Conditions of Entry

The 2026 Australian Amateur Owner Rider Dressage Championships & Queensland State Young Rider and Para/Virtus Dressage Championships will be conducted in accordance with current EA Regulations and Rules, current EA National Dressage and Para Dressage Rules and current Virtus policies, rules and regulations. The onus is on riders to know the rules under which they compete and to be aware of updates. Unless otherwise stated, rules quoted in this document reference current EA National Dressage Rules.

For Additional Para & Virtus Dressage Conditions of Entry see page 11

1. Membership and Horse Registration:

Riders entered in all AOR, Young Rider & Para/Virtus competitions must be current Competitive members of EA. Horses/Ponies must have EA Life Registration. Horses in AOR & YR competitions must have a current Dressage Performance Card/Competition Licence

2. Amateur Owner Rider Status:

Riders in the AOR classes must meet the EA National Guidelines for Amateur Owner Rider (AOR) as prescribed in rule 4.6.1. **Riders competing in the Young Rider classes are not eligible to compete in the AOR Classes**

3. Young Rider Competitions Rider Age:

- EA Young Rider Pony classes are open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year they turn 8 years old and up to the end of the year they turn 21.
- EA Young Rider Horse classes are open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year they turn 10 years old and up to the end of the year they turn 21.
- FEI Children competitions are open for riders aged 10 to 14 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 10 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 14. Horse/pony must be 6 years of age or older.
- FEI Pony Tour competitions are open for riders aged 8 to 16 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 8 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 16. Pony must be 6 years of age or older.
- FEI Junior Tour competitions are open for riders aged 14 to 18 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 14 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 18. Horse/pony must be 6 years of age or older.
- FEI Young Rider Tour competitions are open for riders aged 16 to 21 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 21. Horse/pony must be 7 years of age or older.
- FEI U25 Big Tour competitions (Intermediate II, U25 Grand Prix & Grand Prix Freestyle) are open for riders aged 16 to 25 years, that is, from the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year that they reach 25. Horse/pony must be 8 years of age or older.

4. Gradings:

Official grading will be taken at the date of the close of entries. Refer to rule 4.8.3.2 for grading eligibility.

5. Height: Refer rule 4.8.3.3. Ponies competing in pony-specific classes must have a current measurement certificate approved by the EA and must indicate the pony's height when entering.

6. Stallions: Stallions are welcome to compete at this event however, they must be kept under control by a competent person at all times when either ridden or led. Riders and/or handlers of colts/stallions must be over the age of 18 years. Stallions may not be tied to the outside of a truck or trailer and must be stabled. Any stallion not considered to be in control by the Organising Committee (OC) will be withdrawn from the event. Refer to rules 4.8.4.2 & 4.8.5. Competitors please make yourselves familiar with the Stallion Safe Practices Rules and Regulations: <https://www.equestrian.org.au/stallion-safe-practice>

7. Qualifying scores (AOR classes only):

All qualifying scores must have been obtained in Official Dressage Competitive competitions.

Scores are the FINAL score from a given competition i.e. the average of all judges on that competition (not the score from a single judge on a given competition)

A HC score is permitted.

The qualifying period is the 12 months immediately prior to the close of entries.

Combinations must qualify at the level they are entering with one score as follows:

- Preliminary and Novice qualifying score - one score of at least 62%.
- Elementary / Medium / Advanced qualifying score –one score of at least 60%.
- PSG and above –one score of at least 58%

The submitted scores MUST have been obtained by the nominated horse/rider combination.

8. For AOR riders, only riders who have been accepted to compete, that is, have achieved qualification scores and been accepted onto the draw, will be permitted to ride at the event.

9. **Qualifying scores (Young Rider, Para and Virtus):**

Qualifying scores are not required, however in the event of class oversubscription in YR competitions, entry will be balloted based on submission of one Official Competitive dressage result at the level entered. Participant, freestyle and young horse results will not count. Interschool results from competitions listed in rule 10.14.1 may be submitted.

