Conditions of Entry

The 2025 Queensland Youth & Pony Dressage Championships will be conducted in accordance with current EA Regulations and Rules and current EA National Dressage Rules. The onus is on riders to know the rules under which they compete and to be aware of updates (note – updates are published January 1st and July 1st each year). Unless otherwise stated, rules quoted in this document reference EA National Dressage Rules.

1. Membership and Horse Registration:

• Riders and Horses/Ponies entered in all classes, including the Sharon Doe Memorial, must be current Competitive members of EA.

2. Rider Age:

- EA Young Pony Rider classes are open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year they turn 8 years old and up to the end of the year they turn 21.
- EA Young Horse Rider classes are open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year they turn 10 years old and up to the end of the year they turn 21.
- EA and FEI Youth Rider classes are open to riders aged 22 to 25 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 22 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 25. Riders may ride a horse or pony.
- FEI Children competitions are open for riders aged 12 to 14 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 12 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 14. Horse/pony must be 6 years of age or older.
- FEI Pony Tour competitions are open for riders aged 12 to 16 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 12 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 16. Pony must be 6 years of age or older.
- FEI Junior Tour competitions are open for riders aged 14 to 18 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 14 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 18. Horse/pony must be 6 years of age or older.
- FEI Young Rider Tour competitions are open for riders aged 16 to 21 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 21. Horse/pony must be 7 years of age or older.

• FEI U25 Big Tour competitions (Intermediate II, U25 Grand Prix & Grand Prix Freestyle) are open for riders aged 16 to 25 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 25. Horse/pony must be 8 years of age or older.

3. Gradings:

Official grading will be taken at the date of the close of entries. Refer to rule 4.8.3.2 for grading eligibility.

- 4. **Height**: Refer rule 4.8.3.3. Horses exceeding 149cm with shoes or 148cm without shoes, Ponies not exceeding 149cm with shoes, not exceeding 148cm without shoes. Ponies competing in pony-specific classes must have a current measurement certificate approved by the EA and must indicate the pony's height when entering.
- 5. **Stallions**: Stallions are welcome to compete at this event however, they must be kept under control by a competent person at all times when either ridden or led. Riders and/or handlers of colts/stallions must be over the age of 18 years. Stallions must be led with a suitable restraint as described in the policy link below. Stallions may not be tied to the outside of a truck or trailer and must be stabled. Any stallion not considered to be in control by the Organising Committee (OC) will be withdrawn from the event. Stallion owners must display their Stallion Identification at all times to help everyone to identify them. Refer to rule 4.8.5. Competitors please make yourselves familiar with the Stallion Safe Practices Rules and Regulations: https://www.equestrian.org.au/stallion-safe-practice
- 6. All riders and handlers are reminded that any horse can be dangerous so please give all horses and ponies enough room to pass safely whether you are leading or riding. Please be considerate of all riders and handlers and follow the rules of the arena whilst working horses; that is if you are walking stay towards the middle track in the arena, if you need to stop or check your gear move to the middle of the arena or leave the arena; pass riders coming in the opposite direction left shoulder to left shoulder. If you pass a rider in the same direction allow at least 5 m width. Please look around you at all times and try to be aware of others riding or walking past. Many people unintentionally frighten or distract horses by going too close or by moving too quickly; it is everyone's role to ensure the safety of others. Please refer to Annex F.10.2 of the EA Dressage Rules for warm-up etiquette.

7. Qualifying scores:

Qualifying scores are not required for this competition, however in the event of class oversubscription entry will be balloted based on submission of one Official Competitive dressage result at the level they are entering (interschool, participant, freestyle and young horse results will not count).

HC scores may be submitted.

The qualifying period is the 12 months immediately prior to the close of entries.

The submitted scores MUST have been obtained by the nominated horse/rider combination.

FEI: EA dressage rules will apply for eligibility of combinations to be able to compete in FEI Young Rider Tour, FEI Prix St Georges/Intermediate I, FEI Intermediate II/Grand Prix, including freestyles. (refer to rule 4.8.3.2)

- 8. **A rider of the appropriate age** may compete in more than one FEI level across the FEI Children, FEI Pony, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Big Tour competitions at this event. Riders may participate on the same horse so long as they do need exceed the maximum number of tests per day permitted (refer to rule 4.8.1)
- 9. Latest versions of FEI tests and FEI freestyle tests can be found here: http://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/organisers/dressage/tests.
- 10. The number of horses per rider per competition may be limited if the competition is oversubscribed.
- 11. As per EA rules for Australian and State Championships, two places in each competition are reserved for the highest balloted horse and rider combinations from each State.
- 12. **Draw**: Competitions are limited to 35 competitors. The OC reserves the right to rank horses if necessary. A revised draw may be necessary the day before the competition to allow for withdrawals/scratchings. **The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the day before the competition.** If a competition is oversubscribed, a reserve list will be established.
- 13. Competitors are not permitted to ride HC at this event.
- 14. **Saddlery and Equipment** As per current EA Dressage Rules including amendments. Note: EA levels up to and including Advanced a whip must not exceed 1.2m in its entirety. Pony riders may only use a whip not exceeding 1.00m. A whip is **NOT** permitted in any of the FEI level competitions, including FEI Children, FEI Pony, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and Under 25 Big Tour.
- 15. **Protective Headgear:** For all riders approved safety helmets must be worn at all times when training, warming up or competing at this event.
- 16. Spurs Ponies Pony riders may only wear spurs that are no longer than 4.0cm measured from the boot. Refer to rule 5.5.
- 17. Horse Identification Numbers (2) must be worn at all times when the horse is outside its stable, not just when it is being ridden. Please ensure you have two sets of numbers, one on each side of the horse's bridle or saddlecloth for competition and one on

