### IT IS THE PARTICIPANT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO KNOW THE RULES

- \* \$20 non – refundable administration levy per rider for the event
- \* Numbers will be capped for all classes – Wide Bay Riders will be given preference if classes reach capacity
- \* Entries open to all IQ riders regardless of region
- \* Perpetual Trophy and Overall Wide Bay Championship Awards for Wide Bay Riders

Bookings will close on the 12th of February with no late bookings allowed.

## Conditions of Entry – Please read before entering

### MEMBERSHIP

- All schools represented must be current financial members of EQ.
- Riders must be Junior Competitor financial members at close of entries.
- Horses must be registered on the EQ Database at close of entries and entered as their full registered name.
- If a handler is required for Show Horse or Dressage walk/trot entries, the handler must be at least a Participant EQ member
- IQ riders from other IQ regions are welcome to nominate

### COMPETITION SCHEDULE

- The competition times in the published schedule are correct at the time of publication and should be taken as a guide for participants only.
- **Rings may run early due to scratchings** - please be attentive to announcements on the day.
- All participants must be prepared to enter the ring when called to do so.
- **It is the rider's responsibility to present at their designated ride time. Failure to present without prior approval from the OC may result in elimination.**

### DRAW & HELPERS ROSTER

- **Interschool Competitions have a No Helper, No Ride Policy.**
- **Every rider must have a nominated helper per discipline and all jobs must be done or a substitute person nominated, unless \$50 volunteer levy paid at entry.**
- **Each Helper must do one job per class entered (Maximum of 3 jobs per family)**
- Helpers are required to report to the event office at least 10 minutes prior to their allotted starting time to sign in.
- **Failure to carry out your assigned Helper Duty will render the rider ineligible for placings and scores will not be eligible as qualifiers for the IQ State Championships.**

### & SUBSTITUTIONS

- **Before the event**, please e-mail [shoolihan75@gmail.com](mailto:shoolihan75@gmail.com) all scratchings as soon as possible
- **During the event, 0421 521 068**
- No refund for scratchings after close of entries unless accompanied by a veterinary/medical certificate.
- Certificates must be received by the OC within 7 days of commencement of competition.
- **A \$20 admin fee will apply on the total entry**
- Riders may substitute an alternative horse up until the start of competition for the day providing proof of IQ registration is presented to the organizing committee and the request is accompanied by a veterinary certificate.
- **No rider may be substituted for another.**

### MARSHALLING/ GEAR CHECK

- A designated Marshalling / Gear Check point will be made available and is compulsory for all participants prior to their entry in each class.
- The horse must have the competitor number displayed on both sides of the horse when competing. Those competing in show horse classes can have a breast plate number holder
- **Participants must present to gear check at least 15 min prior to ride time.**
- **No participant may compete until they have been cleared through marshalling**

### SADDLERY & EQUIPMENT

- All helmets must be tagged with yellow EA tag to indicate it meets current EA standards. This applies to all disciplines.
- All equipment should comply with EA regulations for the show jumping discipline.
- This is the responsibility of the participant and/or parents to ensure that saddlery and equipment is in good repair, meets the relevant safety standards and is fitted appropriately.

### DRESS

- Riders **MUST** ride in their designated interschool equestrian uniform
- Helmets of Australian Safety Standard 3838;199B or EN 1384 or ASTN F1163 must be worn at all times whilst mounted
- Back protectors are not compulsory under EQ rules; however, IQ strongly recommends their use in the interest of safety.

- **Riders are expected to wear their official school equestrian uniforms for presentations.**

#### **PRIZES & PRESENTATIONS**

- Ribbons to 6<sup>th</sup> place in classes.
- All IQ Riders will be competitive in individual classes regardless of region.
- Overall Class Championship Awards for Wide Bay riders only
- **Unmounted presentations** will be held at the conclusion of the event.
- It is required that all riders attend presentations on the days that they compete at both State and Regional Championships. Failure to attend, may result in penalties for future events including selection for the Queensland State Team.
- Should you require an early departure, written communication must be submitted to the respective organising committee for assessment and approval. If accepted, you will be allowed to leave without penalty. You must however, complete your job quota prior to departing. In the case of emergencies, requests for exemption are to be made directly to the organising committee
- **Criteria for Overall Perpetual Wide Bay Trophies:** Same horse and rider combination for all points. Can only use 1 class per discipline towards the trophy.

#### **TIED SCORES**

**Champions & Tied Scores** for all disciplines will be as per the current IQ Handbook.

In the event of tied scores, the following will occur:

- Tied scores in individual rounds, both riders awarded a tied place, the points for those places are shared and the next placing is omitted
- Tied scores for Champion will go to (1) the athlete with the highest place in the AM5 then (2) the athlete with the highest place in the 2 Phase.