10. **Young Rider FEI:** EA dressage rules will apply for eligibility of combinations to be able to compete in FEI Young Rider Tour, FEI Prix St Georges/Intermediate I, FEI Intermediate II/Grand Prix, including freestyles. (refer to rule 4.8.3.2)
11. **A rider of the appropriate age** may compete in more than one youth category across the FEI Children, FEI Pony, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Big Tour competitions at this event. Riders may participate on the same horse as long as they do not exceed the permitted maximum number of tests per day (refer to rule 4.8.1)
12. **Freestyles:** Freestyle classes are open to all entrants as per rule 4.8.3. Participation may be limited due to time constraints and, where the class is oversubscribed, will be ranked using the results achieved in the higher test at the level at this event. i.e. the results from the Medium 4.3 may be used to determine competitors in the Medium Freestyle.
Freestyle classes will be open to both Horse and Pony Riders. There will not be separate prizes awarded for horses and ponies.
13. The number of horses per rider per competition may be limited if the competition is oversubscribed.
14. **Draw:** Competitions are limited to 35 competitors. The OC reserves the right to rank horses if necessary. Ranking will be conducted as per rule 10.2. A revised draw may be necessary the day before the competition to allow for withdrawals/scratchings. **The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the day before the competition.** If a competition is oversubscribed, a reserve list will be established.
15. Competitors are not permitted to ride **HC** at this event.
16. **Horse Identification Numbers** Please include your Dressage Horse Identification Number (bridle no.) on the entry form. In the case of duplication of numbers or for Virtus and permitted companion horses, the OC will allocate a temporary number for this event only.
17. **Entries:** can only be made online at www.nominate.com.au. Incomplete information may result in the entry not being accepted. Late entries, faxed and phone entries will not be accepted, except in exceptional circumstances, approved by the OC and accompanied by a \$50.00 late entry fee.
18. Any relevant EA Exemption Cards must be emailed to ascampton@hotmail.com at the time of entry.
19. **Scratchings, Withdrawals and Refunds:** Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical or veterinary certificate is received by the Event Director within 24 hours of the completion of the event. In such cases, 50% of the entry fees will be retained by the OC. Entry fees will be refunded in full for scratchings before the closing date of entries and for riders on the reserve list who are not offered a start in a competition. As per rule 4.3 refunds will not be given under any circumstance for withdrawals/scratchings advised from the day prior to commencement of the competition, that is, from Thursday August 6th. The administration fee will **not be refunded under any circumstance. Withdrawals must be notified to the OC at least 24 hours before the actual day of competition to ascampton@hotmail.com or text to 0433 447 692.** As per Rule 10.4, no competitor shall withdraw from a competition within 8 hours before the start of the competition without the permission of the Organising Committee. A written statement giving reasons for the withdrawal must be handed to the Event Office **or by text to 0433 447 692** prior to the commencement of the competition. Penalty for non-compliance – maximum of \$200.00.
20. **Medication Control:** if approached by the Official Veterinary Surgeon or Official from the OC, the competitor must allow samples to be taken from their horse/pony for drug testing. Random swabbing will take place. Riders **must** have their EA documents ready to provide to officials should their horse be selected for swabbing.

Indemnity: Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted, undertake to indemnify the Committee against all claims, losses, suits and damages made against or suffered by the Committee by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any riders, trainers or attendants whilst they are attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse and agree that any act or omission on the part of such riders or attendants found in any action against the Committee to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity. Riders are required to acknowledge the Declaration form included on Nominate.com.au. Failure to agree to this condition will result in non-acceptance of the nomination.

Code of conduct: The organising committee of the Australian Amateur Owner Rider Dressage Championships & Queensland State Young Rider and Para/Virtus Dressage Championships values the attendance of all riders, officials, spectators, sponsors, volunteers and supporters HOWEVER it is a condition of attendance at this event that each person present on the grounds is bound by the rules, policies and by-laws of Equestrian Australia. This includes comments made on social media. Any complaints or conflicts should be managed with respect through official channels. As per EA Disciplinary By-Laws 3(j) any other person or organisation (for example, a parent/guardian, spectator or sponsor) who or which agrees, in writing or otherwise (whether on a ticket, entry form, conditions of entry displayed at a venue etc) to be bound by these By-Laws. **Any rider, parent, official or associate to be found in breach of these By-Laws will be requested to leave the venue immediately and all entry fees and prizes deemed forfeit.**

Reservation of Rights: The OC reserves the right to alter, amend and to refuse any entry with or without stating reasons.

