AWARDS

- There will be overall champion & reserve champion awards for show jumping and show horse.
- Ribbons to 6th place
- Ribbons for BOTH show horse and show jumping will be handed out during presentation at the end of the competition

SCRATCHINGS

- Scratchings will be accepted prior to the closing date for nominations. In the case of scratchings prior to the close of nominations, the nomination fees will be refunded LESS a 20% administration fee.
- There will be NO REFUND for scratchings after the closing date for nominations UNLESS a vet or medical certificate is provided within 7 days of the competition. A 20% administration fee will apply.

CANCELLATION OF EVENT

- In the event of cancellation of the competition or part thereof, due to circumstances beyond the control of the OC, nomination fees will be refunded less 20% to help defray costs already incurred.
- This event will not be rescheduled if cancelled.

HELPER ROSTER

- It is a condition of entry that each rider must provide the name and contact details of a helper for each discipline entered.
- The helper roster will be available at the event. If a nominated helper or substitute does not present on the day, the rider's scores will not be submitted to State office for qualifying and will be scored as HC.

DRAW

• A draw will be available on Nominate. Any errors must be advised to <u>nsymo15@eq.edu.au</u> ASAP before the event.

SUBSTITUTIONS

- Riders may substitute a horse in the same class up until the start of competition for the day, providing proof of IQ registration is presented to the organising committee, and the request is accompanied by a veterinary certificate.
- Substitution of rider is not permitted.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

• This competition is run in accordance with the 2018 IQ Handbook and therefore EA rules apply. This handbook is available on the IQ website at

• All schools represented must be current financial members of IQ. Riders who are not financial members of EQ at the time of competition will not be able to compete in this competition.

RESERVATION OF RIGHTS

The Organising Committee reserves the right to:

- Cancel any class or event
- Divide or combine any class
- Transfer competitors between classes
- Alter the advertised times
- Refuse entry to any competitor with or without stating the reason

DISPUTES

- No competitors or parents or coaches are to directly approach any judges, stewards, course builders or any other officials or volunteers with disputes, complaints or queries.
- Any disputes, complaints or queries during the competition must be lodged in writing with the Organising Committee through the identified officer at the event with a fee of \$50 within 30 minutes after the happening which gave rise to the objection.
- These will be referred to the Technical Delegate/Ground Jury of the day.
- The decision of the Technical Delegate/Ground Jury will be final and may not be appealed.

GROUND JURY

The GROUND JURY will be made up of the most senior judge/official of the day.

HORSE HEALTH DECLARATIONS

- All riders must supply a completed horse health declaration (HHD) as soon as possible after arrival at the grounds, and before competing. If a HHD is not submitted, the rider's scores will not be submitted to State office for qualifying and will be scored as HC.
- A copy of this will be available when the draw goes up on Nominate, please print it off, fill out and bring it with you.

DOGS

No pets are permitted on the grounds during this competition as per Moggill Pony Club conditions.
