#### WELCOME INFORMATION

It is with much pleasure that Interschool Queensland is able to conduct this event as per the details in the following Program.

#### **BIOSECURITY**

For information in relation to travel permits & spraying please contact your local Department of Primary Industries. It is a requirement for entry to this event that all competitors provide a current Horse Health Declaration (HHD) form for each horse entering the showgrounds.

An EQ HHD form is required upon check in every time a horse is brought onto the grounds. You must submit your HHD to the IQ office on arrival. The EQ HHD form can be found HERE.

Biosecurity legislation requires we all must keep Movement Records when we take our horses somewhere. A Movement Record can take many forms – it can be a written note in a diary, a horse health declaration form, a note in your smartphone, etc. It needs to record the date of the horse movement, a description of the horse, the property of origin (including PIC), where you are going (including PIC), and who completed the record. You are required to keep these records for 2 years.

The Horse Health Declaration form that you will be required to submit at check in can also be your Movement Record, however, as we require you to submit your HHD form to us, you will need to take a copy of the form, e.g. photo with your phone. You will also need to create a Movement Record for your trip home.

A wrist band will be issued to all riders, on receipt of the Horse Health Declaration form at the IQ Office. Riders must wear their wrist band to allow the rider to pass through gear check during this event. NO ARMBAND = NO RIDE.

- Please do not bring sick horse/s to this venue. Practise good biosecurity before, during and after going to an event.
- Horses must not be tied to any fences or trees. Horses must NOT enter the camping areas.
- Do not erect electric tape or portable yards. Do not dump manure from trucks/trailers anywhere other than the allocated stable waste points.
- Do not put manure on trees. Leave stables, camp areas and arenas clean and tidy. A cleaning fee is charged for stables or yards not left clean after the event and any stable waste and manure not deposited at the designated stable waste site.
- Horses, when not being ridden, must be kept in allocated stables or yards.

Horses are allocated a number on the draw. This number **MUST** be displayed on the horse's halter, bridle or saddle pad, whenever the horse is taken out of its stable or yard and is being led, ridden, competed or lunged on the grounds at an event.

Riders must ensure that their stable has the owner's name, contact details and horse name displayed in case of emergencies. You must complete and print the stable plate template available <u>HERE</u>.

<u>Camping and Stabling</u>: Stabling and camping will be available as per the options/prices below.

Please note that all stabling and camping for the event is allocated by independent volunteers. Any enquiries regarding additional dates of stay outside of these dates are to be directed to the Toowoomba Showgrounds who will liaise with event organisers. **Only horses competing at the event are allowed onsite.** 

**Stables:** \$30 per stable per night (6am to 6am)

**Yards:** Free for duration of the event (only one stable/yard per horse)

Availability pending full allocation of stables.

**Bond:** \$50 per stable/yard (the bond will be returned to you from

#### **Entry Fees**

Dressage classes D10 & D11 - \$30 each.

All other classes: Combined Training, Dressage, Show Horse, Jumping - \$60

Refunds for entries not meeting the minimum qualifying criteria will be less the admin fee.

**Additional charges:** \$45 non-refundable admin levy per rider which includes paramedics and scoring levies for the event.

**Scratchings:** Scratchings for all disciplines are to be advised via email: <a href="mailto:interschool@equestriangld.com.au">interschool@equestriangld.com.au</a>.

#### Refunds:

No refund for scratching after close of entries unless accompanied by veterinary/medical certificate. A \$45 administration fee will apply on the total entry. Certificates are to be received by the OC within 7 days of commencement of competition.

A stable or yard bond is charged automatically when stables or yards are booked. If your stable/yard is left clean, you will be refunded the bond to the credit card that was used to book. If your stable/yard is left unclean, you will forfeit the bond and it will not be refunded to you after inspection from Toowoomba Showgrounds.

- All horses must be EA Life registered
- All riders must be EQ Competitor Junior members
- The OC reserves the right to accept and/or reject entries.
- Competitors are reminded that Medication Control (swabbing) can occur at <u>any</u> event run under Equestrian Australia rules and regulations.
- Riders may enter a **max. of 4 classes** per horse across the event (excluding Eventing). However, for scheduling reasons, riders may have to make a choice between classes if there is a time clash.
- Riders are asked to consider the welfare of the horse when considering their classes. The OC reserves the right to discuss the number of entries for a horse/rider combination per day if they have concerns.