General Information

1. EA Rules and Regulations apply from the time the horse arrives on the grounds. Please pay particular attention to 2026 National Dressage rules Section 5 for Dress, Saddlery and Equipment including helmet tagging.
2. **No Callers:** as this is a Championship event **NO callers** are allowed.
3. Latest versions of FEI tests and FEI freestyle tests can be found here: <http://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/organisers/dressage/tests>.
4. **Dogs** – Dogs are ONLY allowed in the QSEC camping grounds. This does not include Barr Oval, amenity blocks, the indoor precinct including the grassed area outside or car parks or within the stable blocks. Dogs MUST be kept on a lead (maximum length of 1 metre) and under control at all times. Any person not adhering to this guideline will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and no refund given. Please ensure that dog droppings are disposed of using the bags provided. Do not bring dangerous dogs to this event.
5. **Companion animals (horse or other)** will not be permitted for biosecurity reasons. Exceptions are only where permitted in the EA Para Dressage and Virtus Equestrian Dressage Rules through prior agreement with the event director. Any such horse/pony is subject to the same welfare, biosecurity, event and venue conditions as competition horses. Stabling for permitted companion horses/ponies, if staying overnight, must be booked with entries.
6. **Camping facilities:** A number of powered and unpowered camp sites are available on the grounds and are to be booked with entries. Camp sites will be allocated by the OC. There are good shower and toilet facilities with hot and cold water.
7. **Stabling:** **All Stallions and any horses staying overnight must be stabled.** Stables are to be booked with entries and will be allocated by the OC. No horses are to change allocated stables unless authorised by the Stable Manager. Private tack rooms will be allocated only if sufficient spare stables are available. Competitors are responsible for paying for any damages incurred to stables during the event.
 - Stabling \$45 per day (Note – 1 overnight stay is 2 days of stabling)
 - Powered Camping \$45 per night
 - Unpowered Camping \$30 per night
 - Barr Oval Yards \$15 per day (Day use only)
 - QSEC Stable cleaning fee \$75 (Compulsory and refunded if stables are left empty and clean)
 - **Please Note: Charges for stable hire at QSEC apply to use of stables per day or part thereof. e.g. From midnight to midnight.** If you arrive before midnight on one day and leave at 6am the following day this is classed as 2 days. Please take this into account when booking stables
8. **Day parking:** available at the outdoor arena parking area. Day yards can be booked but may not be used overnight.
9. **Arrival of Horses:** QSEC will be open for arrival of horses from Wednesday 5th August 9am. **Arrivals only via special arrangement prior to this time.**
10. **Compulsory Stable Bond:** On departure, please remove all bedding and manure from the stable and dispose of the waste into the manure bays provided. Please do not place any foreign material in the manure bays. Ensure that the stable is closed and bolted. The stable will be inspected prior to your departure and your bond will be refunded if the stable is left in a satisfactory condition i.e. completely clear of all bedding and manure.
11. **Bedding** Stables will be pre-filled with 4 wheelbarrow loads of shavings as part of the stabling fee. More shavings can be ordered from PETstock Caboolture, 60 Beerburrum Rd, Caboolture – 07 5495 3222 and Feedmania 54 Beerburrum St Caboolture 07 5495 1961.
12. **Fodder:** Petstock Feed Supplies 60 Beerburrum Road Caboolture Tel: 07 5495 3222; and Feedmania 54 Beerburrum St Caboolture 07 5495 1961.
13. **STABLE PROTOCOLS: SMOKING is not permitted in the stables.** Only vehicles used by Stable Warden, venue staff and powered mobility for riders with a disability such as electric wheelchairs and powered scooters are allowed. Prams, bicycles, scooters and golf buggies are not permitted in the stable area. Children 12 years and under must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times. For safety reasons we recommend that all persons, including children, wear closed footwear whilst in the stables.
14. **QSEC POLICIES: QSEC IS A GLASS FREE VENUE. Only alcohol purchased at the venue can be consumed in the Indoor Precinct.**
15. **Accommodation:** Motel accommodation is available in nearby Caboolture; google 'Motels Caboolture' to find out more.
16. **Catering facilities** - will be available on the grounds from Thursday morning (to be confirmed). Breakfast, morning and afternoon tea and lunch.
17. **Pony measuring** will take place at the venue for any competitors who require measuring. Details will be in the competitor information pack
18. **Tick spraying** will take place at the venue for any competitors who require spraying to cross the border. Details will be in the competitor information pack

Information for Freestyle competitions

1. **Music** to be supplied via Dropbox. The Dropbox link will be provided via email following close of entries and will expire approximately two weeks out from the event commencing to allow time for the sound technician to check the music. Please ensure you are organised and ready to upload your music within this time frame. **Please clearly mark competition e.g. Novice etc, horse and rider name on the email along with any special instructions.**
2. **Music test:** An opportunity will exist on Friday 7th August 2026 to test your music in the main indoor arena. Further information will be available in the competitor information pack.

