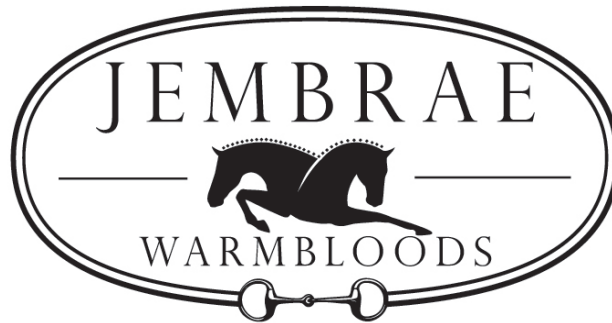

QSEC IS A GLASS FREE VENUE

As users of this great venue we need to observe and comply with the laws that the venue is run under, which are the same laws as other large sporting venues in Queensland, such as Suncorp Stadium and the Gabba. If you bring glass onto the venue in your vehicles, then that's where it needs to remain – **DO NOT** place empty bottles in the QSEC rubbish bins – take them home with you. There are large fines for people who do not abide by these rules

FACILITIES

We request that competitors take the utmost care in looking after the wonderful facilities that are being provided at QSEC. Please take pride in this fantastic venue and keep the toilets and amenities block clean. The indoor arena precinct is a non-BYO alcohol area – that is, you can only consume alcohol that has been purchased at the bar at the indoor arena.

DOGS

Dogs are permitted in the camping complex **ONLY**. Dogs **ARE NOT PERMITTED** in or around the indoor arena precinct including grassed areas and car parks, at the outdoor arena complex, inside the stable complex or inside amenities. All dogs at all times must be secured or on a leash that is no longer than 1 metre in length. **Do not bring dangerous dogs to this event.**

BIOSECURITY

Queensland biosecurity legislation requires that every time a horse moves off a property, a movement record must be created. The following details must be recorded:

- name of the person completing the record
- where the horses/s are being moved from
- where the horses/s are being moved to and the name and address of the person receiving the horse/s
- the date of movement
- description of horse.

These records must be kept for 2 years.

The Horse Health Declaration form that you will be required to submit on arrival at the Youth Championships can be your Movement Record, however, as we require you to

submit your horse health declaration to us, you will need to take a copy of the form, i.e. photo with your phone. You will also need to create a Movement Record for your trip home.

QSEC's PIC is QGCB1219.

PONY MEASURING

An official EA Accredited Pony Measurer will be onsite Friday morning 12th August at the stables for anyone who requires their ponies to be measured. The cost is **\$40 per pony** which is payable directly to the measurer. Please let Anita know before August 5th if you require your pony to be measured ascampton@hotmail.com

Draws will be continually updated as scratchings are received.

A **final revised** draw may be necessary the day before each competition to allow for withdrawals. The starting order will not alter and a move up system will apply. **The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the evening before the competition.** All changes will be on the Jembrae Warmbloods Queensland Youth & Pony Championships website or Facebook page. We will endeavour to keep changes to a minimum.

WITHDRAWALS/SCRATCHINGS:

Refunds will be made post-event to the credit card that you used to pay for your entries, in accordance with the 2022 Jembrae Warmbloods Queensland Youth & Pony Dressage Championships schedule.

You will need to contact Nominate and the Queensland State Equestrian Centre to organise a refund of your stabling and camping as a result of scratching from the event, as this is handled separately to your entries.

FREESTYLES

Freestyle Music – **CAN ONLY BE ACCEPTED VIA A DROPBOX LINK THAT WILL BE EMAILED OUT TO ALL COMPETITORS.**

Instructions to upload music will be sent via email. Please have a back-up copy available.

Freestyle Practice times:

Friday August 12th, 8.00am to 11:00am

Freestyle practice will take place in the indoor arena. A draw is included with this competitor information pack. It is not compulsory to attend the practice, but this is the only opportunity to have your music tested.

VETERINARY MATTERS

It is compulsory for all Competitors to fill out and sign a QSEC Horse Health Declaration on arrival at the event. The form is included with this competitor information pack.

If your horse is stabled at the stable complex you must hand your completed form to the Stable Manager when unloading your horse at the venue. If you are parking at the Outdoor Arena Complex (Barr Oval), you must hand your completed form to Gear Check at the outdoor arenas (even if you are competing at the indoor complex) before you ride.

Riders at all levels must have their horse's **EA papers** available for inspection if requested. **Swabbing** will take place. **Penalty fines** will be imposed for those who do not have their horse papers available at the event.

If you need to call a vet to attend to your horse while at the event, the Organising Committee **MUST** be notified.

