GENERAL INFORMATION

The Brisbane CDI Organising Committee would like to thank you for your entry and wish you the very best of luck at the event. Please read through the following important information regarding the Brisbane CDI. Regular updates will be posted on the CDI web page and on our Facebook page.

QSEC IS A GLASS FREE VENUE

As users of this great venue we need to comply with the venue rules which are the same as other large sporting venues in Qld. If you bring glass onto the venue in your vehicles, then that's where it needs to remain – **DO NOT** place empty bottles in the QSEC rubbish bins – take them home with you. There are large fines for people who do not abide by these rules..

FACILITIES

We request that competitors take the utmost care in looking after the wonderful facilities at QSEC. . Please make yourself familiar with the QSEC Camping & Stable Rules and Regulations:

The indoor arena precinct is a non-BYO alcohol area. Alcoholic beverages cannot be taken into or from this precinct.

DOGS

Dogs are permitted in the camping complex **ONLY**. Dogs **ARE NOT PERMITTED** in or around the indoor arena precinct including grassed areas and car parks, at the outdoor arena complex, inside the stable complex or inside amenities. All dogs at all times must be secured or on a leash that is no longer than 1 metre in length. **Do not bring dangerous dogs to this event.**

BIOSECURITY

Under Queensland biosecurity legislation, a movement record must be created every time a horse moves off a property. The method of recording is flexible (diary, email, mobile device, copy/photo of Horse Health Dec etc) however the following information must be recorded and kept for 2 years: date of movement, description of the animal, the property of origin (including PIC), event address (including PIC if possible), estimated arrival and departure times and dates and name and contact details of person responsible. QSEC's PIC is QGCB1219.

SPRAYING FOR COMPETITORS FROM NSW, VIC OR TICK-FREE AREAS

We have arranged for an accredited stock inspector, to come to the venue on either or both Saturday 19th and Sunday September 20th to spray horses returning to Tick Free areas. The stock inspector will help you with the paperwork. Provided you cross the border/tick line within 24 hours of being sprayed, you will not have to stop at a Treatment Facility on your way home. We hope that this will make your journey home more stress free. **ALL RIDERS WHO WISH TO HAVE THEIR HORSES SPRAYED AT THE VENUE NEED TO CONTACT KIM GERTSEMA 0488 200 789 BY SEPTEMBER 9th.**

PONY MEASURING

For those who indicated they would like their ponies measured at this event, an official EA Accredited Pony Measurer will be onsite Wednesday 16th September at the stables. **ALL RIDERS WHO WISH TO HAVE THEIR PONIES MEASURED NEED TO CONTACT GAIL ISKRA 0407 748 763 BY SEPTEMBER 9th.**

DRAWS

Draws for National Classes will be emailed to you and made available on the official Brisbane CDI web site <http://www.qld.equestrian.org.au/dressage/brisbane-CDI>

CDI competition draws for Friday's competition will take place on Thursday September 17th immediately following the Horse Fitness Inspection, then each afternoon before the day of the scheduled competition.

Draws will be continually updated as scratchings are received.

A **final revised** draw may be necessary the day before each competition to allow for withdrawals. The starting order will not alter and a move up system will apply. **The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the evening before the competition.** All changes will be posted on the event Facebook page and website. We will endeavour to keep changes to a minimum.

DECLARATION OF STARTERS (CDI3* GP, CDI-Ch, CDI-P, CDI-J, CDI-Y & CDI-U25)

Refer FEI Dressage Rules, Art 416

CDI3* GP, CDI-Ch, CDI-P, CDI-J, CDI-Y & CDI-U25: Declaration of starters: must be done by midday for the following day's competitions. Riders who have not declared by midday will be considered as starters for the competitions entered at the closing date of entries. Declarations can be made at the Event Office.

WITHDRAWALS/SCRATCHINGS:

- National Competitions Refunds will be processed as per the 2026 Saddliffiter Brisbane CDI Schedule and EA National Dressage Rule 4.3.
- CDI riders need to remember that withdrawals without approval of the Ground Jury may result in FEI sanctions.

