# For Your Information

#### **BLUE CARDS**

It is a requirement of EQ that all officials, coaches and sports committee members are to hold a current Blue Card. The purpose of the blue card system is to contribute to the creation of safe and supportive environments for children and young people when receiving services and participating in activities which are essential to their development and wellbeing, such as child care, education, sport, and cultural activities.

Key benefits:

•the past is risk managed though the initial assessment, which determines a person's eligibility to work with children, based on known police or disciplinary information

•the present is risk managed through police information of all blue card or exemption card holders, which is continuously monitored so any changes are actioned appropriately, and

• the future is risk managed by service providers, who are required to implement child and youth risk management strategies and review them annually.

All Blue Card forms and documents can be found on the Blue Card Website.

NOTE: When applying for a Blue Card, if you are not physically able to come into the EQ Office with your original ID documents, then you will need to complete an 'Identification Verification by Prescribed Person' form, along with your Blue card application/renewal. #### **RULE BOOKS**

With a new year comes update to the rule book.

FEI events (CIC, CCI) are run under the FEI rule book which can be found <u>here</u>.

CNC and CCN are run under the national rules. When the National Rules are updated it will be available <u>here</u>. Until then events will be run under the 2014 rule book, available from the same place.

#### **ELECTRONIC NOTICE BOARD**

This year clubs and officials will be able to use another form of communication with riders at most events.

An Electronic Notice Board will be in use on the Live Scoring page for the events and will feature information for the riders and spectators.

#### MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS

If you wish to compete this year and enjoy all the other benefits that come with being an EA member you must make sure your membership for you AND your horse (for EvA95 and above) is current. To renew your membership click <u>here</u>. This also applies to those wishing to compete in FEI classes, remember to renew your FEI registration.

#### **PIC NUMBERS**

Just a reminder, it is now a legal requirement for all horses owners to register their property with Biosecurity Queensland as fines do apply.

#### RANDOM TEAMS

With the goal of increasing team spirit and friendship within our sport, Eventing Queensland is trialling a new initiative at the Tamborine event in February, and then to follow on at all Queensland events.

At the close of entries one horse for EVERY rider entered in competitive class (no CT or come and Try) will be placed on a team. To be fair riders with multiple rides will have one horse randomly selected to be on a team. Where possible each team will have an Eventing Queensland Squad Rider or experienced eventer to give those less experienced competitors another point of contact should they be unsure of anything.

Each team will consist of three or four riders, randomly selected by computer. At the end of the event the three lowest penalties of the team riders will be tallied and the team with the lowest penalties will be declared the winner. A team of three is competitive and may beat a team of four. Riders are encouraged to seek out and support the other members of their team throughout the event.

An entry fee will not be charged to be part of a team but each member of the winning team will receive \$25 sponsored by Eventing Queensland.

The Hanging Cheek snaffle, Straight Bar Snaffle and Snaffle with rotating mouthpiece are now allowed.

#### ANNEX A DRESSAGE - ANNEXES

#### **1** Permitted Bits for the Dressage Test

The Eventing Rules are lined up with the Dressage Rules exclusively and only exceptions are referred as follows: a) Young Horses bitting requirements of Dressage do not apply to Eventing

b) Allowance is made for sheepskin disc for the Mexican noseband and use of breastplate

Please note the following:

c) Bits covered in leather are no longer allowed

d) Wavy plastic bits are not allowed

e) Lunging reins only approved if on triangle rein (Dressage Rules therefore the lungy-bungie is no longer allowed)

**Note**: A review of the Cross Country bits will be made during 2015 for implementation in 2017

The illustrations of allowed bits can now be found in the FEI Dressage Rules

Article 428 pages 40 – 46

<u>A couple of extra points to now note in the Dressage Rules</u> <u>Dress -</u> Article 427.2 There are a number of riders now wearing coloured helmets in the dressage phase which would not adhere to "Black or same colour as the coat"

Riders need to be aware of this.

#### Saddlery

Article 428 - Minimum diameter of snaffle bits, this will now apply to Eventing.

Australia has been invited to send a Senior and Junior eventing team to compete in the Oceania Team Championships at Taupo, NZL 15-17 May 2015. EA will be sending a team for both Seniors and Young Riders, complimented by a Chef d'Equipe, a coach and a vet to accompany the team for the event.

