CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- As per the One Sport One Membership EA rules introduced in 2014 **all horses must be EA Life Registered** to compete at this State Championship event.
- All riders must be EQ Competitor Junior members. Riders who are not financial members of EA at the time of competition will not be able to compete in this Championship.
- All schools represented must be current financial members of IQ.
- The organising committee reserves the right to accept and/or reject entries.
- Competitors are reminded that Medication Control (swabbing) can occur at any event run under Equestrian Australia rules and regulations. For more information please go to the Equestrian Australia website (www.equestrian.org.au). For the list of Prohibited Substances please go to www.feicleansport.org.
- For information in relation to travel permits & spraying please contact your local Department of Primary Industries.

INTERSCHOOL NUMBERS

- ***Riders must have their IQ number AT CLOSE OF ENTRIES. No TBA or PENDING numbers will be accepted and the entry will be refunded.***
- IQ numbers must be displayed on both sides of saddle cloth or bridle for CT.
- Back numbers will be issued for the XC Phase of eventing, IQ numbers must be displayed on both sides of saddle cloth or bridle for the dressage and show jump phases.

SCRATCHINGS

- Will be accepted prior to closing date by advising mfsearle@searle.com.au via email only. An administration fee of \$20 will apply.
- No refund for scratching after close of entries unless accompanied by veterinary/medical certificate. An administration fee of \$20 will apply.
- Scratchings with supportive evidence occurring after closing date to be emailed to mfsearle@searle.com.au with supporting documentation.
- No refunds given for scratchings after draw has been posted. (veterinary/medical certificate will not be considered)

HELPER ROSTER

Each rider will be required to nominate a helper for the event. This year, we are using the **'Sign-Up' App** to manage our helpers roster. Please access the website or download the app and familiarise yourself with it. It is easy to use and it allows you to choose jobs that suit your schedule and family. **This system was used at the 2018 Nationals and it worked very well.**

How it will work:

We will open the State **'Sign-Up' Helper's Roster** at 7pm Friday 5th July, it will remain open until Tuesday 9th July at 7pm. Job choice will be on a **'first in'** basis. To ensure you obtain your preferred jobs/times it is advised you sign up early. If families do not select their jobs by the close-off point on Tuesday 9th July at 7pm they will be allocated any remaining jobs. Reminders will be sent prior to the opening and closing of the 'Sign-Up' roster, but we ask you to take responsibility for signing up within the required timeframes.

Everyone is required to sign up for one job. If all jobs are not filled, we may ask families who have riders competing in multiple disciplines/classes to choose another job.

We will post the completed 'Sign-Up' roster at the venue and the 'Sign Up' App will send out automatic reminders so ensure you check your emails.

It is the responsibility of each rider and their helper to ensure that they check the 'Sign-Up' roster and complete their nominated tasks or find an appropriate substitute person to do so.

Helper Sign In Procedure at Event

Helpers must register at the nominated area prior to start of their allocated job. This will be different for different disciplines so consult the final published roster to see where you need to go.

If the helper fails to arrive for duty as per the roster, the rider's name will be forwarded to the IQ State Committee on the day of the Competition and the rider will be ineligible for placings or points for that Competition.

The rider will NOT be eligible for prizes at the State competition and will be automatically considered as riding HC for the event. This will mean the rider will also be ineligible for a place on the Queensland State Team to compete at the Australian Interschool National Championships.

Please do not put the committee or your child in this situation.

DRAW

- An interim draw will be available on Nominate. Any errors should be advised asap. We will try to accommodate multi rides but those on multiple horses must understand that their rides times may be close together.
- A final draw will be posted on Nominate and at the competition.

GEAR CHECK

- Competitors must present to gear check 15 minutes prior to their start time as per the competition draw.
- It is the rider's responsibility to know and comply with the individual discipline's rules regarding the use of allowable equipment.

ENTRIES AND SUBSTITUTIONS

- Riders may substitute a horse up until the start of competition for the day, providing proof of IQ registration is presented to the organising committee, and the request is accompanied by a veterinary certificate. The substituted horse/rider combination must also be qualified as per the qualification rules.
- Substitution of rider is not permitted.
 - Entry Fee Eventing \$95
 - Entry Fee Combined Training \$55
 - Admin Fee \$20

DISPUTES

- No competitors or parents or coaches are to directly approach any judges, stewards, course builders or any other officials or volunteers with disputes, complaints or queries.
- Any disputes, complaints or queries during the competition must be lodged in writing with the Organising Committee through the Team Captain or School Convenor Accompanied by a fee of \$50 within 30 minutes after the incident which gave rise to the objection. These will be referred to the Technical Delegate/Ground Jury of the day and their decision will be final and may not be appealed.