#### **HYGAIN IQ STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023**

This event is being conducted under the rules as per the 2023 IQ Handbook and the EA and FEI Rules where applicable. It is your responsibility to read the 2023 IQ Handbook.

During the planning and organisation of this event, all due care will be taken to ensure the safest possible conditions exist for the riders and horses. However, it is the responsibility of each competitor to comply with safety standards set down in the competition rules. The organising committee for this event will endeavour to see these standards are complied with.

Neither the organising committee, Interschool Queensland, Equestrian Australia, Equestrian Queensland, Toowoomba Showgrounds accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury, illness to riders, spectators, horses, grounds or any other persons or property whatsoever in consideration of entries being accepted. No entries will be accepted unless riders and parents have signed the Acknowledgment and Indemnity waiver.

#### **Compulsory Discipline Meetings**

Please note that each evening there will be a compulsory Discipline meeting to provide competitors with important information about the next day's competition. We ask that applicable parents and riders attend.

A rider can enter a maximum of two horses in each discipline providing that each horse/rider combination is qualified.

Riders may enter a max. of 4 classes per horse across the event (excluding Eventing).

**Dressage** - each horse can compete in a maximum of two classes across the event. A class is two dressage tests at one level. For riders entering two classes on a horse, these classes must be at consecutive levels. No more than 2 tests per day.

**Show Jumping** - Providing qualifying criteria met, riders may be able to nominate 2 horses in a maximum of two show jumping classes per horse. For riders entering two classes on a horse, these classes must be at consecutive heights. All horses must compete at their highest qualified height/s.

**Show Horse** - Competitors may enter a maximum of two horses.

**Combined Training** - CT participants may nominate a maximum of two (2) horses, with each horse only being entered in one (1) class provided qualifying criteria are met for each horse. The entries may be in the same or different classes.

#### **Substitutions**

On approval from the IQ committee, riders may substitute an alternative qualified horse combination up until the start of competition for the day providing details of the horse registration is presented to the organising committee. No rider may be substituted for another rider

Important note for riders wishing to compete in more than one discipline:

The organising committee will endeavour to structure the draws such that riders may compete in two disciplines on the same day, but riders must understand that, if this is not possible, they may have to prioritise one discipline over the other.

#### Horses

Horses are **NOT** to be ridden by anyone other than the rider nominated on the draw at events from midday on the day prior to the event commencing until conclusion of the final discipline on the last day of the event. This includes at any mounted presentations. This ruling applies even if a horse has completed its competitions at an event.

The exception to this ruling is that a horse can be ridden by more than one sibling rider at an event in different disciplines and the horse does not compete in more than the maximum number of tests/sections allowed in the day by EA discipline rules (eq. no more than 2 dressage tests in one day).

#### **Primary Riders**

Primary competition is for those athletes enrolled up to and including year 6 in the year of competition.

#### **Secondary Riders**

- In the Dressage, Show Horse and Show Jumping competition there are Intermediate Secondary and Senior Secondary classes.
- Intermediate is defined as those athletes enrolled in years 7, 8 and 9.
- Senior divisions are for those athletes enrolled in years 10, 11 and 12 in the current year.





#### **Disputes**

All protests or complaints are to be managed with respect through the official channels.

No competitors or parents are to directly approach any judges, stewards, course builders or any other officials or volunteers before, during or after the competition with disputes or complaints.

Any disputes, complaints or queries during the event must be lodged in writing with the fee of \$100 as per rule 5.4 in the 2023 IQ Handbook, to the TD via their school convenor within 30 minutes of the posting of the scores which gave rise to the objection. The decision of the Technical Delegate will be final and may not be appealed. General questions can be asked in relation to errors on results or in relation to the running of the event through the event office.

#### **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

The IQ Committee values the attendance of all riders, parents, officials, spectators, sponsors, volunteers and supporters however it is a condition of attendance at this event that each person present on the grounds is bound by the rules, policies and by-laws of Equestrian Australia. This includes comments on all social media outlets.

