Conditions of Entry

- All horses must be EA Full Life Registered.
- All riders must be current EQ Competitor Junior Members.
- All schools must be currently registered as EQ School Affiliates.
- The OC reserves the right to accept and/or reject entries, cancel/divide any class or alter the schedule.
- It is an expectation that the horse is entered in the highest level qualified.
- A rider can enter a maximum of two horses in each discipline providing that each horse/rider combination is qualified.
- The organising committee will endeavour to structure the event and draws such that riders may compete in two disciplines on the same day, but riders must understand that, if this is not possible, they may have to prioritise one discipline over the other.

Starts per day:

- At all times when considering participating in multiple disciplines and/or multiple classes, horse and rider welfare must be paramount.
- **No horse is to undertake more than three competitive starts per day across disciplines.**
- **Each horse may enter a maximum of four (4) classes however, each rider may enter a maximum of six (6). For scheduling reasons, riders may have to make a choice between classes if there is a clash.**

(3 dressage tests = 3 starts) |

| Show Jumping | Providing qualifying criteria met, competitors may enter two horses in a maximum of two show jumping classes per horse. For riders entering two classes on a horse, these classes must be at consecutive heights. | May compete in two consecutive heights only per day (each height article number = 1 start). |
| Combined Training | CT participants may nominate a maximum of two (2) horses, with each horse only being entered in one (1) class provided qualifying criteria are met for each horse. The entries may be in the same or different classes. | May compete in one level only. (Dressage phase = 1 start, Jumping phase = 1 start). |
| Vaulting | Each horse must not be used for more than 18 points (refer to the National Vaulting Rules). | |

Biosecurity

Please practise good biosecurity before, during and after going to an event. For information in relation to travel permits & spraying please contact your local Department of Primary Industries. It is a requirement for entry to this event that all competitors provide a current Horse Health Declaration (HHD) form for each horse entering the showgrounds.

An EQ HHD form is required upon check in every time a horse is brought onto the grounds. You must submit your HHD to the IQ office on arrival.

The EQ HHD online form can be found [HERE](#).

A wrist band will be issued to all riders, on receipt of the Horse Health Declaration form at the IQ Office.

Riders must wear their wrist band to allow the rider to pass through gear check during this event. NO ARMBAND = NO RIDE

- Please do not bring sick horse/s to this venue.
- Horses that become sick during the event must be reported straight away to the Biosecurity Officer.
- Horses, when not being ridden, must be kept in allocated stables or yards.
- Horses must NOT enter the camping areas.
- Do not dump manure from trucks/trailers anywhere other than the allocated stable waste points.
- Leave stables, camp areas and arenas clean and tidy.
- Riders must ensure that their stable has the owner's name, contact details and horse name displayed in case of emergencies. You must complete and print the stable plate template.

Horse Health Declaration (HHD) Form



Horses

- Only those horses/ponies entered into the competition are permitted on the grounds. Companion horses/ponies or other companion animals are not permitted on the grounds.
- Horses are **NOT** to be ridden by anyone other than the rider nominated on the draw at events from midday on the day prior to the event commencing until conclusion of the final discipline on the last day of the event. This includes at any mounted presentations. This ruling applies even if a horse has completed its competitions at an event.
- Vaulting is not considered as a horse being ridden.
- The exception to this ruling is that a horse can be ridden by more than one sibling rider at an event in different disciplines and the horse does not compete in more than the maximum number of tests/sections allowed in the day by EA discipline rules (eg, no more than 2 dressage tests in one day).

Competition Schedule

The competition times in the published schedule are correct at the time of publication and should be taken as a guide for competitors only. The final schedule draw will be posted on the morning of each competition day and available on the event Stack Team App.

Rings may run early, please be attentive to announcements on the day. Riders may be required to ride earlier.

Riders who are late, without prior approval from the OC (e.g. let the office know if you are held up in another ring), may be excluded from the class.

Competition Numbers

Numbers will be allocated and supplied on the draws. Riders MUST have their allocated numbers attached to the saddlecloth or bridle and displayed on both sides of the horse. You must also have your numbers on your halter when out of the stables (e.g. a key tag with the numbers on both sides).

Presentations

- Presentations are unmounted and will be held in the afternoons on a daily basis.
- Full competition dress is required including helmet.
- It is requirement that all riders attend presentations on the days that they compete regardless of whether the rider is a place getter or not.
- Failure to attend the presentation that the rider has competed in, will result in the forfeiting of placing and prizes and selection on Queensland Team.
- Should you require an early departure, written communication must be submitted to the respective organising committee for assessment and approval. If accepted, you will be allowed to leave without penalty.
- In the case of emergencies, requests for exemption are to be made directly to the organising committee for approval.

Helper Jobs / SignUp

- The State Championships event relies on volunteers to assist in the running of the competition.
- It is compulsory for each rider to nominate a helper for the event via the SignUp online platform that will be emailed through prior to the event.
- Each rider is required to sign up for 1 job per class entry - maximum of 3 jobs per family.
- It is the responsibility of the rider and their support people to check volunteer rosters and to complete the tasks allocated.
- If for any reason a helper role cannot be completed i.e. due to the rider withdrawing from the competition (scratching/non-attendance), the rider must ensure a substitute helper is found and the OC is informed.
- Failure to complete a helper role may result in disqualification from that event, any placings/prizes and qualifying results may be forfeited.
- OCs have the right to refuse entries from participants who repeatedly do not fulfil helper requirements.

Marshalling / Gear Check

- The designated Marshalling/Gear Check point is compulsory for all participants to check in at least 15 minutes prior to their entry in each phase of every class. Competitors may not compete until they have been cleared through marshalling.
- Dressage - official gear check to be conducted after test. Failure to present will result in elimination. Note: No person may approach or touch the horse and rider from arena to gear check. A pre gear check prior to ride is advised to encourage correct equipment to reduce gear/equipment elimination.

