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Conditions of Entry & General Information

1. Membership and Horse Registration:

This event is an invitational event for State Team riders, you will have received an invitation from either Interschool Qld or Pony Club Qld to participate and represent that organisation. Normal procedure for selecting a State team has been conducted.

2. Prizes

Individual Competition (Saturday and Sunday) for each group/class:

- Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place for each round
- Rosettes to 6th for overall
- Rug to overall champion
- Saddle pad to overall reserve champion

Teams Competition (Sunday) for each group/class:

- Rosettes to 4th for overall
- Rugs to overall champion team
- Saddle pads to overall reserve champion team

3. Results from this event cannot be used as a qualifier

4. Individual Competition.



SHOWJUMPING CHALLENGE

- This competition will comprise 3 competitions:

Day 1: AM7 Art 238.2.4

Special Two-Phase Art 274.2

Day 2: Grand Prix Athletes Art 273.2.1 (all athletes)

Judging Art 273.3.3.2

Placing Art 273.4.3

There will be progressive scoring over the competitions on Day 1 and Day 2 to determine the Overall Individual Champion for each Height.

- Scoring 30 points for 1st place descending to 1 point for 30th place.
- Each height limited to 40 riders per height for each organisation.
- Tied Competitions to be resolved per relevant FEI Articles through consultation by the TD and CS.

5. MODIFIED NATIONS' CUP RULES

Organisation:

- At least 3 teams must take part in this competition for it to be called Nations Cup.

Course and Obstacles:

- The competition takes place over two rounds, over the same course during the course of the same day.
- The Competition is judged under Table A Not Against the Clock in the first round with a time allowed in both rounds calculated at 350mpm.
- If the Ground Jury decides that the course has been rendered impracticable as result of unforeseen circumstances, it may direct that the dimensions of some obstacles be reduced or that they be moved slightly and/or that the required speed is reduced.
- In consultation with the Course Designer, the Ground Jury may also direct that the dimensions of some obstacles be increased for the second round, if it is deemed that the course of the first round was too easy.
- No combination obstacle may require more than three jumping efforts (except in the case of permanent obstacles, banks, mounds or slopes at outdoor events. The course must include at least one double or one treble combination, but not more than three doubles or one double and one treble combination.

Participation in Nations Cup:

- A full team comprises four riders each riding the same horse throughout the competition. A team may consist of three riders.
- The best three scores to count.
- All team members of each team must take part in the first or second round except as stated below.
- If a team comprising four riders cannot improve its placing in the first or second round, after the third rider has completed his course, the fourth rider may be withdrawn.
- When a team can only provide three riders, all three must start.
- The Team Manager will declare the starting order of his riders, which is kept for both rounds.
- The substitution of an individual rider is onto a team is permitted in the case of illness or accident where the maximum number of team members allowed to participate is four.

Order of starting:

- The starting order of teams in the first round is determined by a draw.
- The number 1 rider of each team start first, then all the number 2 riders, and so on. The Team Managers of teams comprising only three riders may choose in which of the three positions out of four they will start their riders.
- The starting order of teams in the second round will be in the reverse order of total penalties in the first round of the best 3 riders in each team.
- In the case of equality of penalties, the teams will retain the starting order of the first round.
- Competitors in each team start in the same order as for the first round.
- If one or more members of the team are eliminated or retire in the first round, they proceed to the second round with a score of 20 penalties added to the score of the rider with the most penalties still remaining in the competition e.g. 20 (penalty for elimination) + 12 (rider with most penalties still in competition) = 32.

Placings:

- Placings of teams not taking part in the second round is based on the total penalties of the three best riders of each team in the first round. Teams with equality of penalties are placed according to the fastest combined time of the team, calculated by adding the times of the best three riders.
- Placings of teams after the second round is decided as follows:
- The total penalties of the three best riders per team in the first round are added to the total penalties of the best three riders per team in the second round.
- In the case of equality of penalties for first place, there will be a jump-off in which ONE rider per team will participate. The Team Manager determines which member of the team will participate in the jump-off. Any one of the four team members may take part in the jumpoff.
 - The jump-off takes place against the clock over a minimum of six obstacles.
 - In the case of equality of penalties and time after the jump-off, the teams concerned will be placed equal first.
- Other teams with equality of penalties in the second round are placed according to the fastest combined time of the team, calculated by adding the times of the best three riders.
- A team which is qualified to take part in the second round, and withdraws from the second round, the team will be placed last.
- A team which takes part in the second round but is eliminated or retires, is placed ahead of teams not participating in the second round.

6. Saddlery and Equipment

- All EA rules apply to IQ riders & all PCQ rules apply to PCQ riders

7. Rider attire requirements:

- It is an expectation that riders and their horses are neatly presented in either their Interschool State Team uniform, or PCQ uniform as per detailed below:

Interschool Qld Riders – regulation Nationals uniform

- White jodhpurs
- Shirt with white collar



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- Riding jacket (can be removed if hot)
- QLD Team Saddle Blanket/Pad

Pony Club Qld Riders

- Individual Competition (round 1 & 2)
 - White Long Sleeve Shirts, Club, Zone or State ties with matching Saddle Cloth
- Teams Competition (round 3)
 - White Long Sleeve Shirts, Club, Zone or State ties with matching Saddle Cloth

8. **Protective Headgear:** For all riders approved safety helmets must be worn at all times when training, warming up or participating in this event. Please refer to rule 5.2 for the list of standards that headgear must comply with.
9. **Entries:** can only be made online at www.nominate.com.au. Incomplete information may result in the entry not being accepted. Riders may only enter in the class they have been invited to participate in.
- 9..1. A rider/horse combination may only compete in one group/class and team.
- 9..2. Horse may only compete in a maximum of two rounds per day.

Scratchings, Withdrawals, Cancellations and Refunds: Entry fees for accepted riders will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 24 hours of the closing date of the event. In such cases, 25% of the entry fees will be retained by the OC. Entry fees will be refunded in full for scratchings before the closing date of entries. The administration fee will **not be refunded**. If the event is cancelled for any reason, entry fees will be refunded less the administration fee.

Pony Club riders who nominate and are not accepted to compete will receive a full refund.

10. **Indemnity:** Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted, undertake to indemnify the Committee against all claims, losses, suits and damages made against or suffered by the Committee by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any riders, trainers or attendants whilst they are attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse and agree that any act or omission on the part of such riders or attendants found in any action against the Committee to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity. Riders are required to acknowledge the Declaration form included on Nominate.com.au. Failure to agree to this condition will result in non-acceptance of the nomination.
11. **Code of conduct:** It is a condition of participation at this event that each person submitting an entry and their associates are bound by the rules, policies and by-laws of Equestrian Australia and Pony Club Qld as relevant. This includes comments made on social media. Any complaints or conflicts should be managed with respect through official channels. As per EA Disciplinary By-Laws 3(j) any other person or organisation (for example, a parent/guardian, spectator or sponsor) who or which agrees, in writing or otherwise (whether on a ticket, entry form, conditions of entry displayed at a venue etc) to be bound by these By-Laws. Any rider, parent, official or associate to be found in breach of these By-Laws will be render the rider's entry forfeit with no refund of entry fees.
12. **Protests and Appeals:** Objections must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit fee of \$150.00 (refer EA Gen. Regs) Art. 163/164/165. Protests must be lodged with event organiser within 24 hours of results being posted.