As per EA general regulations the following will apply;

#### Article 109

- 4. OCs have the right;
  - To cancel any class or Event.
  - To divide any class.
  - To alter advertised times.
  - Refuse any entry.
  - Transfer Athletes between sections of a class.
  - To alter or amend the schedule as the OC sees fit.
  - Refer Article 115.1 in EA General Regulations <u>HERE</u>

#### **Behaviour/Code of Conduct:**

When representing their school and while on competition grounds, all competitors must obey their school rules and competition etiquette. Those not adhering to these, risk elimination from the competition. Damage to any third party by anyone at the venue of the competition will be the responsibility of the adult involved or the parents or guardians of those who caused the damage. In particular IQ, EQ and EA accept no responsibility relating to the use of motorised vehicles on the grounds over the course of the competition.

As per the Equestrian Australia 2019 National Interschool Rules, and Member Protection Policy it is expected that athletes and their support teams/parents will adhere to the rules of the competitions in which they participate and that they will show respect for other competitors, their horses, officials, judges and administrators in their actions and their words including on Social Media.





#### Behaviour/Code of Conduct continued...

There are formal mechanisms for requesting clarity of committee decisions and for disputing results. Whilst each discipline has rules and regulations specific to that discipline available for download from the EA website, the conduct of members of the sport overall is controlled by the Member Protection Policy.

There are also general competition codes of conduct that apply to ALL Interschool competitions. Breaches of these general conduct practices will result in disqualification from the competition and depending on the severity of the offence, the athlete and/or their associates may face disciplinary action.

At an Interschool event the Organising Committee, Technical Delegate/s, Ground Jury and Officials are responsible for ensuring Horse Welfare guidelines and EA Codes of Conduct are observed.

The following EA Codes of Conduct must be observed by all competitors and their parents/guardians, during any activity held or sanctioned by EA – including Interschool events – or as an athlete/participant in any activity held by or under the auspices of the organisation or one of its affiliates. Those who fail to do so risk elimination from the competition.

- General & for all EA members
- For competitors
- For officials
- For spectators
- For coaches
- For administrators, directors & officers
- For parents & guardians
- For the welfare of the horse

#### **FAILURE TO DO HELPER JOB**

If the helper fails to arrive for duty as per the roster, the rider will NOT be eligible for prizes at the State Championships and will be automatically considered as riding HC for the event. This will mean the rider will also be ineligible for the 2023 Queensland Team. In addition, the IQ Committee will notify the rider's school. Records will be kept for future leadership positions. **Please do not put the committee or your child in this situation.** 

If you need to scratch from the Event you <u>MUST</u> try to find a replacement for your job and inform the IQ Events Secretary with who your replacement is.

If you have endeavoured to find a replacement but are having difficulty or if you are scratching due to an emergency please contact the IQ Events Secretary ASAP who will assist you.





#### **Venue Information**

No motor bikes, four-wheelers, trikes and other vehicles are to be used at Toowoomba Showgrounds, other than by the OC

- **Bikes/Scooters** All users are required to wear approved helmets at all times and must stay away from stables, all horse warm up and competition areas. Must be ridden by one person at a time, slowly and quietly with due consideration to horses and others. **Scooters and Bikes must be parked in designated areas.**
- **Lunging** Designated lunging area to be advised.
- Camping and Stables -Camping and parking of vehicles are allowed in designated areas only. Horse preparation, working areas and stables and yards are separate from the areas designated for parking and camping. Horses are not permitted in camping and parking areas. Allocated stable/s cannot be changed.
- Dogs Dogs MUST be leashed and under the control of the owner/ handler at all times. The owner of any dog on the ground accepts the responsibility of the consequent action caused by the dog. All dogs must be restrained at all times. Please ensure that dog droppings are picked up and disposed of appropriately. No dogs in Equestrian areas.
- **Glass** No glass is permitted around grounds, camping areas exempted.
- **Smoking**—Smoking only in designated areas.
  - **Camp Fires** Braziers are allowed but must be contained and off the ground depending on the weather conditions (information will be provided by Toowoomba Showgrounds on arrival).
- **Children** Parents/carers are responsible for their children at all times.

Please be respectful of the grounds – clean up all manure and place all litter in the bins provided.









#### **COMPETITOR INFORMATION**

#### **Competition Schedule**

The competition times in the published schedule are correct at the time of publication and should be taken as a guide for competitors only. The final schedule draw will be posted on the morning of each competition day and available on the event Stack Team App.