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- each side of the horse when taking the horse out of the stable including walking/hosing down etc. Numbers must be compliant with rule 4.8.5. Please include your allocated Horse Identification Number on the entry form. In the case of duplication of numbers, the OC will allocate a temporary number for this event only.
- 18. **Entries:** can only be made online at www.nominate.com.au. Incomplete information may result in the entry not being accepted. Late entries, faxed and phone entries will not be accepted, except in exceptional circumstances and accompanied by a \$50.00 late entry fee.
- 19. Scratchings, Withdrawals and Refunds: Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical or veterinary certificate is received by the Event Director within 24 hours of the completion of the event. In such cases, 50% of the entry fees will be retained by the OC. Entry fees will be refunded in full for scratchings before the closing date of entries and for riders on the reserve list who are not offered a start in a competition. As per rule 4.3 refunds will not be given under any circumstance for riders who withdraw from the day prior to commencement of the competition, that is, from Thursday June 19th. The administration fee will not be refunded under any circumstance. Withdrawals must be notified to the OC at least 24 hours before the actual day of competition to ascampton@hotmail.com or text to 0433 447 692. As per Rule 10.4, no competitor shall withdraw from a competition within 8 hours before the start of the competition without the permission of the Organising Committee. A written statement giving reasons for the withdrawal must be handed to the Event Office or by text to 0433 447 692 prior to the commencement of the competition. Penalty for non-compliance maximum of \$200.00.
- 20. **Medication Control**: if approached by the Official Veterinary Surgeon or Official from the OC, the competitor must allow samples to be taken from their horse/pony for drug testing. Random swabbing will take place. Riders must have their EA documents ready to provide to officials should their horse be selected for swabbing.
- 21. Indemnity: Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted, undertake to indemnify the Committee against all claims, losses, suits and damages made against or suffered by the Committee by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any riders, trainers or attendants whilst they are attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse and agree that any act or omission on the part of such riders or attendants found in any action against the Committee to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity. Riders are required to acknowledge the Declaration form included on Nominate.com.au. Failure to agree to this condition will result in non-acceptance of the nomination.
- 22. **Code of conduct:** The organising committee of the Queensland Youth & Pony Dressage Championships values the attendance of all riders, officials, spectators, sponsors, volunteers and supporters HOWEVER it is a condition of attendance at this event that each person present on the grounds is bound by the rules, policies and by-laws of Equestrian Australia. This includes comments made on social media. Any complaints or conflicts should be managed with respect through official channels. As per EA Disciplinary By-Laws 3(j) any other person or organisation (for example, a parent/guardian, spectator or sponsor) who or which agrees, in writing or otherwise (whether on a ticket, entry form, conditions of entry displayed at a venue etc) to be bound by these By-Laws. Any rider, parent, official or associate to be found in breach of these By-Laws will be requested to leave the venue immediately and all entry fees and prizes deemed forfeit.
- 23. **Reservation of Rights:** The OC reserves the right to alter, amend and to refuse any entry, with or without stating reasons.
- 24. **Protests and Appeals**: Objections must be in writing and accompanied by the stipulated deposit (refer EA Gen. Regs Art. 163/165/166) and Rule 1.6 of EA Dressage Rules. Protests must be lodged to the Ground Jury through the Event Director, Chief Steward or Technical Delegate.

General Information

- 1. EA Rules and Regulations apply from the time the horse arrives on the grounds. Please pay particular attention to 2025 EA National Dressage rules Section 5 for Dress, Saddlery and Equipment including helmet tagging.
- 2. **No Callers**: as this is a Championship event **NO callers** are allowed.
- 3. **Dogs** Dogs are not permitted at the PRARG grounds.
- 4. **Companion animals (horse or other)** will not be permitted for biosecurity reasons.
- 5. **Presentations**: will take place at the end of the day at the undercover area. A presentation schedule will be published in the Riders Letter which will be sent out with the draw. It is compulsory for all placegetters to be present at prize giving dressed in full riding attire. **Rosettes & prizes will only be awarded to riders who attend presentations.** Non-attendance will result in forfeiting of all prizes and prize money/goods.
- 6. **Camping facilities**: There are limited powered camping sites at PRARG (10 available) and capacity for unpowered camping. Priority for powered camping will be given to competitors traveling long distances. Off-site powered camping and stabling is available at:
 - Leanne Smith; Teviot Rd (across the road; stables and powered camping)
 - Tully Memorial Park; Beryl Pde North Maclean (5km from PRARG grounds; camping only)
 - Jimboomba Pony Club; Green Ridge Rd Jimboomba (12km from PRARG grounds; yards and camping)
 - Benalbyn Lodge; 69-77 Cooreen Rd Munruben (9km from PRARG grounds; stables, yards and camping)
 - Gary Lung; Scott Lane, North Maclean (2km from PRARG grounds; yards and stables)
 - Bellara Park; 97 Worrendo St, Veresdale (23km from PRARG grounds; stables, camping and accommodation)
- 7. **Yards:** All Stallions and any horses staying overnight must be kept in a yard. Competitors are responsible for paying for any damages incurred to yards during the event.

