DETAILS OF COMPETITIONS

Entries, and the competition program, may be limited and revised at the discretion of the OC. For this event, riders must choose to ride in either the Open competitions **or** AAOR competitions. Ponies riders must indicate at the time of entry if they are an AAOR and will be eligible for AAOR prizes. Riders may not ride in a combination of Open/AAOR competitions. Para riders may enter Para competitions **or** Open **or** AAOR competitions.

COMPETITIONS 1 to 33 (AAOR, Pony and Open Preliminary to Grand Prix)

Limit on entry numbers: 35 Horses per competition; a reserve list will be created if entries exceed 35. **Champions** to be decided on point system of both competitions at each level. **(Rule 3.19)**

COMPETITIONS 34 to 36: Grand Prix Special

The Grand Prix Special is limited to the best 15 combinations that gain at least 60% in the Grand Prix.

COMPETITION 37: Advanced Freestyle competition

Open to horse/riders who have qualified/been accepted for the Advanced championship.

COMPETITION 38: Intermediate Freestyle to Music

Open to horse/riders who have qualified/been accepted for the AAOR, Pony or Open Prix St Georges and/or Intermediate I and earn a minimum score of 58% in either of these tests.

COMPETITION 39: FEI Intermediate A/B Freestyle to Music

Open to horse/riders who have qualified/been accepted for the Intermediate A and B and earn a minimum score of 58% in either of these tests.

COMPETITION 40: Grand Prix Freestyle to Music

Open to Grand Prix combinations who earn a minimum score of 58% in the Grand Prix.

- Scores (percentages) of team members will be added together to determine team scores. The winning team will be the team with the highest total score; the second one, the next highest, etc.
- One combination at each level is required to make up a team of three riders.
- A horse and/or rider may only be represented once in each team. A rider may only compete in one team per competition.
- Refer to **EA Dressage Rule 10.6.1** for details on the requirements for team competitions.

Teams Competition entry fee: Nil

Special Awards:

- Dressage Queensland Regional Rider Award: This award is donated by Dressage Queensland and is designed to encourage riders travelling from regional areas of Queensland. Riders are classed as regional when they reside more than 400kms from the Brisbane CBD. The Regional Rider prize will be awarded to the highest placed regional rider based on their best two placings in any competition from Preliminary to Grand Prix, including the GP Special. Freestyles are not eligible. Riders are to nominate on the entry form if they wish to enter for this award. No entry fee is required. For a rider on multiple horses, each horse will be a separate entry. In the case of equality, the horse with the highest aggregate percentage is the winner.
- Young Rider Awards: Rosettes will be awarded to the highest placed Young Rider in each competition.





CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The Saddlefitter Qld State Dressage Championships 2019 will be conducted in strict accordance with the current edition (including amendments) of:

- EA National Dressage Rules as at 1/7/19 (and subsequent amendments), EA General Regulations;
- Current FEI Statutes, General Regulations; FEI Veterinary Regulations; FEI Dressage Rules.

The EA Dressage Rules and Dressage tests may be downloaded here.

Competitors are advised to be aware of the rules that apply specifically to **State Championships (Rule 10.12)**. The onus is on riders to know the rules under which they compete.

MEMBERSHIP and REGISTRATION

- Horses/ponies must have a current performance card; horses/ponies, owners and riders must be **registered and financial with EA**.
- Horses/ponies must compete under their full registered name. The OC has the right to abbreviate the names of horses/ponies for printing purposes. EA Membership numbers must be shown on the Entry Form.
- All horses/ponies are required to be microchipped as per national rules.

