Special Awards:

Big Tour award: highest average percentage gained over the CDI Grand Prix, CDI Grand Prix Special & CDI Grand Prix Freestyle – Prize rug for winner, 1st - \$800, 2nd - \$400, 3rd - \$200.

The Saddlefitter Small Tour award: highest average percentage gained over the Prix St Georges CDN, Intermediate I CDN & the Intermediate Freestyle CDN – Prize rug for winner, 1st - \$500, 2nd - \$300, 3rd - \$150.

Highfields Sporthorses Qld Bred Young Dressage Horse 4 YO, 5 YO, 6 YO & 7 YO: awarded to the highest placing Qld bred young dressage horse at each age in the second round of the Qld State Young Dressage Horse Championships. Qld bred is defined as conceived and foaled down in Qld – can be bred by interstate or imported semen.

Conditions of Entry

CDI 3* GP, CDI-J, CDI-Y and CDI-U25 Competitions – will be held in accordance with current FEI Statutes, General Regulations, Veterinary Regulations and Dressage Rules.

CPEDI 3* Competitions - will be held in accordance with current FEI Statutes, General Regulations, Veterinary Regulations and Para Dressage Rules.

National Competitions – will be held in accordance with the current EA National Dressage Rules and EA General Regulations.

MEMBERSHIP & HORSE REGISTRATION

- ALL Horses, owners and riders must be registered and financial with EA or, if from overseas, with their National Federation.
 Horses must compete under their full registered name. The Organising Committee has the right to abbreviate a horse's name for printing purposes.
- Horses must have a current EA Dressage competition licence (performance card).
- CDI 3* GP, CDI-J, CDI-Y, CDI-U25, CPEDI 3*: Riders may participate only under the jurisdiction of the country with which
 they hold their passport.
- . Horses taking part in the CDI 3* GP must have a current FEI Passport or Official FEI recognised EA Identification Document.
- Horses taking part in the CPEDI 3* must have a current FEI Passport or Official FEI recognised EA Identification Document.
- Horses taking part in the CDI-J, CDI-Y, CDI-U25-: FEI Passports are not required, an EA National ID Document or EA Horse
 registration papers are required. Riders must ensure that they have the appropriate documents on arrival. Enquiries to Equestrian
 Australia 02 8762 7777.
- All riders and horses participating in FEI events (CDI 3* GP, CDI-J, CDI-Y, CDI-U25, CPEDI 3*) must be registered on the FEI database. Registrations must be renewed each calendar year (i.e. Jan 1 2019). EA collects the charges on behalf of the FEI. Registration forms are available on the EA web site. www.equestrian.org.au/forms or contact the National Office 02 8762 7777. Please note that this registration is required even if the horse has an FEI Passport or EA National Identification Document. All horses and riders must be registered with the FEI BEFORE competing in any FEI sanctioned events (CDIs) in 2019. From 2017, all horses not currently registered with the FEI, are required to have an EA Passport before applying for FEI registration.

