## AM5

Article 238.2.2:
This is a competition against the clock, but in the event of equality of penalties for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other athletes are placed according to their penalties and time in the first round.

## Special Two-Phase

Article 274.2 This competition comprises two phases run without interruption, each at an identical or different speed, the finishing line for the first phase being identical with the starting line for the second phase.
The first phase is a course of 7 to 9 obstacles with or without combinations (Table A against the clock). The second phase takes place over 4 to 6 obstacles, which may include one combination (Table A against the clock).

Athletes completing the first phase may continue in the second phase. Placing is according to the penalties and time in both phases(faults on obstacles and penalties for exceeding the time allowed in both phases) and, if necessary, according to the time of the 2nd phase.

DRAW \& HELPERS ROSTER - No Helper No Rider Policy
- The draw and roster will be available on www. nominate.com.au as soon as it is possible after the closing date.
- Every rider must nominate a helper for each discipline they enter.
- Helpers are to sign on at the office 10 minutes prior to job time and remain at their allocated task for the rostered duration.
- Results and qualifiers will be withheld if job is not fulfilled.

COMPETITORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

- Review the draw schedule once published on www.nominate.com.au for the rider's event time and ring/s.
- Check with the DPI regarding any requirements for spraying of horses.
- A Horse Health Declaration must be completed and handed in at the office upon entry.

CANTEEN will be available all day.
FIRST AID OFFICER will be available on the day. A vet will be on call but the owner/rider of the horse will be obliged to pay for the service not Stuartholme School or Stuartholme Equestrian Team.
FLOAT PARKING Gates open at 6.30am - Parking area will be tight so please park as directed MANURE/HAY DO NOT leave manure/hay in piles, wheelbarrows, or similar items. All manure/hay must be bagged in feed bags provided or bring your own. Manure bags are to be tied with baling twine and placed inside gates at club entrance or removed with you.
CROSS COUNTRY JUMPS are not to be jumped under any circumstances. Disregard of this rule will result in disqualification.

All schools represented at this event must be current financial members of $E Q$, each rider must also be a current Competitor - Junior member of EQ at the time of the competition.

## PRIZES:

- Champion Rug for the overall winner of each class
- Individual: Ribbons $1^{\text {st }}-6^{\text {th }}$ place in each round
- Overall Awards: $1^{\text {st }}-3^{\text {rd }}$ place
- Teams Awards: $1^{\text {st }}-2^{\text {nd }}$ place


## COMPETITION SCHEDULE:

- The competition times in the published schedule are correct at the time of publication and should be taken as a guide for competitors only.
- All competitors must be prepared to enter the ring when called on to do so and they should ensure that they are attentive to announcements to this effect on the day. Riders who fail to comply with this rule may face elimination.
- Riders may ride two horses in two different classes (one class per horse) at this event.


## DISPUTES:

- No competitors or parents or coaches are to directly approach any judges, stewards, course builders or any other officials or volunteers with disputes, complaints or queries.
- Any disputes, complaints or queries during the competition must be lodged in writing with the Organising Committee through the School Convener with a fee of $\$ 50$ within 30 minutes after the happening which gave rise to the objection.
- These will be referred to the Technical Delegate/Ground Jury of the day.
- The decision of the Technical Delegate/Ground Jury will be final and may not be appealed.


## SOUNDNESS AND SAFETY:

- The judges are required to satisfy themselves regarding soundness of all horses and therefore have authority to stop an unsound horse from competing at any time during the competition.
- The Technical Delegate in consultation with the judges may at any time stop and eliminate from the competition any rider that they deem to be unsafe or to have the potential to cause harm to themselves and others.


## BEHAVIOUR:

- When representing their school and whilst on competition grounds, all competitors must obey school rules and competition etiquette.
- Those who fail to do so risk elimination from the competition.
- Damage to any third party by anyone at the competition will be the responsibility of the adult involved or the parents or guardians of those who cause any damage.