ARENA FAMILIARISATION

Thursday 11th August:

The Main Arena and Arena 2 at the indoor complex are available for use from 2.00PM to 5.00PM. There may be some disruptions at times due to setup and riders may be asked to leave the arenas during this time to continue their riding at another part of the indoor complex.

Outdoor Arena Complex (Barr Oval) and grass area – NOT AVAILABLE

Friday 12th August:

The Main Arena (when not being used by a rider practicing their freestyle) is available for use from 8.00AM to 11.00AM and 4:00PM to 5:00PM.

Indoor Arena 2: 4:30PM to 5:00PM.

Outdoor Arena Complex (Barr Oval) – Arenas available 10:00AM to 12:00PM. Grass area from 10.00AM to approximately 2.00PM.

Saturday 13th August:

Main Arena at the indoor complex: NOT AVAILABLE

Arena 2 only at the indoor complex: 4:45PM to 6PM

Outdoor Arena Complex (Barr Oval) – Grass warm-up area only 7.30AM to 2:00PM

Sunday 14th August:

Main Arena at the indoor complex and Indoor Arena 2: NOT AVAILABLE

Outdoor Arena Complex: Grass warm-up area only 7.30AM to 1:00PM

Riders are permitted to ride in the specified arenas at these set times. The organising committee reserves the right to amend or reduce these times if required. Competitors are advised to check the notice board in the Riders Marquee for updated times.

INDOOR ARENA 2

Due to space constraints, if you are competing in Indoor Arena 2, you will need to enter the arena and start your test from inside the arena once the judge has rung the bell.

OUTDOOR ARENAS

Riders will be permitted to start their tests from within the arenas for all events held in the outdoor arenas. Riders may enter the arena once the rider before them has exited the arena and are permitted to complete a lap each way in trot or canter prior to the judge ringing the bell. Once the judge has rung the bell the rider will have 45 seconds to commence their test.

LUNGING

Lunging at the stable complex is to take place in the designated lunging yard. Lunging at Barr Oval may occur either in the designated lunging yard or with care in the area immediately adjacent and east of the lunging yard.

GEAR CHECK

Under the current EA Dressage rules, it is compulsory for every horse and rider combination to have a gear check for every test they ride. Gear check will take place prior to each test unless otherwise specified by the stewards.

CALLERS

Riders are reminded that as this is a State Championship event NO CALLERS will be permitted.

WHIPS & GEAR

A reminder that whips that do not comply with current EA rules (must not exceed 1.2m in entirety for horses, and 1.0m for ponies), will not be allowed in the **warm-up** and **competition** areas. A whip may be carried in all Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium and Advanced competitions. Whips **ARE NOT PERMITTED** in the FEI Children, FEI Pony Tour, FEI Junior Tour, FEI Young Rider Tour, FEI Under 25 competitions, FEI Youth Small Tour or FEI Pony Small and Big Tour classes as this is a State Championship.

Head Wear: an approved and tagged safety helmet must be worn at all times when riding.

Horse Identification Numbers: Riders are responsible for providing Horse Identification Numbers for their horses. **Allocated Horse Identification Numbers as per the draw** must be worn on both sides of the horse whenever a horse is out of the stable, for example when grazing or training. Numbers need to be minimum 4cm high and black on a white background. We suggest owners have two sets of numbers on hand, one for the head collar and the other for competition. Competitors grazing horses must take extreme care and have horses under full control at all times. If grazing horses appear to be upsetting competing horses or horses under saddle, they will be asked to return to the stables. **Please do not graze or lead horses in warm up or close to the competition arenas when horses are competing.**

STALLIONS

All stallion riders, grooms and owners must be aware of and abide by, the EA Stallion Safe Practice Rules and Regulations Policy, effective 1st July, 2018

VOLUNTEERS

There is no event without amazing volunteers. Some of you have been given a small job to do during the event. Please check the Volunteer Roster provided with this competitor information pack, carefully. If your job is at the Main Arena or Arena 2, please report to Gear Check at the indoor arena 10 minutes prior to your job start time. If your job is at one of the outdoor arenas, please report to gear check at the outdoor arenas 10 minutes before your job start time. Thank you all for helping out and making the event possible.

STABLES & CAMPING

Stabling & Camping Allocation: The stabling and camping allocation is being sent with this Competitor Information Pack. This allocation is the same as you booked via Nominate.com.au.