Volunteers:

Please note that all riders may be given jobs to do during the event, which may include scribing/pencilling etc. A \$50.00 levy will be payable by those who do not wish to undertake a volunteer role. There will be a job list available online before the event. You will need to make sure that you are aware of your jobs before the event; jobs will be allocated around rider's times in the draw. If a rider or associate fails to undertake their volunteer job without finding a replacement all prizes will be forfeit and entries may be refused for future Dressage Queensland events (this includes the Queensland Riders Series, Queensland Dressage Championships and Brisbane CDI)

Risk Warning and Disclaimer

1. Horse riding is a dangerous activity and can result in serious injury (including death) and loss.
2. All persons who ride, or tend, a horse on these grounds do so entirely at their own risk.
3. Neither the Organising Committee of any competition to which these rules apply, or the EA, accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, grounds, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever.

Vaccinations & Biosecurity

1. Horse vaccinations: it is recommended that horses are vaccinated for Hendra virus, in particular those that reside in high risk areas. It is also recommended that horse vaccinations for Strangles and Tetanus are up to date. Compulsory vaccination for Hendra Virus is not required for this event.
2. For competitors travelling across interstate borders it is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure they comply with border control and tick spraying requirements. The event committee will attempt to have QSEC certified as a tick-free venue prior to the event starting. If this is not possible, spraying arrangements for horses returning to tick free areas and Interstate will be organised to allow horses to be sprayed at QSEC prior to departure.
3. **Biosecurity Horse Health Declaration:** A Biosecurity declaration is available on the event webpage and on the on-line entry system. Competitors will be required to complete a Biosecurity Horse Health Declaration for all horses attending the event and hand in the form on arrival at the Stable Manager if unloading at the stable complex or gear check if unloading at Barr Oval. More information and link to the declaration form will be provided after the close of entries to participants accepted to compete at the event.

The Sharon Doe Memorial Rider's Trophy for Riders 14 to 25 years of age

Background

Sharon Doe was a highly successful young Queensland dressage rider, who competed in and won numerous dressage championships up to and including FEI level.

The Sharon Doe Memorial Rider's Trophy was donated by Marion and Edgar Lichtwark in memory of Sharon Doe, who was a rider who simply loved to ride. It never mattered to Sharon what she rode, she just loved to be astride a horse. She always said she felt happiest when she was riding. All those who remember Sharon remember the lightness and harmony with which she rode her horses. The Sharon Doe Memorial Rider's Trophy event has been formatted along the lines of the European Riders Championship.

Guidelines for Entering

- This is a rider class, and is to be judged primarily on the rider, the effectiveness of aids and ability to technically execute a test.
- It is open to riders from the year they turn 14 up to the age of turning 25 years old in this calendar year (not limited to Qld riders).
- Horses and riders must be registered with Equestrian Australia.
- Approximate level of test difficulty is Advanced/Prix St Georges

Prizes: Perpetual trophy and rug for the winner: Keepsake Rosette for all class entrants.

Entry Fee: \$60

Format of the Competition

Riders will ride the FEI Young Rider Preliminary Test (approximately Advanced level, can be found on the FEI website). One judge sitting at C will assess the technical element of the test while two judges sitting at E or B will assess the rider for seat and effectiveness of aids. After the rider has finished their test, they will immediately meet with the sideline judges, who will provide the rider with helpful and positive feedback on their performance. After addressing the rider, the judges will address the audience regarding the performance of the rider, bearing in mind the purpose of this class is to encourage young riders.

PARA & VIRTUS DRESSAGE

Para and Virtus Chief Steward: Madonna Bell

The Queensland State Para & Virtus Dressage Championships will be conducted in principle as per section 9 of the EA Para Dressage Rules for the Para-Dressage State Championships and section 7 of the Virtus Equestrian Dressage Rules.

The conditions of entry for Para & Virtus Dressage are the same as for able bodied unless otherwise specified.

