

Guidelines for running STATE AND COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS QUEENSLAND

The applicant is to submit their final program, stating heights of classes, Course Designer & Judge when submitting the application.

The host committee will be expected to sign a contract agreeing to run the Championships under Jumping Queensland's terms and conditions.

State Championships –

EQ will supply

Embroidered woollen rugs for winners of Championship Classes
Limited funding from the Committee may be available depending on the budget allocation

Host Committee to supply

Warm up class and championship classes for the following (as a minimum)

Queensland State Children Championship (14yrs and under) (height 1.05m)
Queensland State Junior Championship (height 1.20m)
Queensland State Young Rider Championship (height 1.30m)
Queensland State Amateur Rider Championship (height 1.15m)
Queensland State Championship for horses under 16 points (height 1.10m)
Queensland State Championship for horses under 40 points (height 1.30m)
Queensland State Senior Championship (height 1.50m)

Country Championships –

EQ will supply

Embroidered cotton rugs for winners of Championship Classes
Limited funding from the Committee may be available depending on the budget allocation

Host Committee to supply

Warm up class and championship classes for the following (as a minimum)

Queensland State Country Children Championship (14yrs and under) (height 1.05m)
Queensland State Country Junior Championship (height 1.20m)
Queensland State Country Young Rider Championship (height 1.30m)
Queensland State Country Amateur Rider Championship (height 1.15m)
Queensland State Country Championship for horses under 16 points (height 1.10m)
Queensland State Country Championship for horses under 40 points (height 1.30m)
Queensland State Country Senior Championship (height 1.50m)

At each of these events each HORSE is only eligible to compete in ONE Championship. This rule does not apply to any speed championship that is run in conjunction with these events.