Rings may run early, please be attentive to announcements on the day. Riders may be required to ride earlier.

Riders who are late, without prior approval from the OC (e.g. let the office know if you are held up in another ring), may be excluded from the class.

#### **Rider Numbers**

Correct numbers as per the draw must be shown on **both** sides of the horse when competing.

#### **Stable Identification**

All stables must display the information sign at all times. This allows easy contact in case of an emergency.

#### **Unmounted Presentations**

Presentations in afternoon TBA on daily basis. Presentation is compulsory for all riders unless special consideration is granted by the event organisers.

#### **Helper Jobs**

Each rider will be required to nominate a helper for the event. This is a compulsory requirement. We are using SignUp to manage our helpers roster. It is easy to use and it allows you to choose jobs that suit your schedule, rider draw and family.

#### How it will work:

All available jobs will be listed in SignUp, the link will be emailed out to all riders & will be on social media. SignUp will open after draws have been sent (date/time to be finalised). Job choice will be on a 'first in' basis. To ensure you obtain your preferred jobs/times it is advised you sign up early.

# You are required to sign up for 1 job per class entry—maximum of 3 jobs per family.

If families do not select their jobs by the close-off date they will be allocated a job from any remaining jobs. Reminders will be sent prior to the opening and closing of the SignUp roster, but we ask you to take responsibility for signing up within the required timeframes.

It is the responsibility of each rider and their helper to ensure that they check the SignUp roster and complete their nominated tasks or find an appropriate substitute person to do so.

#### **Helper Sign In Procedure at Event**

Helpers must register at the nominated EQ Next Gen Riders Retreat prior to the start of their allocated job.





#### **Horse Welfare**

Horse abuse in any form will not be tolerated. If horse abuse is determined the athlete will be disqualified from the competition. The sighting of blood on the horse during a test, whether wet or dry, will entail elimination and/or investigation by the Ground Jury/Technical Delegate based upon the Sport Rules of the discipline involved.

Riders may enter a **max. of 4 classes** per horse across the event (excluding Eventing).

#### Soundness

The Judges are required to satisfy themselves regarding soundness of all horses and therefore have the authority to stop an unsound horse during the competition or from competing – any disputes in this area will be considered by the ground jury on the day and/or the Technical Delegate. For Dressage there is no appeal against this decision.

#### **Clean Sport**

Now is the time for a reminder that the use of prohibited substances in your horse is not tolerated and riders must be aware that random swabbing of horses may occur at random and will be conducted at any of these events. You should consult with your Vet regarding any current treatment and should be aware of the potential risk of self- administration of prohibited substances.

The FEI publishes a caution against the use of herbal supplements and products of which the ingredients are unknown. The use of any substance to affect the performance of a horse in a calming (tranquillising) or an energising (stimulant) manner is forbidden. The use of a calming product during competition may also have important safety consequences.

All controlled or banned substances can be found <u>HERE</u>.

There is also a smart phone FEI App you can download to your phone or access the web site HERE.









#### **Saddlery and Equipment**

- A designated marshal will be made available and is compulsory for all competitors prior to their entry in each phase of every class.
- Competitors are to check into marshalling 15 minutes prior to ride time.
- Competitors may not compete until they have been cleared through marshalling.
- NOTE: Wristbands must be worn to be cleared through gear check.
- For Dressage, riders may undertake their marshalling process up to 30 mins prior to ride time. This is to allow those riders that so choose, to have an uninterrupted warm-up period prior to their test. Where possible, marshals will assist riders to move through to their correct ring at the correct time, but this is primarily the responsibility of the rider.

All equipment must comply with EA regulations for the particular discipline. It is the <u>responsibility of the competitor and/or parents</u> to ensure that saddlery and equipment is in good repair, meets the relevant safety standards, is fitted appropriately and meets the regulations for that event. It is not the responsibility of the volunteers at Marshalling. Please refer to the illustrations of allowable equipment and information in the EA Rule Books and the information specific to each discipline in the IQ 2023 handbook.

#### **Uniform**

All riders must be in their full school approved equestrian competition uniform. This is considered appropriate protocol for a State Championship and the committee expects schools, riders and their parents to support this expectation. In Show Jumping Course walks, riders are to be attired in full competition uniform including helmet & crop.