FREESTYLES & GRAND PRIX SPECIAL

Grand Prix CDI Special & Freestyle – all horses in the Grand Prix CDI who gain a score of 60% or more will be eligible for the Grand Prix CDI Special & Freestyle (if entered).

CDI-J Freestyle – all horses from the CDI Junior Rider Individual competition who gain a minimum score of 60% are eligible for the CDI-J Freestyle.

CDI-Y Freestyle – all horses from the CDI Young Rider Individual competition who gain a minimum score of 60% are eligible for the CDI-Y Freestyle.

CDI-U25 Freestyle – all horses from the CDI Under 25 Grand Prix competition who gain a minimum score of 60% are eligible for the CDI-U25 Freestyle.

CDN Grand Prix Special & Freestyle – all horses from the CDN Grand Prix who gain a score of 60% or more will be eligible to compete in the CDN Grand Prix Special & CDN Grand Prix Freestyle if nominated. Combinations who do not meet the 60% may still participate in the freestyle but will not be scored or eligible for prizes.

FEI Intermediate A/B Level Freestyle – all combinations in the Intermediate A or B who gain a score of 60% or more will be eligible for the FEI Intermediate A/B Level Freestyle. Combinations who do not meet the 60% may still participate in the freestyle but will not be scored or eligible for prizes.

Intermediate Freestyle – all combinations in the Intermediate 1 or Prix St Georges who gain a score of 60% or more are eligible if nominated. The top 12-15 combinations will be offered a ride. Where time permits, combinations who do not meet the 60% may still participate in the freestyle but will not be scored or eligible for prizes.

Advanced Freestyle – all combinations that have entered the Advanced Freestyle have been accepted to compete.

Freestyle Music – **CAN ONLY BE ACCEPTED VIA A LINK THAT HAS BEEN SENT BY TEXT TO ALL COMPETITORS.**

Instructions to upload music will be sent via text. Please have a back-up copy available. Please note, this is an automated system that will continue to send you text message reminders to upload your music, so please be on the lookout for this. Uploads must be received no later than Wednesday September 16th.

Freestyle Practice times:

No times have been set for music testing other than for the CDI3* Grand Prix. We will be available for checking music prior to the event on Thursday September 17th between 6pm and 7pm. If you want to listen to your music come to the commentators box between these times and we will check your music is correct and working.

CDI3* GP Freestyle competitor's ridden music tests will be held in the Indoor arena on Sat morning from 6.30am to 7.30am. Please notify the office before 6pm Friday if you would like to practice your test to music and a time will be allocated.

VETERINARY MATTERS

It is compulsory for all Competitors to fill out and sign a QSEC Horse Health Declaration on arrival at the event. It is a venue requirement that Horse health declarations are to be completed on arrival to QSEC, not days in advance. The form can be downloaded here:

If you are stabling at the venue, you must hand your completed form to the Stable Manager or show her the tick from your online form upon arrival at the venue. If you are competing at the Outdoor Arenas (Barr Oval), or are parking at the Outdoor Arena Complex, you must hand your completed form to Gear Check before you ride.

Riders at all levels must have their horse's **EA papers** available for inspection if requested. EA and FEI **Swabbing** will take place. **Penalty fines** will be imposed for those who do not have their horse papers available at the event.

Competitors are to pay for any veterinary treatment and supplies provided by Treating Vets during the event.

If you need to call a vet to attend to your horse while at the event, the Organising Committee **MUST** be notified.

EQUINE THERAPISTS & SUPPORTIVE THERAPIES

The FEI Veterinarian Delegate must approve all types of supportive therapies. This applies to all competitors, not just those entered in the CDI events.

Please be advised that any supportive therapies or therapists you intend to use from the time your horse arrives at the event venue until after departure from the venue must be notified to the Organising Committee and/or the Chief Steward before treatment takes place. This includes therapies provided by veterinarians, physiotherapists, chiropractors, massage therapists or other equine practitioners.

Riders are responsible for ensuring that all treatments and supportive therapies comply with the **FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VI – Supportive Therapies**. In particular, the following therapies are prohibited:

- Class IV laser therapy
- Electroacupuncture

- Moxibustion
- Cryotherapy
- Extracorporeal shockwave therapy (ESWT)

Please note that cryotherapy and ESWT are prohibited both **at the event** and **during the five days prior to the event**.