ENTRIES and ELIGIBILITY

- The number of horses per rider per championship may be limited.
- Where 'horses' are referred to in this schedule that also includes reference to ponies.
- All horses must be EA registered.
- No horses may be substituted after the close of entries.
- Horses must exceed 149 cm with shoes or 148cm without shoes.
- Ponies must not exceed 149cm with shoes or 148cm without shoes.
- A current EA approved height certificate must be supplied at the time of entry for all ponies.
- No horse may take part with more than one rider at the event.
- Horses Riders are eligible from the start of the calendar year in which they turn 10 years of age.
- Ponies Riders are eligible from the start of the calendar year in which they turn 8 years of age.
- Horses may compete in two (2) consecutive levels only. For example, Nov/Elem; Adv/PSG etc.
 Each horse entered must have the same rider as nominated on the entry form for all
 competitions.
- Para Equestrian riders may compete in the Para Equestrian tests OR Open Tests OR AAOR
 OR Pony tests, as long as the horse competes in no more than three tests per day. Any Para
 Equestrian rider electing to compete in the EA Open or AAOR or Pony tests will be subject to
 the same qualification criteria as all other competitors. There will be no separate placings/prizes
 for Para Equestrian combinations that may place in Open or AAOR or Pony tests. All Para
 Equestrian riders' FEI PE Master List (copy) must be provided at time of entry as well as a copy
 brought to the event at the time of competition.
- Championship riders must enter the Championship e.g. both competitions at one level, not individual competitions (except for FEI competitions).
- **Competitions 1 to 15** are open to horses that, at close of entries, have gained fewer than the following grading points:
 - **Preliminary/Novice:** fewer than 40 points at Elementary level or above; **Elementary:** fewer than 40 points at Medium level or above; **Medium:** fewer than 40 points at Advanced level or above; **Advanced:** fewer than 30 points in FEI competitions. Horses entered in all **FEI** competitions must have performance at the level entered as outlined in the Dressage Rules (**Rule 4.8.3.2**).
- Official Grading: This will be taken as at the closing date of entries. (Rule 4.8.3.2).
- **Draw:** Competitions will be limited to 35. A reserve list will be issued if oversubscribed.
- The organising committee reserves the right to rank/ballot horses.





 A revised draw may be necessary the day before each competition to allow for withdrawals/scratchings. The starting times for each rider will remain constant as far as possible with any reserve riders being placed in the times of the withdrawn horse. In the event of significant change, the OC reserves the right to alter starting times. The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the day before the competition.

PERFORMANCE

- Score submission will be used for balloting purposes only in the case of competition/class oversubscription. Scores should have been achieved in the 12 months preceding the closing date of entries. i.e. 1st August 2018 to 31st July 2019. Please note performance/s must have been gained in official EA competitive competitions
- One HC (Hors Concours) score is allowed to count as a balloting score at each level entered.
- If Balloting occurs, preference will be given first to those who have <u>submitted</u> Official Competitive EA scores at the time of entry. In the event of oversubscription of a class, **Ranking** (balloting) will be based on the highest percentage at that level as submitted by close of entry.
- The OC reserves the right to accept and/or reject entries.
- The OC reserves the right to allow wildcard entries.

WITHDRAWALS and REFUNDS

- Entry refunds 50% of entry fees (minus the administration fee) will be refunded on receipt of a doctor's or vet's official certificate submitted to: Event Directors, cbz1967@gmail.com, within 7 days of the completion of the event.
- A separate refund must be submitted to QSEC for stable fees see Nominate for QSEC's Terms and Conditions.
- Cancellation If the event and/or competition/s are cancelled, 50% of entry fees will be refunded (minus the administration fee).
- Change of Nomination Riders wishing to change their nomination (after the close of entries) incur an administration fee of \$50.
- Withdrawals (Rule 10.4): No competitor shall withdraw from a competition within 8 hours of the start of the competition without the permission of the Organising Committee. A written statement giving reasons for the withdrawal must be handed to the Event Director prior to the commencement of the competition. Penalty for non-compliance – forfeiture of the entry fees.
- **Scratchings** -. Because of the reserve lists and possible distances to be travelled by reserve list riders, all riders are asked to consider their fellow competitors and notify the **Event Director** as soon as possible of their intention to withdraw. If a rider does not wish to remain on the reserve list, they must scratch from the event or entry fees will not be refunded if a place in the competition is offered but not taken up.

OBJECTIONS and APPEALS

Objections and Appeals: Objections must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$150.00 (Rule 1.5).