Applications are now open for senior combinations qualified at CCI3\* or above, Australia will be sending a team of 4 riders and horses plus 2 non-travelling reserves. For more information and to apply click <u>HERE</u>

#### CHANGES TO FEI AND NATIONAL EVENTING RULES for 2015

An updated Medical Information procedure has now been introduced which can be summarised in two main steps: 1-abandon of the current practice of armbands imposed on all athletes to be verified by Chief Medical Officers ("CMOs") at Events, and

2-make athletes with a significant medical condition responsible for carrying relevant and valid information on their person

#### From 1 January 2015 at all FEI and National Eventing competition the following will apply:

Article 523.1 of 2015 Eventing Rules (updated after the General Assembly) states:

Medical information

To ensure that vital information is available to first aid or medical personnel in case of emergency, athletes must comply with the following:

a)Providing a valid contact information is mandatory for all Athletes.

The telephone number of the accompanying persons/nextof-kin must be provided to the event secretariat upon arrival (OC and medical officer to ensure all information has been received before the Cross Country).

b)Declaration of medical condition

Athletes with medical conditions that may be relevant in the case of a medical emergency are **responsible**, at every Event when riding, for wearing a medical data carrier\* from a system provider able to communicate information at least in English. Alternatively (and at the minimum) a medical armband of good quality can be used. Athletes who choose to wear an armband should download and fill in the form available for this purpose on the FEI's website.

\* Medical data carrier (also called "medical identification tag"): small emblem or tag worn on a bracelet, neck chain, or on the clothing, intended to alert paramedics/physicians/ first responders that the wearer has an important medical condition.

Conditions that are relevant include recent head injury, serious past injuries/surgery, chronic health problems such as diabetes, long-term medications and allergies. If in doubt, the athlete should discuss this with his own treating physician.

The updated Athlete Medical Declaration form will be available on the FEI website under

Please make sure you complete the next-of-kin information when you enter the competition via the Nominate website. This will assist the committee organising the event to supply the correct information to Medical Officers in case they need it when treating you during the event. If this information is missing on your entry, it could risk you being eligible to compete.

#### WWW.NOMINATE.COM.AU

Nominate have entered into a partnership with EA, and they are the preferred online entries service.

The EA database is now linked to Nominate which means when nominating for an event, Nominate will be able to instantly check if the rider and horse have used the correct membership numbers and if the membership is current. Nominate will let the rider move forward if a number isn't correct, but they are warned that their number doesn't match their name. Nominate will also warn you if your membership is not current. Competitors are never stopped from entering, as technically within the rules, they have until the start of the competition to pay the membership fees and advise correct member numbers.

The other new addition to Nominate is that if the rider is also the owner of the horse, they will be able to select their horses from a drop down box on the class entry page and their horses numbers will autofill. Nominate has had feedback from riders that they are absolutely loving this addition! Horse EA numbers are probably the most mistake ridden area of the entry process, so hopefully this will assist. Riders can still add in other horses that they aren't the owner of, as they normally would.

#### LIFE AFTER RACING

Foaled in 1991, Jack commenced his racing career as a two-year-old in Tasmania. In 1995, after 31 starts and earnings of almost \$7,000 he was retired from racing and sold to a young girl and her family who brought him to Queensland.

By 2001 the pair had progressed through the levels and claim 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the CIC1\*J at the Australian One Day Event Championships. This event was held in Sydney in the wake of the Olympic, and standing at only 15.1 hands the little grey machine added only 8.8 time faults to his dressage score to finish on 63.3 faults.

Two owners later Jack was back eventing with Travis Templar, the pair enjoyed many successes including a 1\* win at Maryborough. Soon after Jack's career almost came to an end after an altercation with a stallion left him with extensive injuries.

But while Jack recovered extremely well Travis knew the extent of his injuries would eventually catch up with him. The decision was made in 2006 to find him another home, one where he would be looked after and not exposed to the pressures of high level eventing.

Jack's new owner was a young girl who returned him to Pony Club competitions, and by the end of 2009 the pair were competing in Showjumping to 80cm and Novice dressage scoring up to 78%. Jack never returned to competitive eventing but the pair happily trained over pre-novice fences and were often used as a lead horse to teach younger horses and riders through water.