NB \*\* Failure to comply with this rule will result in any awards, points or ribbons being forfeited\*\*

#### **Dress for Riders**

Riders competing in an EA competition, must wear attire that is EA Discipline compliant.

#### **Helmet Tagging:**

All participants at Interschool events will be required to have their helmet tagged. It is compulsory for participants at IQ events, to ride with a tagged helmet, regardless of discipline.

A **helmet tagging** person will be available at the IQ office each day.

Remember, the EA tag does not verify that the helmet is safe or in working order. It only verifies that the helmet complies with the specific standards as mandated by the EA Rules. Riders are strongly encouraged to check their helmet regularly (even if it is tagged). And replace their helmets if they have been damaged or impacted in a fall.

#### **Body Protectors**

Body Protectors for jumping elements are not compulsory under EA rules. The IQ strongly recommends their use in the interest of safety.

Combined Training is run under Eventing Rules.

- Callers are only permitted for primary dressage tests.
- No whips permitted in dressage phase for any classes, the responsibility for this rests with the rider. See updated EA Eventing rules.
- Whips of no more than 75cm allowed in jump phase.
- Back protectors strongly recommended for jump phase.
- A maximum of two horses may be entered per rider.

- Combined Training riders are not able to use results from the previous year's state championships as qualifying results.

### Changes to the timetable may occur based on final entry numbers and at the discretion of the OC

- Providing qualifying criteria is met, a rider may ride a maximum of two horses in up to two Championship classes per horse.
- For riders entering two Championship classes on one horse, these classes must be at consecutive levels.
- Any horse rider combinations may only ride two dressage tests per day.
- Each class or overall championship consists of two dressage tests.
- In some cases, however, the two tests will be ridden over two days.
- Classes D10 and D11 make up the Small Tour Championship and are deemed as one class. Riders can enter one part, but will be ineligible for the small tour champion, the Overall Championship is D10 and D11 combined.
- Classes D1 & D2 are for all riders in Prep-6, D3 & D5 are for riders in years 7-9 and D4 & D6 to D11 are for riders in years 7-12. Class D13 is open to para-equestrians, RDA riders and Riders with a Disability. Riders eligible for D3 and D5 cannot compete in D4 or D6.
- Riders who have an EA Exemption card may ride in classes D1-D11 and/or class D12. All PE riders at the time of nomination must send copies of their classification card and any other exemptions to the convenor, Nikki Doogue (email: interschool@equestrianqld.com.au) prior to acceptance of the nomination.
- Callers will be allowed for Primary riders but we do encourage experienced /older Primary riders to consider riding without a caller, in readiness for possible selection for the State Team and to help prepare for Secondary Dressage competition.

The dressage competition is run under EA and FEI rules and the IQ 2023 handbook.









#### **Qualifying criteria for Dressage:**

- Whilst all qualifying performances will be considered in the nomination process for the State Championships, this does not imply that riders with scores achieving the minimum standard are guaranteed a place.
- Balloting will be undertaken if entry numbers exceed class size limits.
- If a dressage class is balloted, each rider's two (2) highest submitted percentages will be combined and averaged.
- Each rider's averaged scores will then be balloted, and the top 35 riders will be offered a position to ride in the class.
- Classes are limited to 35 riders, however, there may be fewer accepted at the discretion of the OC depending on scheduling constraints and entry standards.
- Each horse can participate in a maximum of two (2) classes (a class is two (2) dressage tests at one level)
- If doing two (2) levels on one horse, they can only be consecutive levels

#### **DRESSAGE Continued...**

EA Competitive (official) dressage events – these events are conducted by an EA affiliate and open to all EA riders. Competitive dressage rules apply with regards to rider membership, horse registration, competition bridle number/license and attire. (Club or Participant dressage days are NOT Competitive (official) dressage events.) If you are unsure, please contact the EQ office for clarification before nomination.

#### **Class Numbers will be Capped**

Class numbers <u>will</u> be limited and entries will be ranked to determine acceptances for any classes with entries over the class limit of 35. If classes need to be ranked all riders' 2 highest qualifying test scores will be averaged and the 35 highest ranking qualifiers will be invited to compete.

Unfortunately there will be no Freestyle tests offered this year. This is due to scheduling restrictions around the fact that horses can only compete in 2 tests per day.