ENTRIES & PERFORMANCE

- Rider Age: CDI 3* is open to riders from the year in which they reach their 16th birthday. CDI-J: Open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 18. CDI-Y: Open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 21. CDI-U25: Open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 25. CPEDI 3* is open to riders from the year in which they reach their 14th birthday.
- National Competitions: entry of horses & ponies is limited to two consecutive levels, e.g. Advanced/Prix St Georges; Prix St Georges/Intermediate I.
- CDI entries: horses may take part in **one test per day** (FEI Dressage Rules, Art. 422) and may not start in a national competition until the day after completing their last international competition.
- National competitions, as per EA current rules.
- Eligibility & Performance
 - All qualifying performances must be from Official Competitive competitions. The qualifying period is 1 June 2018 to 31 May 2019; performances outside of this range may be accepted at the discretion of the OC. Please submit your 3 best performances attained during the qualifying period.
 - o CDI3* Grand Prix: At least two performances of 63% or higher at Grand Prix (not including GP Special or Freestyle)
 - o CDI-J: At least one performance of 60% at Medium level (CDI-J Individual or Team test performances accepted)
 - o CDI-Y: At least one performance of 60% at PSG level (CDI-Y Individual or Team test performances accepted)
 - o CDI-U25: At least two performances of 60% or higher at Intermediate A, Intermediate B, Intermediate II or Grand Prix.
 - o CPEDI 3*: There is **no** performance requirements
 - o Medium, Advanced, Prix St Georges & Intermediate I: At least one performance of 60% at the level entered
 - o Intermediate II, Intermediate A/B: At least one score of 60% at the level entered
 - o Grand Prix CDN: At least two scores of 60% at this level.
 - o Young Horses & Ponies: Please refer to page 8.
 - Saddleworld Novice Club Team Challenge (refer to conditions on Page 9)
 - o Entries will be accepted on merit or at the discretion of the Organising Committee
 - Where required, at least one qualifying score must be obtained by the nominated horse/rider combination. The OC will consider exceptions in special circumstances only.
 - One HC performance is permitted.
- The number of horses or ponies per rider per competition may be limited.
- The Organising Committee reserves the right to allocate 'wildcard entries' at each level in exceptional circumstances for national
 competitions only.
- Horses entered for all competitions (except the Young Pony classes), must have a height at the withers exceeding 149cms
 including shoes.
- Horse/Pony Age: Horses must be at least 6 years of age for CPEDI tests, 7 years of age for PSG, Int I & CDI-Y, for tests above
 Inter I horses must be a minimum of 8 years of age.
- Entry Fees: Refer page 3.
- CDI3* GP riders may enter and ride both the GP Special and the GP Freestyle or they can opt to ride only one. Horses must qualify with a score of 60% in the GP to be eliqible to ride in the GP Special or the GP Freestyle.
- CDI3* GP riders may enter and ride up to two horses in the Grand Prix, Grand Prix Special and Grand Prix Freestyle (providing they qualify).
- Combinations entered in the CDI-J must enter all three competitions at that level.
- Combinations entered in the CDI-Y must enter all three competitions at that level.
- Combinations entered in the CDI-U25 must enter all three competitions at that level.
- Combinations entered in the CPEDI 3* must enter all three competition in their grade.
- A current EA approved height certificate must be supplied at the time of entry for all ponies.

CDI 3* GP. CDI-J. CDI-Y. CDI-U25 & CPEDI 3* HORSE INSPECTIONS & VETERINARY EXAMINATION

- Horse Registration Control and Veterinary Examination and Inspection all horses: These will be carried out in accordance with current Veterinary Regulations and General Regulations and Rules for Dressage Events. Horse Registration control and veterinary examination will take place Wednesday, 17th July 2019, time to be advised with competitor information pack. The fitness inspection ("trot up") will take place on Wednesday, 17th July, at approx.4.00pm. Details will be provided with the competitor information pack. All horses entered in the CDI 3* GP, CDI-Y, CDI-Y, CDI-U25 and CPEDI 3*are required to trot-up.
- Sampling procedure for Prohibited substances Vet Regs, Chapter V & VI and Annex III. Horses will be subject to sampling for Prohibited Substances.
- **Insurance:** All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.
- Veterinary & Farrier: Services will be available on call. Contact details will be provided with the competitor information pack.

OBJECTIONS & APPEALS:

- CDI & CPEDI competitions Refer FEI Gen. Regs Art. 163, 165, 166 & 167. Must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of 150 CHF (approx. \$220 AUD).
- National competitions must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$150.00. Attention is drawn to Rule 1.5 of EA Dressage Rules.

DECLARATION OF STARTERS (CDI 3* GP, CDI-J, CDI-Y, CDI-U25 & CPEDI 3*)

- CDI: Refer FEI Dressage Rules, Art 424
- CDI 3* GP, CDI-J, CDI-Y & CDI-U25: Declaration of starters: must be done by midday for the following day's competitions. Riders who have not declared by midday will be considered as a starter for the competitions entered at the closing date of entries.
- CPEDI: Refer FEI Para Dressage Rules, Art 8424
- CPEDI 3*: Declaration of starters must be done no later than 2 hours before the draw. Riders who have not declared by this time will be considered as a starter for the competitions entered at the closing date of entries.

TIME DRAWS

- CDI 3* GP, CDI-Y, CDI-U25, CPEDI 3* Thursday competitions: the draw will take place as soon as possible after the Fitness Inspection on Wednesday 17th July and will be placed on the Notice Board and also published to the web site.
- The draw for National competitions, Young Horse first round & Young Pony first Round will be a normal draw and will be available at www.gld.equestrian.org.au/dressage/brisbane-cdi

WITHDRAWALS & REFUNDS

- Refer EA rule 10.4: Withdrawals must be notified to the OC as soon as possible. Withdrawals at the event must complete a withdrawal form available at the Event Office.
- Refunds: Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 24 hours of the completion of the event. In such cases, 50% of the entry fees will be refunded by the OC. Entry fees will be refunded in full as soon as possible for withdrawals before the closing date of entries. Entry fees for riders on the reserve list who are not offered a start in a competition will be refunded after the event.
- The administration fee will not be refunded under any circumstance.