Saddlery & Equipment

All equipment should comply with the [2026 IO Handbook](#) and [EA rules](#) for individual disciplines. This is the responsibility of the participant and/or parents to ensure that saddlery and equipment is in good repair, meets the relevant safety standards and is fitted appropriately.

Substitutions

On approval from the IQ committee, riders may substitute an alternative qualified horse combination up until the start of competition for the day providing details of the horse registration is presented to the organising committee. No rider may be substituted for another rider.

Disputes

We remind riders that IQ events are organised and conducted by volunteers. These people invest many hours of their own time and make every effort to manage events in a professional manner. If errors occur, we request patience while endeavoring to correct any problems. Any abuse, either by rider, parent or members of the rider's entourage, at an IQ event will not be tolerated and may be subject to disciplinary processes as per EA Rules and Regulations.

No competitors or parents are to directly approach any judges, stewards, course designers or any other officials or volunteers with disputes, complaints or queries at penalty of disqualification.

Any objections or disputes at events MUST be made to the TD within thirty (30) minutes of the event giving rise to the objection. For information on protests and appeals refer to the [EA General Regulations](#) and [EA sport rules](#) for the relevant discipline.

Code of Conduct

It is expected that Athletes and their support teams will adhere to the rules of the competitions in which they participate and that they will show respect for other competitors, their horses, officials, judges and administrators in their actions and their words. The conduct of members of the sport overall is controlled by the EA Member Protection Policy. The EA Codes of Conduct and Safeguarding Children & Young People Policy must be adhered to by all competitors and their parents/guardians, during any IQ activity. Any abuse, either by a rider, parent or members of the rider's entourage at any IQ event will not be tolerated and may be subject to disciplinary action. Refer to the EA Interschool Rules and EA website for Codes of Conduct, protection policies and information regarding disciplinary procedures and yellow cards. Breaches of these general conduct practices may result in disqualification from the competition and depending on the severity of the offence, the athlete and/or their associates may face disciplinary action.

Horse Welfare

Refer to the EA General Regulations for all Horse Welfare rules and regulations. For the maximum starts per day that apply refer to the conditions of entry section on page 10.

Horse abuse in any form will not be tolerated. If horse abuse is determined the athlete will be disqualified from the competition. The sighting of blood on the horse during a test, whether wet or dry, will entail elimination and/or investigation by the Ground Jury/Technical Delegate based upon the Sport Rules of the discipline involved.

Soundness

The Judges are required to satisfy themselves regarding soundness of all horses and therefore have the authority to stop an unsound horse during the competition or from competing – any disputes in this area will be considered by the ground jury on the day and/or the Technical Delegate. For Dressage there is no appeal against this decision.

Horse Medication Control / Swabbing

Horses and ponies ridden in EA competition must not compete under the influence of prohibited medications. The FEI defines what a prohibited substance is. The EA Anti-Doping and Medication Control By-Laws describe requirements for the drug testing of horses and ponies. These can be found in the EA National Medication Control System & Swabbing Policy. Participants should note that swabbing may occur at any event. Further information is available on the following links - Medication Control and Clean Sport.

Venue Information

- No motor bikes, four-wheelers, electric scooters, trikes and other vehicles are to be used at Toowoomba Showgrounds, other than by the OC
- Bikes/Scooters - Electric Scooters are not allowed, bikes must be parked in designated areas.
- Lunging - Lunging is to only occur in the designated lunging area. No lunging anywhere else (except for Vaulting Horses).
- Camping and Stables - Camping and parking of vehicles are allowed in designated areas only. Horse preparation, working areas and stables and yards are separate from the areas designated for parking and camping. Horses are not permitted in camping and parking areas. Allocated stable/s cannot be changed.
- Dogs - Dogs MUST be leashed and under the control of the owner/handler at all times. The owner of any dog on the ground accepts the responsibility of the consequent action caused by the dog. All dogs must be restrained at all times. Please ensure that dog droppings are picked up and disposed of appropriately. No dogs in Equestrian areas.
- Glass - No glass is permitted around grounds, camping areas exempted.
- Smoking—Smoking only in designated areas.
- Camp Fires - Braziers are allowed but must be contained and off the ground depending on the weather conditions (information can be provided by Toowoomba Showgrounds).
- Children - Parents/carers are responsible for their children at all times.
- Please be respectful of the grounds – clean up after yourself & your horse.

Fitton HorseInsure Dressage

- The Dressage competition is run in accordance with the current [EA National Dressage Rules](#) and the [2026 IQ Handbook](#).
- Balloting will be undertaken if entry numbers exceed class size limits.
- If a dressage class is balloted, each rider's two (2) highest submitted percentages will be combined and averaged.
- Each rider's averaged scores will then be balloted, and the top 35 riders will be offered a position to ride in the class.

All Abilities riders at the time of nomination must send copies of their Exemption Card or classification to the IQ Dressage Convenor (email: interschoolqld.dressage@gmail.com) prior to acceptance of the nomination. - Callers will be not be allowed for any classes.
- Compulsory Gear Check is required after the riding of each test.

- Riders are only permitted to compete in one class per horse. A maximum of two horses may be entered per rider. The same horse and rider combination must complete both phases of the competition. Elimination from one phase involves elimination from the class.
- Callers are permitted up to and including CT95 for the dressage phase (excluding CT1*).
- Whips no longer than 120cm including lash, or a crop no longer than 75cm and not weighted at the end, are only allowed for the dressage phase for CT80 classes and below.
- Whips of no more than 75cm not weighted are allowed in the jumping phase at all levels.
- Body protectors are strongly recommended for jumping phase.