Kinesiology taping may only be used within the stable area. It must not be used outside the stable area, including while the horse is being ridden, exercised or competed.

These requirements are set out in **Article 1062 to 1065 – Prohibited Supportive Therapies of the 2026 FEI Veterinary Regulations**. The complete regulations can be accessed at <https://inside.fei.org/content/fei-veterinary-regulations-2026>

Please ensure that your support team and any therapists attending the event on your behalf are aware of these requirements as **the rider risks elimination**. If you are uncertain whether a proposed treatment or device is permitted, please contact the Organising Committee or Chief Steward **before it is used**.

STALLIONS

All stallion riders, grooms and owners must be aware of and abide by, the EA Stallion Safe Practice Rules and Regulations Policy, effective 1 July, 2018 (reviewed 2021).

Stallions must not be left unattended anywhere other than in a stable at this event.

ARENA FAMILIARISATION

An arena familiarisation timetable will be posted on the CDI website. From Thursday 17th September use of the indoor warm up arena and arena familiarisation for the indoor arenas are only for those horse & rider combinations competing in the indoor arenas. Helmets are recommended for anyone leading a horse for arena familiarisation.

LUNGING

Lunging may only occur in the designated lunging yards between the stables and indoor complex or at OAC. Preference for lunge areas must be given to riders about to compete.

WARM UP ARENA

Other than the times outlined in the Arena Familiarisation & Training Timetable, the Indoor warm up arena will only be open to riders warming up for a competition or for the fitness inspection. Only Riders who are within 60 minutes of their competition time will be permitted in the indoor warm up. The warm up area at the Outdoor Arena Complex is available for exercise to all riders during competition times. Horses must not be exercised anywhere other than the designated arenas except when being ridden to and from the arenas.

INDOOR ARENA 2

Due to space constraints, if you are competing in Indoor Arena 2, you will need to enter the arena and start your test from inside the arena once the judge has rung the bell. Riders may enter the arena once the rider before them has exited the arena and are permitted to **trot or canter around the outside track within the arena** prior to the judge ringing the bell. Once the judge has rung the bell the rider will have 45 seconds to commence their test.

Other than Accredited Photographers and event officials no one may be in the lane way between the warm up and Indoor Arena Two.

OUTDOOR ARENAS

Riders will be required to start their tests from within the arenas for all events held in the outdoor arenas. **Riding around the outside of of these arenas is not permitted.** Riders may enter the arena once the rider before them has exited the arena and are permitted to **trot or canter around the outside track within the arena** prior to the judge ringing the bell. Once the judge has rung the bell the rider will have 45 seconds to commence their test.

ARENAS DRAG TIMES

Arenas, including the indoor warm-up, will be closed periodically throughout the day for dragging and maintenance. **Drag times are noted on the draw and in the arena familiarisation plan.**

CALLERS

Riders are reminded that as this is a State Championship event NO CALLERS will be permitted unless stated on the rider's EA Exemption Card.

GEAR CHECK

Gear check will take place after tests for ALL competitions.

WHIPS & GEAR

FEI/EA rules regarding approved gear apply everywhere on the event grounds from the time arrival at the grounds. Please take particular note of whip, head gear and Horse Identification Number rules. **Untagged helmets must be brought to a steward for tagging before being used at the event.**

Whips CDI and FEI Competitions: As this event is a State Championship, it is not permitted to carry a whip of any kind while in the arena for FEI competitions. Whips are also not permitted in the CDI competitions including CDI-Ch, CDI-P and CDI-J

Allocated Horse Identification as per the draws must be worn whenever the horse is out of the stable including leading, grazing or under saddle at any time. Please refer to rule 4.8.5 regarding Horse Identification Number specifications. For stallion ID see Dressage Rules 4.8.5d, e & f.