- 8. Arrival of Horses: PRARG will be open for arrival of horses from Thursday 19th June 12pm.
- 9. **Accommodation:** Motel accommodation is available in nearby Browns Plains; google 'Motels Browns Plains to find out more. There is limited accommodation available at Bellara Park <u>Bellara Park Equestrian Center Indoor Arena</u>
- 10. Catering facilities will be available on the grounds from Friday morning. Breakfast, morning and afternoon tea and lunch.
- 11. Warming-up/ exercising: All riders must wear an approved safety helmet while mounted with the chin strap secured. You are reminded that only the rider entered in the Championships is permitted to ride the horse. A groom may ride the horse at a walk on a long rein only. All horses must be saddled and be ridden in a bridle during any mounted exercise or competition warm-up. Please do not ride in the camping area. Outdoor warm-up arenas will be available for use prior to the competition. More information will be contained in the Competitor information which will be sent to riders. Competitors will have access to competition arenas for familiarisation.
- 12. **Lunging**: Lunging is only permitted in the lunge ring and immediately adjacent to the lunge ring outside the warm-up arena fence. Under no circumstances are horses to be lunged in any other area. Please be considerate of other riders who are riding or waiting to use the lunging facilities.

Volunteers: Please note that all riders may be given jobs to do during the event, which may include, scribing/pencilling, arena gate opening/closing etc. A \$50.00 levy will be payable by those who do not wish to undertake a volunteer role. There will be a job list available online before the event. You will need to make sure that you are aware of your jobs before the event; jobs will be allocated around rider's times in the draw. If a rider or associate fails to undertake their volunteer job without finding a replacement all prizes will be forfeit and entries may be refused for future Dressage Queensland events (this includes the Queensland Riders Series, Queensland Dressage Championships and Brisbane CDI)

Risk Warning and Disclaimer

- 1. Horse riding is a dangerous activity and can result in serious injury (including death) and loss.
- 2. All persons who ride, or tend, a horse on these grounds do so entirely at their own risk.
- 3. Neither the Organising Committee of any competition to which these rules apply, or the EA, accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, grounds, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever.

Vaccinations & Biosecurity

- Horse vaccinations: it is recommended that horses are vaccinated for Hendra virus, in particular those that reside in high risk
 areas. It is also recommended that horse vaccinations for Strangles and Tetanus are up to date. Compulsory vaccination for
 Hendra Virus is not required for this event.
- 2. For competitors travelling across interstate borders it is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure they comply with border control and tick spraying requirements.
- 3. **Biosecurity Horse Health Declaration**: A Biosecurity declaration is available on the event webpage and on the on-line entry system. Competitors will be required to complete a Biosecurity Horse Health Declaration for all horses attending the event and hand in the form on arrival at the Gear Check. More information and link to the declaration form will be provided after the close of entries to participants accepted to compete at the event.

The Sharon Doe Memorial Rider's Trophy for Riders 14 to 25 years of age

Background

Sharon Doe was a highly successful young Queensland dressage rider, who competed in and won numerous dressage championships up to and including FEI level.

The Sharon Doe Memorial Rider's Trophy was donated by Marion and Edgar Lichtwark in memory of Sharon Doe, who was a rider who simply loved to ride. It never mattered to Sharon what she rode, she just loved to be astride a horse. She always said she felt happiest when she was riding. All those who remember Sharon remember the lightness and harmony with which she rode her horses. The Sharon Doe Memorial Rider's Trophy event has been formatted along the lines of the European Riders Championship.

Guidelines for Entering

- This is a rider class, and is to be judged primarily on the rider, the effectiveness of aids and ability to technically execute a
 test.
- It is open to riders up to the age of turning 25 years old in this calendar year (not limited to Qld riders).
- Horses and riders must be registered with Equestrian Australia.
- Approximate level of test difficulty is Advanced/Prix St Georges

Prizes: Perpetual trophy and rug for the winner: Keepsake Rosette for all class entrants.

Entry Fee: \$60

Format of the Competition

Riders will ride the FEI Young Rider Preliminary Test (approximately Advanced level, can be found on the FEI website). One judge sitting at C will assess the technical element of the test while two judges sitting at E or B will assess the rider for seat and effectiveness of aids. After the rider has finished their test, they will immediately meet with the sideline judges, who will provide the rider with helpful and positive feedback on their performance. After addressing the rider, the judges will address the audience regarding the performance of the rider, bearing in mind the purpose of this class is to encourage young riders.