SADDLERY & EQUIPMENT

- Identification numbers (Bridle number) must be worn at all times when the horse is outside its stable. Please include your allocated identification number on the entry form. In the case of duplication of numbers, the OC will allocate a temporary number for this event only. Failure to display identification numbers may incur a warning or in the case of a repeated offence, a fine imposed by the Ground Jury.
- Whips: CDI 3* GP, CDI-J, CDI-Y & CDI-U25: It is, under penalty of elimination, forbidden to carry a whip of any kind while competing. However, the use of one whip, with a total maximum length of 120 cm, in the practice area is allowed. The whip must be dropped before entering the space around the competition arena or the athlete will be penalised (FEI Dressage Rules, Art. 428.4 & 430). Only riders, or grooms when riding, walking or lunging a horse, are allowed to carry a whip on the show grounds. CPEDI 3* refer to FEI Para Dressage Rules, Art 8428.2.3.
- National competitions: Whips that do not comply with current EA rules (i.e. must not exceed 120cm in entirety for horses, 100cm for ponies), will not be allowed in the warm-up and competition areas. A whip may be carried in all National competitions.
 Young Horse & Pony a whip may not be carried in 5, 6 & 7 YO competitions.
- Hats and head wear: As per current EA or FEI rules (FEI Dressage Rules, Art 427).
- **Protective headgear:** Riders aged 25 years and under must wear protective headgear at all times, including during the Fitness Inspection. Protective headgear is recommended to be worn by all riders at the Fitness Inspection. Protective headgear must be worn by all CPEDI 3* riders.
- Advertising and Publicity on competitors and horses (FEI Gen. Regs. Art. 135)
- Fly Hoods: EA rules apply for National competitions; FEI rules apply for CDI 3*, CDI-J, CDI-Y and CDI-U25 competitions. Refer EA/FEI rules for details.

FREESTYLES & GRAND PRIX SPECIAL

- Advanced Freestyle: The top 12 placegetters in the Advanced 5B & 5C qualify to ride the Advanced Freestyle (if entered), points
 will be awarded as per EA National Championship rules to determine ranking. The winner of the Advanced Freestyle is the winner
 of the Advanced Championship.
- Intermediate Freestyle: The top 12-15 placegetters in the Intermediate I qualify to ride the Intermediate Freestyle but a horse must earn a minimum score of 58% in the qualifying competition (Inter I) to be eligible. The Organising Committee is free to invite the best in the Prix St Georges to make up numbers.
- CDI 3* Grand Prix Freestyle: the top 15 placegetters in the CDI3* Grand Prix qualify but a horse must earn a minimum average score of 60% in the CDI3*GP to qualify.

- CDI 3* Grand Prix Special: (same conditions for CDI 3* Grand Prix Freestyle).
- FEI Intermediate A/B Level Freestyle: The top 6-8 placegetters in the Intermediate B who have scored 58% or more will be eligible.
- CDN Grand Prix Freestyle: The top 6-8 placegetters in the CDN Grand Prix qualify but a horse must earn a minimum average score of 60% to qualify.
- CDN Grand Prix Special (same conditions for CDN Grand Prix Freestyle).
- CDI-J Freestyle: Compulsory for the top 12 combinations from the Junior Rider Individual competition who must earn a minimum score of 60% in the CDI-J Individual to be eligible.
- CDI-Y Freestyle: Compulsory for the top 12 combinations from the Young Rider Individual competition who must earn a minimum score of 60% in the CDI-Y Individual competition to be eligible.
- **GP CDI-U25 Freestyle:** Compulsory for the top 6 combinations from the CDI-U25 Grand Prix competition who must earn a minimum score of 60% in the CDI-U25 Grand Prix competition to the eligible.
- CPEDI 3*: The top 8 combinations in each grade who must earn a minimum average score of 60% from the Team & Individual tests
- Freestyle Music on CD or USB to be handed in to the Event Office. There will be a timetable for Freestyle music testing.
- Entry fees will be refunded for those who enter and do not qualify for the Freestyle.