Competitors grazing horses must take extreme care and have horses under full control at all times. If grazing horses appear to be upsetting competing horses or horses under saddle, they will be asked to return to the stables. **Please do not graze or lead horses close to the competition arenas when horses are competing.**

EXEMPTION CARDS

Must be received by September 13th 2026

STABLES & CAMPING

ONLY ACCREDITED OFFICIALS, RIDERS, GROOMS AND OWNERS, AS IDENTIFIED BY A WRISTBAND, WILL BE PERMITTED IN THE QSEC STABLE COMPLEX. Riders are permitted one groom pass per horse and one owner pass per horse. Please see Cheryl at the QSEC Stable Office to collect your wristbands. It is the rider's responsibility to ensure owners and grooms get their wristbands.

In line with FEI rules for a CDI, it is compulsory for all CDI 3*, CDIU25, CDIY CDIJ, CDIP and CDICH horses to be stabled on site during this event from Thursday, 17th September until after the horse's last competition.

The QSEC Stable Complex is accessible through Gate 14, 101 Old Gympie Road.

ABSOLUTELY NO DAY PARKING – CAR OR CAR AND FLOAT – IS TO HAPPEN AT THE QSEC STABLE COMPLEX.

Competitor Day Parking: Day parking is not available at the QSEC stable complex. Day parking for Barr Oval is available at the Outdoor Arena Complex, accessible through Gate 15 155 Old Gympie Road. Day parking for the Indoor Complex is available at Stadium Day Float Parking via Tuckeroo Drive (follow the signs).

Car Parking: Spectator and officials car parking is available via Tuckeroo Drive (just follow signs). Vehicles are not allowed in the competition and training areas. **No car parking is permitted at the stable complex.**

Stabling & Camping Allocation: The stabling and camping allocation will be emailed to competitors and posted on the CDI website.

Cheryl Stephen is the Stable Manager during the event. Cheryl will be onsite from Tuesday September 15th from 12pm through to Sunday September 20th.

Please contact Cheryl if you are having transport problems and delayed arrival is expected (see Handy Telephone Numbers page for phone details).

Horse Arrival times are restricted to day light hours only between 6.30am and 6.00pm daily.

The gate will not be unlocked until Cheryl is onsite. If you need to arrive outside this please contact the event committee to arrange alternate arrival and to have your stable unlocked.

Arrival Procedure: Upon entry into the complex you will be greeted by the Stable Manager. Cheryl will take your completed Horse Health Declaration Form from you, note your arrival date, and show you to your camping site and stables.

Departure Procedure: When you are ready to depart the stable complex you must notify the Stable Manager. Cheryl will inspect your stable for cleanliness, lock your stable and note your departure date.

Note: Please bring your own feed and water bins as these are not provided by QSEC. It is also advisable to bring your own stable cleaning tools and wheelbarrow as these are in limited supply at the venue.

Stable Bedding: Your stable will be pre-filled with shavings and for competitors arriving before Wednesday there will be opportunity to access additional onsite shavings on Thursday and Friday. Extra bedding in the form of Hisorb shavings can be ordered from **Feedmania Caboolture** (see Handy Telephone Numbers page).

Stable Cleaning: with your entry you have paid a stable bond. This will be refunded post event if your stable is left clean – clean means that all bedding, feed & urine has been removed from the stable and it has been SWEPT clean (not merely scraped out with a shovel). Any damage to stables as noted by QSEC is payable by competitors.

Stable Cleaning Service: A stable cleaning service is offered for \$30 per stable. Please book and pay for this service with the Stable Manager, Cheryl Stephen.

DAY YARDS

Day yards are available at the Outdoor Arena Complex. These should have been booked with your entries. If you require day yards and have not booked these please call Nominate to arrange your day yard booking. Stallions are not to be left unattended in day yards.

CATERING

Catering will be available during the day from Wednesday to Sunday.

TEST PAPERS

This event uses the Nominate paperless scoring. Test sheets will be emailed to riders after signed off by the judge. Check your junk email if you do not receive your email. If it's still not received email Nominate nominate@nominate.com.au

PRESENTATIONS

Riders are required to be neatly attired in competition clothing for presentations. Presentations in the main will be unmounted and will take place in The Saddliffiter Marquee. **All freestyle presentations will be mounted and take place immediately following completion of the class.** We invite non-riding owners to be present at the prize giving ceremonies.