SADDLERY and EQUIPMENT

- Bridle numbers (two) <u>must</u> be worn at all times when the horse is outside its stable.
- Whips are not permitted at FEI level in a State Championships. EA levels (Preliminary to Advanced) - whips are permitted but must not exceed 1.2m in its entirety for horses, and 1.0m for ponies (Rule 5.6).
- Hats and head wear: As per current EA rules (Rule 5.2).
- **Sponsorship logos** Riders with privately organised sponsorship may display a logo or logos of their sponsor/s on their saddlecloth. The total area covered by logo/s may not exceed 200 sq. cm. Logo/s may also be shown on the jacket as long as the total area does not exceed 80 sq. cm and must be above the line of the pocket. **(Rule 11.8).**





FREESTYLES

- AAOR and Pony riders may compete in the Freestyle competitions but will not be eligible for Tournament Championships.
- Only the movements up to and included in the current tests at the level being ridden may be shown (Rule 8.5).
- Music must be supplied on a good quality not-scratched CD or USB with any relevant instructions attached in writing. Please clearly mark horse and rider name on CD/USB. We recommend that you have a backup master CD/USB with you.
- Freestyle music must be handed in to the Event Office as soon as possible after your arrival and well before music testing. There will be a timetable for Freestyle music testing
- **Equality of scores**: if two competitors receive the same final score, the one with the highest marks for artistic presentation is the winner.
- **Bond** A bond of \$100 for competitors who nominate to ride in the freestyles is payable at time of nomination. This bond is fully refundable upon completion of your freestyle ride and after the conclusion of the event; or on the receipt of the veterinarian/doctor's certificate, if scratching.
- Declaration of Starters All riders entering any freestyle competition must declare their intention to ride, or not to ride, by 10am Saturday 21st September 2019 at the Event Office. Failure to declare will result in a non-start in the competition and forfeiture of your freestyle bond.
- The timed draw for the Freestyles will be published following the declarations at 10am Saturday.

CAMPING and CATERING

- Camping facilities: Powered and Unpowered sites are available and must be booked at time of entry through the QSEC booking system on Nominate.com.au. There are good shower and toilet facilities with hot and cold water for males and females.

STABLING

- **Cheryl Stephen** is the Stable Manager during the event and will be staying on site from Thursday in the caravan on Site 28 (next to amenities block).
- For any stable or camping enquiries please phone or email stable manager Cheryl Stephen on 3882 0044 up to Wed night 18th September or 0400 767 858 anytime. Email: cherylandtony1@bigpond.com
- Owners/riders who have booked stables for more than one day but are taking their horses home at night must advise the Stable Manager.
- Stable bookings must be made via the QSEC booking system which is a separate entry in Nominate. When choosing your stable, it is essential to ensure that a mare is not placed within two stables next to, or behind, a stallion in all directions. The OC reserves the right to change stabling allocations.
- Yards there will be limited yards available at Barr Oval. These must be booked through the
 Event Director at the time of nomination and cost \$15 per day. No temporary yards of any kind
 are allowed.
- All horses MUST be stabled, except for those combinations competing and parking for the day at Barr Oval.
- **Some bedding** (shavings) is provided and extra may be purchased from the feed supplier, if required.
- All stables must be completely cleaned out on departure. A stable cleaning service will be
 available for a fee of \$25 and must be organised and paid for prior to departure. Contact the
 Stable Manager to organise stable cleaning.
- There are only a limited number of QSEC wheelbarrows and stable rakes provided, so it is advisable to bring your own stable cleaning equipment
- All competitors must complete a "Horse Health Declaration Form" before unloading horses at QSEC a copy of this form can be found here http://www.gsec.com.au/Biosecurity/
- A stable bond will be charged at the time of entry which will be fully refunded provided the stable is left clean, tidy, and undamaged. All stables/yards must be inspected prior to departure by the Stable Manager for a "clean pass" and bond refund.
- Please note: Charges for stable hire at QSEC apply to the use of stables per day, not per night, e.g. from midnight to midnight. If you arrive before midnight and leave at 6am the following day, this is classed as 2 days. Please take this into account when booking stables.
- Fodder: Competitors must supply their own horse feed
- Arrival of Horses: The Stable Manager will be on site from 8am Thursday 19th September 2019 until Sunday 22nd September 2019. Please try and plan your arrival between 8am and 6pm. Exception for day parkers competing at Barr Oval and those who have an early draw.
- SMOKING is not permitted in the stable area!
- QSEC is a glass-free environment!
- Dogs, prams, bicycles, scooters and golf buggies, etc., are not permitted in the immediate stable area/aisles! (Exceptions vehicles used by the Stable Manager, Stewards and venue staff, and mobility devices for PE riders).
- Children must be supervised at all times!
- As defined in the QSEC Terms and Conditions of Hire, damage will be charged to the Event Organiser, which will in turn be charged to the competitor responsible for the stable/yard during the event. Any damage to stables/yards will be charged to the competitor's credit card. The OC suggests you take photos or record details of your stable prior to use.