Horse Arrival times:

Thursday, 11 th August –	1.00 PM to 6.00PM
Friday 12 th August –	6.30 AM to 6.00PM
Saturday 13 th August –	6.30 AM to 6.00PM
Sunday 14 th August –	6.30 AM to 6.00PM

Cheryl Stephen is the Stable Manager. If you need to arrive outside of these arrival times please contact Cheryl prior to arrival to arrange check-in otherwise you will not have access to your stables (see Handy Telephone Numbers page for phone details).

Arrival Procedure: Upon arrival at the stable complex you will be greeted by the Stable Manager. They will take your completed Horse Health Declaration Form from you, note your arrival date, and show you to your camping site and unlock your stables. No one is permitted to unload horses until a stable warden is onsite to check you in. If you require entry to the venue before that time, please arrange with Cheryl to meet you and check you in.

Departure Procedure: Stables must be completely emptied of bedding on departure. When you are ready to depart the stable complex you must notify the Stable Manager who will inspect your stable for cleanliness, lock your stable and note your departure date.

Note: Please bring your own feed and water bins as these are not provided by QSEC. It is also advisable to bring your own stable cleaning tools and wheelbarrow as these are in limited supply at the venue.

Stable Bedding: Your stable will be pre-filled with 4 wheelbarrow loads of shavings. Extra bedding in the form of Hisorb shavings can be ordered from PetStock Caboolture (see Handy Telephone Numbers page). Orders placed by 11am each day will be delivered that afternoon.

Stable Cleaning: when booking your stable you have paid a \$65 stable bond. This will be refunded post event if your stable is left clean – clean means that all bedding, feed & urine has been removed from the stable and it has been SWEPT clean (not merely scraped out with a shovel). Any damage to stables as noted by QSEC is payable by competitors and a damage fee will be charged back to competitors.

Stable Cleaning Service: Stable Manager Cheryl will be offering stable cleaning for a cost of \$25 per stable. If you wish to take up this offer please see Cheryl with the cash before you leave or email Cheryl prior up until Wednesday night and the crews will clean your stable once you depart.

Competitor Day Parking: Day parking is not available in the stable complex area or at the indoor complex. Day parking is only available at the Outdoor Arena Complex (Barr Oval)

Car Parking: Car parking is not permitted at the stable block. Car parking is available on site at the indoor complex car park. Vehicles are not allowed in the competition and training areas. **Only towing vehicles and event personnel are permitted to park in the stable complex.**

DAY YARD BOOKINGS

Day yards are available at the Outdoor Arena Complex. These are free but need to be booked to ensure that they are unlocked. Please let the event director know if you require a day yard.

RIDER BAGS

Each rider will receive a Youth Championships riders bag. If you have purchased a Commemorative Polo Shirt (ordered and paid for at the time of entry) it will be in your rider bag. Rider bags can be collected from the Event Office during the event.

CATERING

Catering will be available all days of the event at the indoor arena complex.

PRESENTATIONS

All presentations are unmounted (except for the Sharon Doe Memorial) and will take place in the Riders Marquee at **4.30pm Friday August 12th; 6.00pm Saturday August 13th and 3.00pm Sunday August 14th**. The presentation for the Sharon Doe Memorial class will be mounted and take place in the Main Arena immediately following completion of the event.

Riders are requested to be neatly attired in competition dress for presentations. Attendance at presentations is **compulsory** – riders who do not attend and who do not request permission for another rider to collect their prize will forfeit any prizes or prize money. Sponsorship for events is very difficult to secure and it is just courtesy for riders to be present to receive their prizes and have photos taken that we can give to our sponsors.

SATURDAY EVENING WELCOME BBQ

Saturday evening, at approximately 6.30 PM, will be the Youth Championships Welcome Dinner (location TBC). Some of you have pre-booked and paid for the Dinner. If you have not, and would still like to attend, please let Anita Barton – Event Director know ASAP.

WELFARE OF THE HORSE – FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

ARRIVING AT QSEC

QSEC is located on the corner of Tuckeroo Drive and Beerburrum Road, Caboolture – just 45 minutes from the Brisbane CBD. The address is Cnr Tuckeroo Drive and Beerburrum Road, Caboolture QLD 4510.

Easily accessible by road, QSEC is just 2km north of the Caboolture CBD and 4km from the Bruce Highway. From the Bruce Highway, take exit 152B and follow the signs to Kilcoy. From there take the Caboolture exit and follow the signs to Beerburrum which will take you onto Beerburrum Road.

The stables and camping entry for competitors is off Old Gympic Road. The address for the stable and camping entry is 118 Old Gympic Road, Caboolture QLD 4510 (Gate 14). Competitor day parking at Barr Oval is via Gate 15, Old Gympic Road.