YARDS AND CAMPING

- Non-competition horses are not permitted on the grounds.
- Yards \$50 for the weekend. Bond \$20
- Powered camping is available at a cost of \$50 for the weekend.
- Non powered camping is available at a cost of \$20 for the weekend
- There is to be no lodging of horses outside the designated yard areas.
- Stables **must be cleaned after use.**

SADDLERY AND EQUIPMENT

- A designated gear check point will be made available and it is compulsory for all competitors prior to their entry in each and every class.
- No competitor may compete until they have been cleared through the gear check station.
- All equipment should comply with EA regulations for the particular discipline.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor and/or parents to ensure that saddlery and equipment is in good repair, meets the relevant safety standards and is fitted appropriately.
- **538.1.4 Boots**
In all Tests, boots (other than as part of regulation service dress) must be black, brown or black with a brown top.
- **EA 538.1.4 CNC/CCN Boots**
In all Tests, boots (other than as part of regulation service dress) must be black, brown or black with a brown top. They must either be long boots in one piece or a full grain smooth leather leg piece (on at least the exposed side of the gaiter) and leather boot. Chapettes (suede) are not permitted. Juniors may compete in jodhpurs and short boots.

HORSE HEALTH DECLARATIONS

- All riders must supply a completed horse health declaration on arrival at the grounds, an armband will be provided to riders once the declaration has been received
NO ARM BAND - NO RIDE - NO EXCEPTIONS
- A copy of this will be available when the draw goes up on Nominate or the IQ Website, please print it off, fill it out and bring it with you.

VEHICLES OTHER THAN CARS AND TRUCKS

- Queensland road rules will apply to all drivers and vehicles.

PRESENTATIONS

- Unmounted presentation will be held at the conclusion of the Event. It is a requirement of entry that all competitors attend presentation unless permission is sought from the organising committee.
- The overall rider and overall school awards will be presented at this event.

TEAMS

- There are two divisions in the Combined Training, Primary and Secondary, and only one division in the Eventing competition.
- Teams are to consist of 3 or 4 riders with the top 3 scores to be counted. The fourth rider's score is used in the case of a tie.
- Teams are not pre-nominated and will be made up of the best 3 or 4 riders from each school on the day.
- Team members must all be from the same school.
- A school may have more than one team in a division provided it has at least 7 riders.
- Primary and Secondary divisions are run as separate competitions in the combined training competition.
- Where riders, who are in a team, have more than 1 horse entered in any discipline, their highest result will be the one counted towards the team score for that discipline.
- If a school has enough riders for a second team, riders with a second horse may be entered as a member of the second team.
- Riders who have 2 horses cannot have both horses counted in the same team.

GENERAL DISCLAIMER

- Neither the organising committee, IQ, or EA, nor Warwick Horse Trials accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury, illness to riders, spectators, horses, grounds or any other persons or property whatsoever in consideration of entries being accepted.
- No entries will be accepted unless riders and parents have accepted the acknowledgment and Indemnity Waiver (provided on Nominate) and accepted that they have read and agreed to the EA Code of Conduct.
- The Organiser reserves the right:
 - To cancel any class or event
 - To divide any class
 - To transfer competitors between sections of a class
 - To alter the advertised times
 - To refuse any entry, with or without stating the reason.

COMBINED TRAINING

(PRESENTATION ON SUNDAY)

- Combined Training is run under Eventing Rules.
- See also Combined Training Annex
- Callers are only permitted for primary dressage tests.
- No whips permitted in dressage phase for any classes, the responsibility for this rests with the rider. See updated EA Eventing rules.
- Whips of no more than 75cm allowed in jump phase.
- Back protectors strongly recommended for jump phase.
- A second horse may be entered.
- Dressage will be run on Saturday, Showjumping will be run on Sunday

EVENTING

(PRESENTATION ON SUNDAY)

- Back protectors strongly recommended for jump phase and are compulsory for the cross-country phase.
 - All eventing dressage will be run on Saturday.
 - Eventing Jumping will be on Saturday
 - All cross-country classes will be run on Sunday.
 - Cross country course will be open for walking after final TD inspection on Saturday afternoon.
 - A second horse may be entered.
