Conditions of Entry

It is the riders' responsibility to know the rules under which they compete.

- 1. **Rules**: This event will be conducted under the current EA Rules, Policies and Regulations, subject to any amendments or inclusions. *"Neither the Organising Committee of this competition to which these rules apply, or the EA, accepts any liability for accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, grounds, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever"*
- 2. Horse Health Declarations must be submitted to gear check upon arrival at the grounds. Please do not wait until presenting at gear check for your test. No signed and completed Declaration will mean Elimination.
- 3. **Unofficial Classes.** Riders competing in unofficial classes must be GCEG current members, or hold day membership.
- 4. Horse rider combination. The same horse may be ridden by Senior, Young Rider, Junior or Child at the same event. Any change of rider from the rider nominated on the entry form, must be notified before the event commences..
- 5. **Horses** may be entered in up to 2 classes per day. Horses entered in Jumping Events in Australia must be aged at least 4 years. The age is to be calculated as per the Horse's date of birth.
- 6. No Substitution of Horses/Ponies for any reason will be accepted.
- 7. Interschool competitors- Primary qualifiers are for children in years 1-6 (Primary School). Secondary qualifiers are for children in years 7-12 (Secondary/High School).
- 8. Helmet- Helmets must be tagged with the yellow EA helmet tag (there will be a tagger available, times to be notified closer to the event).
- 9. Refunds: Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical or recognised equine practitioner certificate is produced within 24 hours of the completion of the event. In such cases the organising committee reserves the right to retain up to 20% of the entry fees. This administration fee will be waivered if the competitor still fulfils their designated duties, or provides a minimum 1 hour volunteer service, if not rostered for any volunteer duties. Entry fees will be refunded in full for scratching's before the nomination closing date. In the event that the event and/or competition/s are cancelled 50% of entry fees will be refunded.
- 10. The organising committee reserves the right to accept and/or reject entries or amend the draw and/or schedule of events as per Article 109.4 in the EA General Regulations.
- 11. A copy of the Draw/Start list will be emailed to riders after the close of entries.
- 12. **Incomplete entries** or entries without a PIC number included will not be accepted. Entries must be submitted via Nominate.
- 13. Stallion owners must abide by the EA Stallion Safe Practice Rules and Regulations Policy. ALL STALLIONS MUST BE STABLED OR SECURELY TIED throughout the event. Compliant Green Stallion Identification must be worn at all times outside of the stable. Riders and/or handlers of colts/stallions must be over the age of 18 years unless special permission has been granted by the EA Committee.
- 14. **Helpers**: As an event of this size cannot be run without assistance GCEG requests that all competitors nominate on their entry form a job they (or their nominated helper) would be able to volunteer to undertake during the event when they are not riding.
- 15. **Companion Animals:** Those horses/ponies entered into the competition and companion horses/ponies are permitted on the grounds. Other companion animals are not permitted on the grounds.
- 16. COVID-19: This event is run under a COVID Safe Plan. Please ensure you are familiar with COVID Safe Practices, the plan and have downloaded the COVID safe checkin App. Information in this schedule is subject to any COVID-19 regulations which may be applicable at the time of the event. Nomination for the event will indicate agreement to comply with any Event COVID-19 requirements as instructed by the OC.
- 17. **Code of Conduct**: The organising committee values the attendance of all riders, officials, spectators, sponsors, volunteers and supporters HOWEVER it is a condition of attendance at this event that each

person present on the grounds is bound by the rules, policies and by-laws of Equestrian Australia. This includes comments made on social media. Any complaints or conflicts should be managed with respect through official channels. As per EA Disciplinary By-Laws 3(j) any other person or organisation (for example, a parent/guardian, spectator or sponsor) who or which agrees, in writing or otherwise (whether on a ticket, entry form, conditions of entry displayed at a venue etc.) to be bound by these By-Laws. Any rider, parent, official or associate to be found in breach of these By-Laws will be requested to leave the venue immediately and all entry fees and prizes deemed forfeit.

- 18. **Swabbing**. Competitors are reminded that Medical Control (Swabbing) can occur at any event run under EA Rules and Regulations.
- 19. Warm Up Area. Only riders competing in the current competition may use the final practice area. Only 4 horses will be allowed in the practice area at any one time. A flat work area will be provided separate to the jumping warm up arenas.
- 20. **Protests** must be addressed to the Ground Jury in writing, accompanied by a \$20 fee and be lodged no later than 30 minutes after the announcement of the results of the relevant class. The period of jurisdiction of the Ground Jury is 60 minutes after the announcement of the final results of the class. The fee will be refunded if the protest is upheld.

21. Article 238 – Methods of determining the scores under Table A

- 2. Competitions against the clock
 - 1. Athletes with equality of penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the schedule.
- 3. In all competitions when the placing's are determined against the clock, in the event of equality of penalties and time for first place, a jump-off may take place, over a shortened course over obstacles which may be increased in height and/or in spread, depending on the provisions of the schedule. If no provision for a jump-off is laid down in the schedule, it is considered that the competition will be run with no jump-off (Art 245.6).
- 4. In no circumstances may the number of jump-offs in the same competition under Art 238.1.1 and 238.2.1 above exceed two (see JRs Art. 245.4).

22. Article 274- Competition in two Phases.

- 1. Special Two-Phase Competition- This competition comprises two phases run without interruption, each at an identical or different speed, the finishing line for the first phase being identical with the starting line for the second phase.
- 2. The first phase is a course of 7 to 9 obstacles with or without combinations. The second phase takes place over 4 to 6 obstacles, which may include one combination.
- 3. Athletes penalised in the first phase are halted by ringing the bell after they have jumped the last obstacle or when the time allowed for the first phase has been exceeded, after crossing the finishing line of the first phase. They must stop after crossing the first finishing line. Exception Art. 274.5.6: Unless eliminated, Athletes penalised in the first phase may continue in the second phase.
- 4. Athletes not penalised in the first phase continue the course, which finishes, after crossing the second finishing line.

The manner of judging this competition must be specified in the schedule in accordance with one of the following formulas:

- 6. Athletes stopped after the first phase may only be placed after athletes who have taken part in both phases.
- 7. In the event of equality for first place, the tied athletes will be placed equal first.
- 23. Awards: Prize money will not be paid at this event **Ribbons** will be awarded until 6th place.
- 24. **Powered sites:** Any persons using the power supplied around the grounds, and not paying for camping, will be required to pay the camping fee regardless.
- 25. **Dog's** on the grounds is not a preferred option. If dogs are present, they MUST be restrained and under control of the owner/handler at all times. The owner of the dog accepts all responsibility of the consequent action caused by the dog.
- 26. **GST information:** Gladstone Calliope Equestrian Group Inc. is not registered for GST and no GST has been charged in entry fees.
- 27. Catering will not be available however there is a drink and snack vending machine at our clubhouse.
