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CONDITIONS OF ENTRY AND GENERAL INFORMATION

This event is being conducted under the rules as per the current IQ Handbook and EA and FEI rules where applicable. It is your responsibility to read your handbook and be aware of these rules. Riders and horses must be registered with Equestrian Australia. Competitors are reminded that Medication Control (swabbing) can occur at any event run under Equestrian Australia rules and regulations.

1. Entries will be capped

Rider numbers will be capped in all classes. We will operate a waiting list once classes reach capacity, please check your Nominate invoice to see if entries have been accepted or have been placed on the 'reserve list'.

2. Off The Track (OTT) Thoroughbred Prizes

To be eligible for these Championship prizes you will need to identify your horse as an OTT Thoroughbred when entering on Nominate. Please have the following details ready when you nominate: Sire, Dam, Foal date, Race name and Microchip number.

3. Teams

There will be no teams competition / prizes at this event.

4. Horse Health Declaration

Horse Health Declarations are to be completed and handed in upon entry to the grounds.
Riders will then be issued with a wristband – NO WRISTBAND, NO RIDE!

5. Horse Health

Any horse showing signs of ill health either upon arrival or during the event must be reported to *Annabel Twine 0447 176 007 OR Emma Twine 0429 878 662* and will be isolated until seen by a veterinarian. Any expense incurred will be the responsibility of the owner.

6. Soundness

The judges are required to satisfy themselves regarding soundness of all horses and therefore, have the authority to stop an unsound horse during the competition. Any disputes will be considered on the day by the ground jury and / or the Technical Delegate. For dressage there is no appeal against this decision.

7. Rider Numbers

Rider numbers must be worn on **both** sides of the horse and must always be clearly visible when on the grounds and when competing unless they are in a yard / stable.

8. Behaviour

This event is being run in accordance with the *EA Code of Conduct*. Being a school-based event, all competitors must obey school rules and competition etiquette throughout the duration of the event. Failure to do so may result in elimination.

9. Event Photography

Professional photographers have been engaged to cover the event. Please support and respect our photographers by only taking photos for your own personal use. Our photographers will be wearing Media Passes and can be approached for special requests. Links to event galleries for the purchase of images will be supplied after the event. **Our photographers for 2026 are The Fika Effect & Hoofprintz Photographers.**



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10. Disclaimer of Liability

Neither the organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor The Glennie School, nor Equestrian Australia, nor Equestrian Queensland, nor Toowoomba Showgrounds accepts any liability for accident, damage, injury or illness to any horse, athlete, spectator or any other person or property whatsoever. In particular the aforementioned parties accept no responsibility relating to the use of motorised vehicles on the grounds over the course of the competition.

11. Organising Committee Rights (Article 109)

Organising committees have the right to cancel any class or event, divide any class, alter advertised times, refuse any entry, transfer athletes between sections of a class or alter or amend the schedule as they see fit.

12. Substitutions

On approval from the organising committee, riders may substitute an alternative horse up until the start of competition for the day, providing proof of EA registration for the substitute horse is presented. A veterinarian certificate is required for refunds to be issued for substitution from the close of entries date to the day of competition. Substitution of the rider is not permitted.

13. Entry Change Fee

Changes to entries can be made prior to the close of entries date in the Rider's profile in Nominate. All entry changes made after the close of entries will only be considered for safety reasons or special circumstances and will incur an **Entry Change Fee of \$20 per class**.

14. Scratchings

Scratchings will be accepted prior to the close of entries via Nominate (the Administration Levy will not be refunded). Entry fees will not be refunded after the close of entries. Exemptions based on veterinary / medical grounds will be at the sole discretion of the organising committee and will require documentary evidence within 7 days of the event, certified by a recognised and qualified medical practitioner / veterinarian. Evidence must be specific and relevant to the request for an exemption (the Administration Levy will not be refunded). No request for an exemption will be considered after the commencement of the relevant discipline.

15. Cancellation of Event

In the event of cancellation of the competition due to circumstances beyond the control of the organising committee and prior to the commencement of competition, entry fees will be refunded less the Rider Levy per horse and rider combination to help defray administration costs.

16. Competition Schedule

Rings may run early due to Scratchings. Please be attentive to announcements on the day. Riders may be invited to ride earlier if convenient to the rider. Riders who are late and without prior approval from the organising committee do not ride at their designated time, may face elimination. All riders must present to marshalling 15 minutes before their allotted start time.

17. Disputes

No competitors or parents are to directly approach any judges, stewards, course builders or any other officials or volunteers before, during or after the competition with disputes or complaints. Any disputes or complaints during the competition must be managed with respect through official channels. Protests must be in writing and be lodged with the Technical Delegate or Ground Jury through the organising committee with a fee of \$100 within 30 minutes of the final results being posted for the class which gave rise to the objection. The decision of the Technical Delegate or Ground Jury will be final and may not be appealed.



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18. Dress, Saddlery and Equipment

Riders must compete in their registered school equestrian uniform with their allocated number attached to both sides of the horse. It is the rider's responsibility to be aware of approved equipment and or dress / saddlery requirements as per the current Interschool Handbook and EA Rules.

Back protectors for jumping elements are not compulsory under EA Rules. The OC and IQ strongly recommend their use in the interest of safety.

Helmets must be EA compliant and tagged, helmet tagging will be available at the event.

19. Helpers Roster

It is a condition of entry that each rider must sign up to **one helper job per each class entered**, up to a max of 3 jobs per family.

We will be using SignUp.com to organise and manage Helper Roles for this event. A link will be emailed to all competitors once draws have been published. Please sign up promptly to secure jobs that suit your ride times. Riders who do not have a helper signed up for the appropriate number of jobs will be allocated jobs which may or may not suit.

Helpers will be required to report to the Help Desk 15 minutes prior to their allocated start time and be on time to their allocated job.

Helpers who fail to complete their jobs will have their names forwarded to the State Interschool Committee and may not be able to use this event as an Interschool State Qualifier.

EVENT RULES APPLICABLE ACROSS ALL DISCIPLINES

1. All rules, gear and dress are as per current IQ Handbook 2026 and current EA Rules:
2026 Interschool Queensland Handbook
2. Riders may enter a maximum of 2 horses per discipline, whilst we will try our best to avoid clashes, classes will not be held for riders with multiple rides
3. Rider's classes are defined by their grade in 2026:
 - a. Primary: grades 1 – 6
 - b. Intermediate: grades 7, 8 & 9
 - c. Senior: grades 10, 11 & 12
4. Presentations; attendance at presentations is encouraged to support fellow riders, failure to attend presentations at any IQ event may result in forfeiting prizes and qualifications
 - a. **Dressage** – an unmounted presentation of class ribbons and overall prizes will be held at the conclusion of the day
 - b. **Jumping** - mounted presentation of ribbons for each phase will be held at the conclusion of each class phase during the event. Championship and overall prizes will be awarded at the presentation at the conclusion of the event
 - c. **Show Horse** - Championship and overall prizes will be awarded at the presentation at the conclusion of the event
5. Only the nominated rider to compete on the horse is permitted to ride this horse on the ground



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
