Conditions of Entry

- 1. Current EA rules and dressage tests apply. These can be downloaded from the EQ website: www.qld.equestrain.org.au
- 2. Entries without a signed Release of Waiver of Liability form will not be accepted.
- 3. Competitors MUST be, at a minimum, a participant or competitor member of EA, a current financial member of Maranoa Equestrian Club Inc. or a current financial member of Wallumbilla Show Society Inc. This must be documented accordingly on the entry form.
- **4.** Each horse can only do a maximum of three (3) tests/day (same or consecutive levels) as per EQ Rules AND Each Rider may compete in a maximum of six (6) tests/day. RIDERS MUST BE PREPARED TO RIDE TO TIMED DRAW
- 5. One rider only per horse; including warm-up. Organisers must be notified of any change of rider <u>before</u> the event starts.
- 6. Competitors wishing to use their scores for Interschool qualifiers must provide their IQ number on the Entry Form. If your IQ number is not provided upon receipt of nomination, the scores cannot be counted. Relevant results will be forwarded to IQ at the conclusion of the event
- 7. No refunds will be given after close of entries unless substantiated with medical and/or veterinary certification within 7 days of the completion of the event.
- 8. Objections: Attention is drawn to the current Australian Dressage Rules and official procedure for dressage competitions. Only the owner/rider of a horse taking part in the competition may lodge a protest. This must be in writing to the MEC Treasurer with a \$100 deposit not later than 30 minutes after the happening that gave rise to the protest or in the case of the qualification of the competitor, not later than 30 minutes before the start of the class.
- 9. The Organising Committee (OC) reserves the right to accept or reject entries according to special circumstances.
- 10. In the event of illness or accident to rider prior to the commencement of the event, a substitute rider may be arranged (Committee to be notified); however a substitute horse cannot be placed instead of the nominated horse.
- 11. There must be a minimum of 3 rider/horse combinations in a class for prize money to be paid. In the event that a class should have less than the minimum of 3 rider/horse combinations, prize money may be halved.
- 12. If the rider is not at the presentation of prizes, they forfeit their prize money/prizes unless a self-addressed envelope is left with the organising Committee.
- 13. Maranoa Equestrian Club Inc. has adopted all guidelines and recommendations in EA's Stallion Safeguard Guidelines. Stallion owners need to be aware of these guidelines and comply with the requirements. All other riders are to be aware of stallions on the ground.
- 14. In the case of cancellation of the event, an administration fee of 20% of entries may be retained by the organizers.
- 15. The Wallumbilla Show Society Inc. reserves the right to swab for those substances prohibited by the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and Equestrian Australia.

- 16. Draw: A draw will be posted at the Wallumbilla Showgrounds on the eve of the competition and emailed to riders where a legible email address is provided
- 17. Horse Health Declaration must be handed in <u>at the commencement of the event (to Gear check steward)</u> DO NOT SEND WITH NOMINATIONS Forms can be downloaded from:

- 18. Class 11 open to current financial MEC members only to comply with Current EQ Participant Competition rules
- 19. Competitors wishing to use their scores for EQ Inter Club Challenge must provide their EA number on the Entry Form and tick YES to using results for inter club challenge. They must also document their EQ Affiliated club that they are representing. They must be a current financial member of that club and of EQ at the time of nomination. If the relevant details are not provided upon receipt of nomination, the scores cannot be counted. Relevant results will be forwarded to EQ at the conclusion of the event. BIOSECURITY FACT SHEET

We take biosecurity seriously and have measures in place to mitigate the risk of infections, diseases and pests.

OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY

All horse owners and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant.

Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the organising committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event.

All horses entering grounds must be from a property actively practising good biosecurity principles within their management.

Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are a mandatory requirement for all events. Please read the HHD form and ensure:

your horses are shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry, and their hooves are picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo.

your vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses are cleaned to remove all solid material that could contain disease agents, and then disinfected.

Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point, as advised by the organising committee.

The property identification code (PIC) of the horse's origin must be included on the HHD.

Other biosecurity and workplace health and safety measures that aim to provide the safest environment for horses, competitors, volunteers and visitors include:

- No horses or dogs with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds.
- No communal horse water troughs are available at this event.
- □ Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses.
- Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas. Please use your own rakes/shovels.
- Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. Stop all non-essential contact with the sick horse. Do not allow children to have close contact with the sick horse.
- Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitise hands between contacting different horses.

OUR BIOSECURITY PLAN

Our event biosecurity plan is a set of preventative control measures and actions aimed at reducing the risk of infectious diseases and pests on and off the venue, and between horses at the venue.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A BIOSECURITY INCIDENT

In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager and the organising committee will implement our event biosecurity plan. You will be notified about the incident and expected to follow the directions given by the organising committee.

Everyone will be expected to remain at the venue until cleared to leave by the organising committee and Biosecurity Manager.

In the event of horse movement restrictions participants are responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of their horses and themselves, including feeding, bedding, vets and personal needs.