#### **DISPUTES**

- As per the current IQ Handbook.
- No participants, parents, coaches or rider entourage are to directly approach any judges, stewards, course builders or any other officials or volunteers with disputes or complaints.
- Any disputes or complaints during the event must be lodged in writing with the Organising Committee through the Team Captain or School Co-ordinator with a fee of \$50 within 30 minutes of the happening which gave rise to the objection.
- These will be deferred to the Technical Delegate/Ground Jury of the day
- The decision of the Technical Delegate/ Ground Jury will be final and may not be appealed

#### **DPI/ BIOSECURITY**

- **A Horse Health declaration MUST be filled out for every horse on the ground,** these will be collected at the gate upon entry
- Participants are responsible for checking with the DPI regarding the requirement for spraying of horses.

#### **SOUNDNESS & SAFETY**

- The judges are required to satisfy themselves regarding soundness of all horses and therefore have authority to stop an unsound horse from participating at any time during the event.
- The technical delegate in consultation with the judges may at any time stop and eliminate from the event any rider that they deem to be unsafe or to have the potential to cause harm to themselves and others.

#### **BEHAVIOUR**

- All participants and entourage must obey school rules and competition etiquette when representing their school and whilst on competition grounds.
- The EA Codes of Conduct must be observed by all participants and their parents/entourage during this event. These can be found in the current IQ Handbook.
- **Those who fail to do so risk elimination from the event.**

#### **MEDICATION CONTROL**

- Random swabbing of horses may occur to ensure that all horses are participating under the national EA and FEI competition rules without being influenced by prohibited substances.
- Please ensure that you have all horses' registration papers available.

## **HORSES**

- Stallions are not eligible to enter.
- Horses must be entered as their full registered name, the OC reserves the right to abbreviate names in the draw for publication purposes
- If the horse has an EA grading, the rider must abide by the relevant EA discipline rules governing the level at which that horse may be entered
- Only horses entered in actual competitions are allowed in the warm-up and competition areas.
- At events, horses are not to be ridden by anyone other than the rider nominated on the draw until the whole event is concluded except for as per point below. This ruling applies even if a horse has completed its competitions at an event.
- A horse can be ridden by more than one sibling rider at an event providing: it is in different disciplines; and the horse does not participate in more than the maximum number of tests/sections allowed in the day by EA discipline rules
- Horse abuse in any form will not be tolerated. If horse abuse is determined the athlete will be disqualified from the event.
- The sighting of blood on the horse during a competition phase can entail elimination and/or investigation by the Ground Jury/Technical Delegate based upon the Sport Rules of the discipline involved.

## **CANCELLATION**

- In the event of **cancellation of the event** or part thereof, due to any circumstances beyond the control of the relevant organizing committee, entry fees will be refunded less \$15 administration costs.

## **PHOTOGRAPHY CONSENT**

- By participating in this event you are consenting to your child/children being photographed or filmed.
- Equestrian Queensland may use these images for promotional use of the event and the Interschool program, this includes but is not limited to, use on the Equestrian Queensland website, marketing material and in all forms of media.



## Combined Training *Friday 3 March*

- Dressage Phase - Callers permitted for Primary Riders only
- No whips permitted in dressage for any classes, whips are permitted for the jumping phase.
- Rules & gear/dress as per current IQ Handbook
- Riders may enter maximum of 2 horses in same or different classes
- The same horse and rider combination must complete both phases of the competition.
- Elimination from one phase involves elimination from the competition.

- Back protectors are not compulsory under EQ rules; however IQ strongly recommends their use in the interest of safety.
- Riders may enter multiple horses and each horse may jump in 1 height class per day.
- Ribbons to 6<sup>th</sup> place, will be presented at the completion of each class
- \* Denotes classes for State Championships but not offered at National competitions.

## Dressage

### **Friday 3 March and Saturday 4 March**

- Callers – **Permitted for Primary & Secondary Riders**
- **Rules & gear/dress as per current IQ Handbook and current EA Dressage rules**
- Gloves are compulsory for all classes.
- Whips are to be no longer than 120cm for horses and 100cm for ponies
- Riders may enter maximum of two horses in the same or different classes
- If a horse/pony has an official dressage grading, please refer to EA Dressage Rules for the level/s at which this horse/pony may participate.
- Riders do not present to the judges unless requested to do so. They must ride past the judge with numbers clearly visible on both sides of the horse.

# SHOW HORSE

## Sunday 5 March

- Each class **with the exception of the Primary Show Horse and Show Hunter (Walk Trot)**, has three (3) phases;
  - In-hand presentation,
  - Rider phase, and
  - Ridden phase
  - **Note:** Working Hunter Ridden phase includes a short jump course.
- The Primary Show Horse and Show Hunter (Walk Trot) classes are two (2) phase only;
  - Rider phase and
  - Ridden phase
  - **Note:** Riders in these classes **may** be on lead line. (handler must be an EQ participant member)
- The same horse/rider combination **must complete all phases in the order specified in a timed draw** as determined by the Organising Committee. Times are subject to change on the day.
- One horse, one rider rule applies for the entire Show Horse discipline. Same horse may not be ridden by another rider in any other Show Horse class. This includes non-qualifying classes.
- Riders may enter maximum of 2 horses in the same or different classes
- Riders must complete all phases in the class on the same horse
- Walk Trot/ 2 Phase classes **do not qualify** for National competition
- Rider number must be displayed at all times in each phase. Breast plates may be worn