Competitors are advised to be aware of the rules. The onus is on the riders to know the rules under which they compete.

Riders eligible for both Virtus and Para Dressage can compete in either but not in both.

Where rules are not accounted for in the respective EA Para Dressage Rules or Virtus Equestrian Dressage Rules, EA Dressage Rules will take precedence.

A copy of the rider's compensating aids (adaptive equipment) must be uploaded with entries or emailed to the event organizer at the time of making the entry.

PARA DRESSAGE

Entries & Eligibility

- Age of horses/ponies, as per rule 5.6.2. Age of athletes from the year they turn 12 years of age as per rule 5.6.3.
- Participation is open to any rider who is a member of Equestrian Australia and is current in the FEI or EA PD Master List.
- All Riders must be eligible to compete as per the current EA Para Equestrian Rules.
- Adaptive Equipment (compensating aids) – as per rule 3.2.
- Schooling: refer to rule 9.1.3.
- Saddlery and Gear, as per current EA Para Dressage rules. Note 2026 changes to 3.11 spurs.
- Horses: A rider can enter more than one horse per level. Horses may compete in a maximum of two tests in one day. Horses may be shared by two athletes in different grades, refer to rule 9.1.2.

Performance Requirements

- As per rule 9.23, no qualifying percentage is required

Other Information

- No test may be commanded unless specified on Athletes FEI/EA PD Master List.
- Withdrawals, as per rule 9.13. The penalty for non-compliance is \$200AUD.

VIRTUS DRESSAGE

Entries & Eligibility

- Riders: Must be accompanied by a support person
 - Age of horses/ponies: minimum of 6 years old. Maximum of 2 horses per competition.
 - Age of athletes: minimum of 14 years of age.
 - Participation is open to any rider who is a member of Equestrian Australia and appears in the Virtus Eligibility Master Lists.
 - All Riders must be eligible to compete as per the current Virtus Equestrian Dressage Rules.
 - Saddlery, Gear and Compensating Aids as per Virtus Equestrian Dressage Rules Section 6
 - Schooling, refer to Virtus Equestrian Dressage Rules Section 7.
 - Horses: A rider can enter no more than two horses per competition. Horses may compete in a maximum of two tests in one day. Horses may be shared by two athletes in different grades, refer to Section 5.3.
 - Tests:
 - o II 1 & II 3: FEI Para Dressage Grade IV Novice A, FEI Para Dressage Grade IV Intermediate A
 - o II 2 FEI: Para Dressage Challenge II Grade III Foundation Test, FEI Para Dressage Grade III Novice A
 - In all tests, the initial halt on entry is omitted.
 - All Virtus II 1 & II 3 competitions will be ridden in a 20 x 60 arena. All Virtus II 2 competitions will be ridden in a 20 x 40 arena.
- Amended 9 February 2026

2026 Australian AOR Dressage Championships incl QLD YR & Para/Virtus Championships

- Virtus Competition horses must also comply with EA Para Dressage Rule 5.6.5 re the wearing of Horse Identification numbers and Stallion ID whilst at this event. This applies from the time of arrival at the venue.
- A coach may not ride the horse once it is on the show ground unless exceptional circumstances prevail and approval is given by the Virtus Equestrian Committee and OC.

Performance Requirements

- No qualifying percentage is required however Virtus Equestrian Dressage Rules re eligibility to compete at Performance Level will apply.

Other Information

- Test Callers are allowed.
- Withdrawals will only be accepted as per steps outlined in rule 9.13 of the EA Para Dressage Rules. The penalty for non-compliance is \$200AUD. Horses withdrawn may be subject to a veterinary inspection.
- A friendly horse is permitted for all riders. Such horse must be held by a handler and be in a bridle. It should be positioned a minimum of 5m from the edge of the arena and must be at the A end of the arena. Stallions are not permitted. Friendly horses must also comply with EA Para Dressage Rule 5.6.5 re the wearing of Horse Identification numbers whilst at this event. See also General Information Point 4.
- All riders may be led around the outside of the arena (or inside if starting from within the arena) prior to starting their test. They must be released at A. The handler must have an attached lead rope and not interfere at any time with the reins.
- A helper may stand at each corner (4) of the arena for safety during the test. They may not speak and must be a minimum of 5m from the edge of the arena.
- Visually impaired riders are allowed to be led or ride independently once around the outside of the arena in each direction.