Thursday All classes 5:30PM
Friday: All classes 6:00PM
Saturday: All classes 5:30PM (except freestyles)
Sunday: Mounted presentations following class completion

Participation in presentations is compulsory as per the event Schedule. Failure to attend presentation or not being appropriately dressed for presentation will result in forfeiture of your prize money or any prizes. If you cannot attend presentation and wish to obtain your rosette then you need to arrange for someone to collect your rosette for you and notify the event director, Anita Barton, before the presentation. It is NOT compulsory to be mounted for mounted presentations.

Prize money will be deposited into your nominated bank account within 14 working days of the event.

CHAMPIONSHIPS AND SPECIAL AWARDS

AOR and Open EA Level Championships will be decided from both tests as per rule 3.19i

AOR Small Tour and Medium Tour Championships will be decided from both tests (Prix St Georges/Intermediate I; Intermediate A/Intermediate B) as per rule 3.19i

The AOR CDN Grand Prix Award will be decided from the CDN Intermediate II and CDN Grand Prix as per rule 3.19i

Cavaleira Big Tour award: highest aggregate placing points gained over the CDI Grand Prix, CDI Grand Prix Special & CDI Grand Prix Freestyle *with jackpot prize of \$2,500 for the winner donated by Dressage Queensland;*

Equestrian Queensland Medium Tour award: highest aggregate placing points gained over the Intermediate A CDN Open, Intermediate B CDN Open & Inter A/B Freestyle;

Equestrian Queensland Small Tour award: highest aggregate placing points gained over the Prix St Georges CDN Open, Intermediate I CDN Open & the Intermediate I Freestyle CDN *with jackpot prize of \$2,500 for the winner donated by Dressage Queensland;*

Dressage Queensland Regional Rider Award: Awarded to the highest placed regional rider based on their best two placings in any competition from Preliminary to Grand Prix, including the GP Special. Freestyles are not eligible. Riders are to nominate by contacting the event organiser brisbanecdievent@gmail.com if they wish to enter for this award. For a rider on multiple horses, each horse will be a separate entry. In the case of equality, the horse with the highest aggregate percentage is the winner;

WestVETS Best Performed Off the Track Horse: Awarded to the highest placed off the track horse based on its best two placings in any competition from Preliminary to Grand Prix, including the GP Special. Freestyles are not eligible. This award is open to both Thoroughbred and Standardbred ex-racehorses;

INFORMATION SPECIFIC TO CDI 3*, CDI-U25, CDI-Y, CDI-J, CDIP & CDICH

Horses entered in the **CDI-3* Grand Prix, CDI-CH, CDI-P, CDI-J, CDI-Y** and **CDI-U25** are required to take part in the Horse Health Arrival Inspection and the Fitness Inspection (Trot-up):

- **Horse Arrival Examination** (Thursday 17th September, between 11.00am and 1.00pm) in the QSEC stable complex A Block. Riders are to present their horses to the Vet and Steward between these times. Riders must have their **EA Horse Identification Document (CDI-CH, CDI-P, CDI-J, CDI-Y, CDI-U25)** or **FEI Passport** or EA ID Document and FEI Recognition Card (**CDI-3* GP**) with them to hand to officials at this time.
- **Fitness Inspection (Trot-up)** – Thursday, 17th September, in the area adjacent to Indoor Arena 2. Time and order of trot-up will be posted on the Brisbane CDI website.
- **FEI Riders Briefing** will take place in the Ringside Seating Area at 5.15pm Thursday, 17th September.

FEI registration: All horses and riders taking part in the CDI competitions must be registered on the FEI database. If your registration and papers are not in order you will not be entered into the FEI system and therefore not able to start at the event.

CDI competitors need to be aware that ALL Vets attending horses in the CDI competitions must hold an FEI Recognition Card.

Horse Health Requirements: ALL Horses competing at ALL FEI Events must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI HorseApp https://inside.fei.org/hub/it-services/mobile-apps/%20fei_horseapp.

Competitors, grooms and owners all need to be aware of the Horse Health Requirements. WELFARE OF THE HORSE – FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