PRESENTATIONS

- Presentations will be unmounted except for the CDI-J Freestyle, CDI-Y Freestyle, CDI-U25 Grand Prix Freestyle, Intermediate
 Freestyle, CDN Grand Prix Freestyle, CDI 3* Grand Prix Freestyle, Intermediate A/B Freestyle, Advanced Freestyle, these will be
 mounted.
- Participation in prize-giving ceremonies is compulsory. Failure to do so entails losing the classification (sash, prize in kind, prize money FEI Dressage Rules Art. 436, FEI Para Dressage Rules Art. 8436).
- Prize money. Will be processed within approx. 14 working days post the event. Any outstanding debts will be deducted from prize
 money. (FEI Gen.Regs, Art. 128): Prize money is awarded to the owners or lessees of horses. Competitors must provide Bank
 Account details so that funds can be transferred into the nominated bank account.

ACCREDITATION

1 rider, 1 rider's partner, 1 groom per horse and 2 owners per horse will gain accreditation to the event – accreditation will be limited in the case of the rider's partner being the groom or owner. Please collect from the **Volunteers Marquee** outside the indoor. This pass allows daily access to the venue and stables.

STABLING

- Stables, Camping and Tack Rooms are booked through QSEC's page on Nominate.com.au: https://nominate.com.au/stables/VenueIntroduction.aspx?vid=239. Stables and Camp Sites will be allocated by the OC.
- CDI 3* GP, CDI-Y, CDI-Y, CDI-U25 & CPEDI 3* International Rules require horses to remain on the competition grounds for the duration of the event (from the "trot-up" until the horse has finished competing). This rule does not apply to horses taking part in National competitions.
- All horses competing at the QSEC Indoor Complex must hire a stable. Day parking (tying to float/truck) is not permitted in the camping area at this event.
- Excellent stables are available on the grounds, 3.6m x 3.6m x 3.6m with anti-slip rubber matting and bitumen isles. 1/3 cubic metre (6-7 wheelbarrows) of shavings is included in the stable hire fee. Stables will be pre-filled. More bedding can be ordered from the venue's contracted supplier details will be provided in the Competitor Information Pack.
- Stables are charged per day, i.e. if arriving Thursday and departing Friday this is 2 days of stabling.
- All stallions are to be stabled. EA Stallion Safe Practice Policy Rules and Regulations are effective from July 1, 2018.
- A stable allocation will apply and no horses are to be moved without permission from the Stable Manager.
- All horses staying overnight must be stabled.
- There is a compulsory stable bond per stable and tack room. If stables and tack rooms are not left swept clean of all bedding, manure, urine and other waste, this bond will be retained. All stables must be inspected by the Stable Manager prior to departure for a "clean pass".
- Competitors are responsible for paying any damages incurred to stables during the event minimum fee \$200.00 or as determined by OSEC
- Private tack rooms will be allocated if sufficient spare stables are available.
- Day Parking (tie to float) for those competing in competitions at the outdoor arenas is permitted or you can hire a day yard.
 Competitions at the outdoor arenas are Young Horse, Young Pony, Novice 2A, and Novice 2B.
- Security will be in place for the entire stable block from Wednesday from 6pm-6am. There will be no access to non-accredited persons.
- All competitors must complete a 'Horse Health Declaration Form' before unloading horses at QSEC. A copy of this form can be found here https://gsec.com.au/files/assets/gsec/forms/horse-health-declaration-form.pdf
- STABLE PROTOCOL: SMOKING is not permitted in the stables! Prams, bicycles, scooters & golf buggies are not permitted in the stables (exception vehicles used by Stable Manager & venue staff). Children must be supervised at all times. For safety reasons we recommend that all persons including children wear closed footwear whilst in the stables.
- Arrival & Departure: The earliest horses can arrive is Monday July 15, 9.30am. The latest departure from the venue is Monday July 22.

CAMPING & PARKING

Powered & Unpowered Camp sites are available with good amenities available. Camp sites are booked through QSEC's page on Nominate.com.au: https://nominate.com.au/stables/VenueIntroduction.aspx?vid=239 Camp sites will be allocated by the OC.

CATERING: Catering will be available on the grounds from Breakfast on Wednesday morning.

CALLERS: are not permitted (except for the 4YO, 5YO, 6YO and 7YO first round which are commanded tests. The novice tests may have callers).

DOGS: Dogs are permitted in QSEC camping grounds provided they are kept on a lead (maximum length of 1 metre) and under control at all times. Dogs must be kept away from horse activities including the Main Arena and shower/ toilet/laundry facilities. Any person not adhering to this guideline will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and no refund given. Please ensure that dog droppings are disposed of using the bags provided. Do not bring dangerous dogs to this event.