Important note for riders wishing to compete in both the Dressage and Showjumping events:

Rings WILL NOT BE HELD for riders coming from Showjumping to Dressage or vice versa.

The Showjumping competition is run under EA and FEI rules and the IQ 2023 Handbook.

Please note – Classes J32 and J34 will now be available at 2023 Interschool Nationals. Therefore the top 4 placing for classes J32, J33, J34 and J35 will be selected for the State Team 2023.

Course inspections/walks are <u>only</u> permitted during designated times in official riding dress. Courses will be open for inspection prior to the start of the competitions and re-opened between each class for approx. 15 minutes.

Important note for riders wishing to compete in multiple disciplines:

Rings ABSOLUTELY WILL NOT BE HELD for riders coming from Dressage or Show Jumping or vice versa.

#### YOU MAY BE REQUIRED TO MAKE A PREFERENCE ON THE DAY.

Whilst the committee will endeavour to accommodate riders in more than one Show Jumping class, please note that you may need to prioritise one class over another on the day.

Providing qualifying criteria met, riders may be able to nominate 2 horses in a maximum of two show jumping classes per horse. For riders entering two classes on a horse, these classes must be at consecutive heights. All horses must compete at their highest qualified height/s.

Please consider horse and rider welfare when nominating in multiple classes.

**Interschool Show Horse** consists of classes for Show Horse, Show Hunter and Working Hunter. Each class has three (3) phases: an In-hand presentation, Rider phase (judging the rider) and Ridden phase (judging the horse). Working Hunter includes a Jumping phase.

The same horse/rider combination must complete all phases in the order specified in a timed draw as determined by the Organising Committee.

The Rules for Interschool Show Horse have been designed to correspond with the National Show Horse Rules wherever possible, however some variations have been necessary to meet Interschool competition requirements. **Judged under current EA SHOW HORSE RULES.** 

**Competitors please note**: to reduce the impact of clashes, classes for **Show Horse** will be run in the following order – Ridden, Rider, Led.

- Riders must complete all phases in the class on the same horse.
- Riders entering SH10 and SH11 are not eligible to enter any of the other SH classes
- Each class will have a timed draw and all riders will complete an individual workout for each phase.
- Competitors may walk the jumping course for the Working Hunter Competition during the lunch break, there will only be the ONE walk time for all classes.
- At IQ if the incorrect equipment is worn into an arena in front of the judge, the rider will receive a **ZERO mark** for that phase, ie, if spurs are worn in the Led phase or if gaiters or long boots are worn in the Rider phase by riders under 18 years of age.









#### **Dress, Saddlery and Equipment**

Will largely be as per National Show Horse Rules with some exceptions specifically for Interschool Show Horse competitions. Please refer to the Interschool Handbook for these exceptions

#### **Number of Horses**

- Competitors may enter a maximum of two horses in the Show Horse competition.
- Rider and horse/pony combination must choose between show horse, show hunter /working hunter.

#### **Workouts**

Set workouts for all classes are available on the IQ Website.

Important note for riders wishing to compete in both the Show Horse and Dressage events:

Rings will be held as much as possible for riders however you MAY BE REQUIRED TO MAKE A PREFERENCE ON THE DAY.

#### Qualification criteria is as follows:

- Minimum of two (2) results in the same class type from any IQ Show Horse competition
  including the previous year's state championships. One show horse qualifier from an EQ/ EA
  competition may be able to be used in the event that there is a clash of dates. Non-IQ events
  will be ranked lower in the case of a ballot for States.
- 2. The results will be ranked to allow for a balloting process (e.g. 1<sup>st</sup> place will receive 10 points down to 1 point for 10<sup>th</sup> place and 1 point per rider after 10<sup>th</sup>). The combinations ranking points will be added together to get a list of qualified riders in rank order to allow for this discipline to be capped at State Championships if required.
- Year 12 riders may submit their best one (1) performance and it will be doubled to allow for ranking.
- 4. Participants may enter a maximum of two horses

Riders from regions requiring reduced numbers of qualifiers - as per Year 12, however if no IQ competitions are run locally you can apply to the discipline convenor using Ag Show scores and EA dressage scores and Pony Club performances for special consideration to attend States. Regions requiring reduced numbers of qualifiers are listed in **Table 1 - School region**.