OTHER/GENERAL INFORMATION

- Callers/commanders Tests may NOT be commanded. PE riders may have callers/commanders (Rule 11.9).
- Random Swabbing will take place at the event. Attention is drawn to FEI Veterinary Rules and the EA Medication Control Policy. Supervision of horses is the sole responsibility of the owner/rider at all times.
- Tests not collected can be posted at a cost of \$2. Envelopes will be available at the location of test collection.
- Lunging is only permitted in the designated areas this will be monitored
- Dogs: Dogs are permitted in QSEC camping grounds <u>ONLY</u> provided they are kept on a lead (maximum length of 1 metre) and under control at all times. Dogs <u>must</u> be kept away from horse activities including the Main Arena/Indoor warm-up, Barr Oval arenas/warmup and shower/toilet/laundry facilities. Any person not adhering to this guideline will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and no refund given. Please ensure that dog droppings are disposed of. Do not bring dangerous dogs to this event. Moreton Bay Regional Council Animal Control conducts random patrols. Dogs found wandering and/or not under effective control may be seized and impounded.
- Exercise and Warm-up Area: Outdoor warm-up areas will be available for use prior to the competition. More information will be contained in the entry confirmation sent to riders. Only horses saddled and being ridden are allowed in the warm up area. Horses may only be lunged in the round yards at the outdoor arenas or stable complex. Horses in halters and/or wearing rugs or being grazed are not permitted in the warm up areas during the period of competition each day.
- Arena Familiarisation: Will be available for all arenas and details will be notified at the time of the draw.
- Vaccinations: We strongly encourage owners to vaccinate against the Hendra Virus. We recommend that horse vaccinations for Strangles and Tetanus are up to date.
- Queensland Tick Requirements: Please contact QLD DAF Call Centre: Ph. (07) 3404 6999 for information (allow 24 hrs notice). A mobile tick inspector may be available for booking to inspect and spray your horse at the QSEC venue. This is at the owner's cost and must be booked in advance. Contact the Stable Manager for details.
- Property Identification Code: It is compulsory to provide a PIC with your entry.

PRIZE SCHEDULE, PRESENTATIONS, CHAMPIONSHIP and TROPHY DETAILS Championship Awards

- To be eligible for a Champion or Reserve Champion award at any level the horse must compete in both competitions at that level and attain at least 60% up to and including Advanced, or 58% in FEI level competitions in both qualifying tests.
- FEI level Competitions: A horse must compete in both PSG and Intermediate I to be eligible for Small Tour Champion; Intermediate A and B for the Medium Tour Championship; Intermediate II and Grand Prix to be eligible for the Big Tour Champion (Grand Prix Special is a separate competition).
- The Organising Committee (OC) reserves the right to offer goods in kind in lieu of prize money. Prize money or goods in kind will be awarded for 1st to 3rd in all competitions; for competitions with 4 to 8 entries prize money or goods in kind will be awarded for 1st to 4th; for competitions with 8 to 10 entries prize money or goods in kind will be awarded 1st to 5th; and for competitions with more than 10 entries prize money or goods in kind will be awarded 1st to 6th.