Indemnity: Neither the Organising Committee (Dressage QLD), their appointed officials, Equestrian Australia or QSEC accept any liability for any accident, theft or illness to horses, riders, grooms or any person or property whatsoever. All competitors, in entering, undertake to accept this regulation.

VACCINATIONS

Strangles (Streptococcus equi equi) is the most contagious bacterial infection of horses in Australia. It is spread by contamination of water and feed containers, stable walls, bars and bedding (fomites). Strangles infections are very easily transmissible and young horses, old horses and stressed horses are all potentially less than 100% immunocompetent. Strangles is only one such highly infectious and contagious disease that is likely to be transmitted when horses come into contact with each other and novel environments, at competition venues.

There are no vaccination requirements to enter this event. However, we strongly recommend that tetanus and strangles vaccines are up to date for every horse attending this event. We also strongly encourage owners of horses that reside in high risk areas to vaccinate against the **Hendra Virus**. Riders are required to advise the Hendra vaccination status of their horses on the entry form.

Riders and owners of horses who are not *currently protected* against Hendra Virus should be aware that veterinarians may refuse to treat horses until an exclusion test has shown that they do not have Hendra Virus.

QUEENSLAND TICK REQUIREMENTS: Please contact **QLD DAF Call Centre:** Ph. (07) 3404 6999 or 132523 for information. Spraying arrangements for horses returning to tick free areas and NSW will be organised to allow horses to be sprayed at QSEC prior to departure.

PROPERTY IDENTIFICATION CODE: It is compulsory to provide a PIC with your entry.

QSEC Policy:

Please note QSEC has a no glass policy. Only alcohol purchased at the venue can be consumed at the Indoor complex.

Competitions 31B to 38B: Round 2 The Top 10 placed horses and ponies from Round 1 who score a minimum of 6.5 (see below for tests to be ridden):

- Refer Section 9 of the EA dressage rules for full details. All horses, riders and owners must be current members and registered with the EA. EA Rules apply. All horses must exceed 149cms with shoes.
- The birth dates for all horses and ponies will be as at 1st August. e.g.
 - 4 YO: for horses and ponies born between 1/8/2014 and 31/7/2015
 - o 5 YO: for horses and ponies born between 1/8/2013 and 31/7/2014
 - \circ 6 YO: for horses and ponies born between 1/8/2012 and 31/7/2013
 - $_{\odot}$ 7 YO for horses and ponies born between 1/8/2011 and 31/7/2012
- 4, 5 and 6 year old horses and ponies are to be ridden in a snaffle bridle (min. diameter of mouthpiece is 14mm for horses, 10mm for ponies), 7 year old horses and ponies may be ridden in a snaffle or double bridle. Mexican/crossed noseband not permitted. Refer Section 5 of the rules for more details on saddlery.
- Whips are permitted in the 4YO competitions only max length 1.2m for horses, 1m for ponies.
- . Approved safety helmets are to be worn for all Young Horse Competitions
- Horses will be judged on walk, trot, canter, submission and perspective as a dressage horse.
- There will be two (2) rounds Round 1 will be commanded and ridden in groups of 2.
- Round 1: EA YH commanded tests for 4, 5, & 6YO horses; Young Horse Technical Test 7 year old for 7YO horses; EA YH commanded tests for 4 & 5YO ponies, EA YP commanded test for 6 YO ponies; Young Horse Technical Test 7 year old for 7YO ponies. Round 2: Tests to be ridden will be: 4 YEAR OLD Horses & Ponies: FEI Young Horse Dressage test for 4 year old horses, 5 YEAR OLD Horses & Ponies: FEI Young Horse Preliminary test for 5 year old horses; 6 YEAR OLD Horses: FEI Young Horse Preliminary test for 6 year old horses, 6 YEAR OLD Ponies: EA Young Dressage Pony 6 year old; 7 YEAR OLD Horses & Ponies: FEI Young Horse Preliminary Test 7YO.
- Tests for State Championships can be downloaded from the EA web site www.equestrian.org.au/dressage-YH
- Scores from the First Round do not carry forward to the Second/Final Round.
- Winners of Round 2 for 4, 5, 6 & 7 YO will be named Queensland Young Dressage Horse or Pony Champion for their age group

Performance

Qualifying scores are not required to enter the Qld State Young Dressage Horse & Pony Championships, however, should

Welfare of the Horse

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
