13th if you need to arrive earlier. Please contact Cheryl if you are having transport problems and delayed arrival is expected (see Handy Telephone Numbers page for phone details).

Arrival Procedure: Upon arrival at the stable complex you must check in to the venue using the Check In QLD app. Upon entry into the complex you will be greeted by the Stable Manager. Cheryl will take your completed Horse Health Declaration Form from you, note your arrival date, and show you to your camping site and stables. If you are arriving Monday please call Anita on arrival (0433447692), as I will likely be over at the indoor resetting the venue.

Departure Procedure: When you are ready to depart the stable complex you must notify the Stable Manager. Cheryl will inspect your stable for cleanliness, lock your stable and note your departure date.

Note: Please bring your own feed and water bins as these are not provided by QSEC. It is also advisable to bring your own stable cleaning tools and wheelbarrow as these are in limited supply at the venue.

Stable Bedding: Your stable will be pre-filled with shavings. Extra bedding in the form of Hisorb shavings can be ordered from Petstock Caboolture (see Handy Telephone Numbers page). Orders placed by 11am each day will be delivered that afternoon.

Stable Cleaning: with your entry you have paid a stable bond. This will be refunded post event if your stable is left clean – clean means that all bedding, feed & urine has been removed from the stable and it has been SWEPT clean (not merely scraped out with a shovel). Any damage to stables as noted by QSEC is payable by competitors and the minimum fee for damage is \$250. This fee will be charged to competitors.

Stable Cleaning Service: A stable cleaning service is offered by Liam Stephen for \$25 per stable. Please book and pay for this service with the Stable Manager, Cheryl Stephen.

DAY YARD BOOKINGS

Day yards are available at the Outdoor Arena Complex. These are free but need to be booked to ensure that they are unlocked. Please let the event director know if you require a day yard.

CATERING

Catering will be available during the day from Wednesday to Saturday.

TEST PAPERS

This event uses the Nominate paperless scoring. Test sheets will be emailed to riders after signed off by the judge. Check your junk email if you do not receive your email. If it's still not received email Nominate nominate@nominate.com.au

PRESENTATIONS

Social distancing will be essential at presentations. A maximum of 48 persons are permitted in the Saddlefitter Marquee at any one time. We request that only riders participating in the presentation enter the Saddlefitter Marquee during presentations. All other persons should remain outside the Saddlefitter Marquee. We will roll up the sides to ensure good visibility. Riders should remain 1.5m apart when on the podium and we request no physical touching during the presentation.

A presentation schedule will be posted on the notice board in the Saddlefitter Marquee. Riders are required to be neatly attired in competition attire for presentations. Presentations in the main will be unmounted and will take place in the Saddlefitter Marquee (please check the notice board). All freestyle presentations will be mounted. We invite non-riding owners to be present at the prize giving ceremonies.

Participation in presentations is compulsory as per the event Schedule. If you cannot attend presentation then you need to arrange for someone to collect your prize for you and notify the event director, Anita Barton, before the presentation.

Prize money will be deposited into your nominated bank account within 14 working days of the event.

The Riders XOXO Ringside Retreat is the social hub of the event. RIDER BAGS

Each rider will receive a Brisbane CDN riders bag. If you have purchased a Commemorative Polo Shirt (ordered and paid for at the time of entry) it will be in your rider bag. Rider bags can be collected from the Event Office during the event.

WELFARE OF THE HORSE – FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

CODE OF CONDUCT

Code of conduct: The organising committee of the Brisbane CDI and Queensland Dressage Championships values the attendance of all riders, officials, spectators, sponsors, volunteers and supporters HOWEVER it is a condition of attendance at this event that each person present on the grounds is bound by the rules, policies and by-laws of Equestrian Australia. This includes comments made on social media. Any complaints or conflicts should be managed with respect through official channels. As per EA Disciplinary By-Laws 3(j) any other person or organisation (for

example, a parent/guardian, spectator or sponsor) who or which agrees, in writing or otherwise (whether on a ticket, entry form, conditions of entry displayed at a venue etc) to be bound by these By-Laws. Any rider, parent, official or associate to be found in breach of these By-Laws will be requested to leave the venue immediately and all entry fees and prizes deemed forfeit.

ARRIVING AT QSEC