Jack's latter career has seen him competing in dressage competitions and hack shows where he always comes home with a reward.

At the ripe old age of 23 Jack is still enjoying life and after another injury, is due to return to work in March which he is really looking forward too. After all for a horse like this the word 'retirement' is not in the dictionary.

#### SPORTS STAR OF THE YEAR – Kirsty Douglas and HORSE OF THE YEAR – Cushavon Crackerjack

Kirsty Douglas and 10yo Irish Sport Horse, Cushavon Crackerjack won the Horseland CCI2\* class at the 2014 Australian International 3 Day Event.

An elegant performance from the stunning combination placed them in fifth heading into the crosscountry where their fitness and boldness shone allowing them to climb the leaderboard to third heading into the final day. With the pressure on, Kirsty and 'Pudding' showcased their accuracy and athleticism to jump one of the few clear rounds of the day and clinch the big win.

In 2012, Kirsty and her husband Anthony took Pudding to Prue and Craig Barrett for intensive training culminating in a third place in the two star class at the Adelaide event that year. 2013 saw the training continue allowing the combination to move up to 3\* and qualify for 4\*.

In March of 2014 all plans were put on hold when an eye injury to Pudding saw the pair's training schedule swapped for extensive veterinary treatments. It wasn't until July that the pair returned to competition with a second place at the Inaugural One Day Event at the Noosa Equestrian Centre competing at 1\*. The pair then followed this performance up with 5 2\* starts, including three first places, one second place, and one fifth place. Proving they were yet again a force to be reckoned with.

Kirsty now plans to stay in Queensland with Anthony and Pudding, and with the help of the Barrett's and coach Michelle Lang-McMahon return to Adelaide in 2015 to take on 4\* track and further cement her place amongst Australia's best.

Preparation is everything for Kirsty, including working with Pudding for weeks ensuring he is ready to compete at the highest level. An important part of the combinations preparation is fitness training. In Eventing, fitness doesn't just affect time faults but makes all the difference in horse welfare and has a huge impact on the safety of the horse and rider. It is for this reason that Kirsty is passionate about the fitness factor of eventing and is always willing to impart her knowledge and experience of fitness training to others.

Kirsty's and Anthony's support of eventing in Queensland is best observed at the grass roots, literally. They are often seen working tirelessly to make sure a competition area is mown and ready for a competition. Lending a hand when it is needed the most.

With her approachable nature and willingness to share her experiences and knowledge, Kirsty is well known and respected by Queensland Eventers and clubs. This event was Queensland only long format CCI International Event, and adds another opportunity for the general public to view the elite of the sport displaying their skills to the top level of competition.

## <u>Ewan Kellett comes to the</u> <u>Darling Downs</u>

Toowoomba Jump Club and Warwick Horse Trials were very fortunate to host Ewan Kellett in early December. Both clubs have engaged Ewan to assist them to maximise the rider /horse friendliness of their courses. Warwick is hoping to engage Ewan further to design more of their course for their next ODE. Toowoomba Jump Club will continue to use their own CD and CB but with modifications following discussions and course walks with Ewan .

Kathy Humphrey and Richard King represented both their clubs in the on course discussions and subsequent drawings and designs. Ewan likes a course to always reward the thinking and brave horse and rider and to make the questions to the horse clear and



fair. He is also very particular about the flow of a course and likes the horse to be heading towards its next jump fairly soon after the current jump without too much yanking or turning. He gave us good parameters for every grade but the designs we worked most on were the star classes, as Ewan felt the lower classes were well served at both clubs.

Both clubs are trying to develop different and new areas of their courses. Warwick is hoping to develop new tracks where the ground is more forgiving and also to develop tracks that can be well maintained and soft. Toowoomba is trying to get more space and room for the star classes with a new start for them and a new paddock for 2 star after the picnic tables. They are also building a new 2 star fence at the sunken road complex. Both clubs realise that it will take some time to finalise new tracks and jumps. Toowoomba should have the new start track and 2 star paddock ready by next October. However their new star jumps on the existing tracks will be ready by April next year. Warwick has a much bigger task ahead and Richard says theirs is a steady long term project with some new development ready by next March, but the remainder being a long term, several year project.