## CAMPING AND STABLING:

- Those competitors that wish to stable their horses or camp overnight may do so through Nominate when entering.
- Any horses stabled/yarded overnight are required to be Hendra vaccinated. This is a venue requirement. Proof of current vaccination will be required.
- A stable plan will be posted on Nominate prior to the event.


## VEHICLES OTHER THAN CARS AND TRUCKS:

- Stuartholme School, the EQ and IQ accept no responsibility in relation to the use of motorised vehicles on the grounds over the course of the competition.
- Motorbikes, four-wheelers, trikes, or other such vehicles will not be permitted on the grounds where horses are being worked or competed and it is the responsibility of parents and guardians to enforce this ruling.
- Users of such vehicles risk having them banned or expelled from the grounds if they are being used in a manner which is deemed dangerous or irresponsible
by any member of the committee or by any competitor.


## COMPETITION CHECK IN:

- A designated rider check-in will be made available and is compulsory for all competitors 15 minutes prior to their entry in each and every class to attend, mounted at check in.
- All equipment should comply with EQ regulations for the particular discipline
- All helmets must be tagged with the yellow EA tag.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor and/or parents to ensure that saddlery and equipment is in good repair, meets the relevant safety standards and is fitted appropriately.


## DRESS:

- Riders MUST ride in their school equestrian uniform.
- Helmets of Australian Safety Standard 3838:1998 or EN 1384 or ASTN F1163 must be worn at all times whilst mounted.
- A saddlecloth depicting the school emblem should be worn.
- IQ numbers are no longer in use. Riders will be allocated a draw number, which must be worn either on the bridle or saddlecloth while competing.


## SHOWJUMPING:

- In the AM5 and Special 2 PHASE classes the level of the event in cms is the maximum starting height in the first round. There may be a 10 cm height rise in the second round.
- Back protectors are not compulsory under EQ rules; however, IQ strongly recommends their use in the interest of safety.
- IQ jumping competitions run under EQ rules.


## ENTRIES AND SUBSTITUTIONS:

- Riders may substitute an alternative horse up until the start of competition on the day providing IQ registration is current and the request is accompanied by a veterinary certificate.
- No rider may be substituted for another.


## TEAMS:

- There are two divisions - Primary and Secondary
- School Teams are to consist of 3 or 4 riders with the top 3 scores counted; the fourth riders' score is used in the case of a tie.
- The same rider cannot be counted in the same team on different horses. The same rider may be part of two teams.
- Composite teams are not permitted.
- The organising committee reserves the right to award team ribbons and prizes where less than three teams are present in the primary division at their discretion.
- A school may have more than one team in a division provided it has at least 7 riders
- Primary and Secondary divisions are run as separate competitions therefore there can be no mixed division teams.


## TIED SCORES:

In the case of tied scores in show jumping the following will occur:

- Tied scores in individual rounds, both riders awarded a tied place, the points for those places are shared and the next place is omitted.
- Tied scores for Champion with go to (1) the athlete with the highest place in the AM5 then the athlete with the highest place in the Special 2 Phase.

## ENTRY PROCEDURES:

1. Entries are to be made only through www.nominate.com.au
2. No late entries will be accepted.
3. In the event of cancellation of the competition or part thereof, due to any circumstances beyond the control of the relevant organizing committee, entry fees will be refunded less the administration charge to help defray administration costs.
4. All entries are to be accompanied by an email address and the helper roster will be posted on the website when available prior to the competition. A nominated helper for each rider is required in order to process the nomination. No helper - no ride. This helper must then attend the event. If it is found that there has been no helper after the rider has ridden, the rider will not be eligible for placings and qualifying scores not accepted for the event.
Each helper is required to report to the office at least 10 minutes prior to their allotted starting time to sign in. A helpers' roster will be posted on Nominate when available, prior to the event and at the event office on the day of the competition. It is the responsibility of helpers to check the roster and undertake their job. If they are not able to undertake their allotted job, helpers must organize for someone else to take their place - this is not a responsibility of the organising committee.
